After re-reading the copy of letter I mailed to you a few hours ago, I believe I gave you inaccurate information on the Rushings, My information came from Dr. William Blakeney of New Boston, Texas. To correct the data, I will quote you from a letter from Dr. Blakeney, dated September 3, 1971:

""Thomas Blakeney's father, William Blakeney, died in 1807, according to Coit Redfern's records. This Cait has the original land grant from King George, lll, dated 1775. William Blakeney's old rosewood sideboard, made in England, as well as the bill of sale for the sideboard which was for \$12.50 also. Coit's son has a land grant from King George 11, dated 1750 to Abram Paul, who was Whalfaundfather of William's wife, Mary Jackson Blakeney, the daughter of Benjamin and Mary Rushing Jackson, and Mary Rushing Jackson's father was Francis Rushing that had married Temperance Paul, the daughter of Abram Paul. Coit's wife was a descendant from Capt. John's son, James Blakeney, who married Susanna Haile, etc".

I hope this is clear to you. Anyway this is exact wording in his letter.

Dear Mrs. Cooper:

In answer to same, I am glad to be of any help that I can give, and I hope that the data below will be of some assistance to you. I will preface what I have to reply, by saying that for some fifteen years since retirement I have been working at odd times on the genealogy of Samuel Taylor Walker, of Fayette, County, and George W. Baker of Tuscalocsa County (1820), Thomas Blakeney of Fayette County, (1832), and James and Willis Holliman of Lancaster County, S.C. and Anson County, North Carolina (1793), and some collateral lines. Most of my work has not been completed. Cornelius Holliman, by great-great grandfather came to Fayette County, with other relatives in 1836 from Anson County, N.C. I am related to the Bakers of Tuscalocsa County. Most of them are descended from George Harvey Baker. I am descended from Francis Richard Baker, his brother. One son of Francis was W.H.H. Baker, of Northport. One of his daughters married a Hamner, who as I recall was a postal employee there.

I will first try to give you some data on the Rushing family. These people originally were from Anson County, N.C. and Chesterfield County, S.C. I have found them in early census reports in Shelby County, and Fayette County, Alabama. They were connected with the family of Captain John Blakeney, early merchant and indian trader, who lived near Dudley, in NW Chesterfield County, S.C. He was my great-great-great grandfather and was born in Ireland in 1732. His son William was the Father of Thomas Blakeney, of Newtonville, Fayette County, Alabama, (1832) Thomas Blakeney was my great-great grandfather. His grand-daughter Belzie Ann Elakeney, daw. of William, Civil War sol., was my Grandmother. She married George W. Baker, and lived at Newtonville.

Three sons of William Blakency, son of Dapt. John, came to Alabama

prior to 1832. They Were: (1) Thomas Wlakeney, born 1800 in Chesterfield County, manufed Sarah Roberts, to Negtonville, Fayette County, with Simon Poe, who later was his brother-in-law. (2). John Blakeney, came to Linden, Marengo County, Alabama, before 1832, married Mary Lucy. (3) Hugh Blakeney, merchant, Belmont, Sumpter County, Alabama, buried at Cedar Springs judg off Andrew Jackson Trail, Married Temperance Rushing. She is buried at Belmont, in Sumpter County, Alabama. At one time they resided at Pierci's Mill, 14 mi. N. of Quitmen, Miss.

Hugh Blakeney, last mentioned was a brother-in- law of Stephen Rushing, also of Sumpter County. Other Rushings there were Sheppard Rushing and James M. Rushing (See 1850 Census Sumpter County). According to Dr. William Blakeney, a dentist of New Boston, Texas, 75570, who is probably the foremost authority on the genealogies of the Blakeney and Rushing families, Abram Paul received a land grant in N.C. from King George 2nd, in 1750. Benjamin Jackson married Temperance Paul, his daughter. They were parents of Mary Rushing Jackson, who married William Blakeney died in 1807, and his widow then married William McGes, and had other children, some of whom came to West Alabama. William B. is bried at the Blakeney Cemetery near Dudley, Chesterfield County, S.C.

