former wills. In the first place I will that all my just
debts be paid

In the next place I will and bequeath the whole of my
estate both real personal & mixed after the payment of
my debts to my wife Caroline Matilda Bryan to be distributed
as she may think proper in raising educating and supporting
my children for and during her natural life & as long
remains a widow but upon the event of her marriage she is
only to have for life the one third of my estate and the

widow Caroline Matilda Bryan - unless remarried then $\frac{1}{3}$ for life.

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be an equal. Divided among my Children, but if my
wife & I do not marry it is my will that my wife may
die in death divide and distribute my estate among my

widow but if, in the event of her marriage she is