Now, reporting Josish Volloman, and wife Nancy. The spelling of the family name varies, sometimes changed by a vensus enumerator, often by personal choice. The name was originally Hollyman. I am working on the James Holliman and Willis Holliman lines, who were in Lancaster County, S.C. in 1830, and who originally of from Johnson and Make Counties N.C. Tenatively connected with Jesse Hollinah and John Holliman. These people came from settlers in Isle of Wight County, Virginia. Several of the Johnston and Wake County Hollimans came to Alabama and Mississippi. James Holliman was born in 1750 in Johnston, moved to Lancaster County, S.C. in 1793 and died in Mecklinburg Co. N.C. in 1836. He was Rev. Warlsol. Cornelius, Charles and Warren H. came to Fayette County, in 1836. Others with them went in to Choctaw and Carrol Counties, Miss., and some of them finally landed at Hot Springs, Ark.

Page 9. Shows that Christopher Hollyman died in 1691 in Isla of Wight County, Virginia. he was survived by four sons and two daughters. Son #2 was Christopher W. Hollyman, who died in 1731 in Isla of Wight County. He had several children one of whom was JOHN, who died in 1751. His wife was Elizabeth. He left a will.

Page 11. John changed spelling to Holleman, and had a son named Jesses who moved to the Johnston-Wake County area of North Carolina (Raleigh area). John married Elizabeth, and they had several children, one of whom was Jesse, who died in 1824. He was Rev. War. Sol.. Married Elizabeth Cofer, day of Thomas Cofer. (See Cofer Family history). Jesse and wife had a large family, including son Sosiah, born 12-31-1771, died 3-14-1845, left willprovated in Isle of Wicht County; Mac. Married Mancy Clark, day of John Blark. She was born 4-13-1769, and died 6-23-1844. Josiah had a slater named Gecelia W. who died in Nov. 1866, probably unmarried, and left will disposing of property. Probated in Wayne County, N.C.

Page 72. Josiah and Nancy had a large family. However the reported children do not include a "Wevelia", but does include a "Polly", born 2-15-Ol. Polly is usually a substitute name for Mary. Is this the Cecelia who narried Robert Patterson. The time seems to jibs. I think this is your line, cut more searching is indicated. In the 5 volume set of Johnston County Records, in the Birmingham Library, mention is made of a Josiah Folliman and Selia Holiman. I would suggest you check Johnston and Wake County court and deed records, also North Carolina Archives at Raleight, Raleight is the county site of Wake County, according to my memory. It is likely that our Holliman lines come to a common ancestor in Johnston County, North Carolina.

If I can be of further assistance, please feel free to write. If you have anything on James or Willie Hollimanfrom North or South Caroline, I would be glad to have it.

Another thing of interest I note from the family record of Josiah Holloman, which you sent me. Elijah Alexander Holliman married a Jemima Yerby at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, on March 30, 1837. Elijah was the oldest son of Cornelius Holliman and wife Elizabeth Plylor Holliman, of Lancaster County, S.C. and Anson County. North Carolina. This last couple came to Fayette County, Alabama, in 1836 and settled with other relatives near Newtonville. Elijah was a brother of my great Grandfather, Uriah H. Holliman, who died in the Civil War at Camp in Miss., and whose home was near Fluff, in Fayette County. Elijah and Jemima moved to Texas, and she died there, at Powell, in Navaroo County on July 30, 1895. She was born November 25th, 1817 in S.C. and was the daughter of Amon Yerby, born 1798 in N.C., died July 1861 at Willport, Lamar Caunty. Wife was Rachel McMillan.

Evidently the Jemima Terby who married Elijah A. Holliman, and the Jemima Yerby, who married Nathanial Holloman, son of Josiah Holloman, were about the same age, and must have been related.

I have again checked the JOSTAH HOLLOMAN, on page 72 of the Hollyman Family. Josiah had a sistef named Gecelia, who never married, and who was mentioned in the last will of John Holleman (referred to on page 11), however none of the Josiah Holloman children or grand-children were named Gecelia, and the name does not appear again in the family line. I can supply you with a copy of page 72 if you need it.

Mrs. Marguerite Tarwater Calahan, of Tuscaloosa is a friend of mine and has supplied me with much information on my family. She was reared at Fayette as was my family. I am familiar with the books by Newall, in the Birmingham Library and rafer to them from time to time. For your information I have about completed a manuscript on the Walker Families of Shelty County, and am to supply a copy of case to Era. Evelyn Walker Robertson, af Fayette, in the near future. I have also finished a manuscript on the descendants of the three hollimans who came yette County in 1835.
