There are still a lot of Walkers in Shelby County who are blood relations of the Walkers of Fayette and Lawrence Counties.

Dear Evelyn:

Thank you for sending me the material on the Wakkers. Carey Walker and I began spasmodic work on the Walker family history in 1964, and this continued until his death. Since then I have been working along on the project from time to time, as a hobby, and hope to be through with the manuscript sometime this spring. Unfortunate last week when I was down at the farm in Shelby County, I injured one of my fingers, so I find typing difficult, and hope to be able to resume work on the project in about 10 days. I had planned to work out one line of the family at a time, and was about ready to write you, when your letter came. I will need a little more data on your family, so might as well spell it out now. As I recall you went to Montevallo Colleg I need to know what colleges you and your sister attended, and the Degrees earned. I also need this data on your sister; and your respective husbands.

When I get the manuscript completed I had intended to bring it over to Fayette, and to ask that you read and critice it, in view of your past experience with publications similar to this. So, if agreeable, I will be over there sometime before April 15th. I must get my inchme tax report made and filed, so for the next two weeks can not do very much on the Walker file.

Primarily I had intended to prepare a directory of the descendants of Samuel Taylor Walker. With this I intend to show the line of descent from James Walker, born 1765 in Penn., who was in the 1816 census of the Mississippi Territory, and in the 1820 Census of Alabama. He was then living at Montevallo, and evidently arrived there sometime before 1820, and I would guess in 1816. He had previously lived in North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia. He had a large family, and some of his children were born in each State. His wife was Sarah, proven by the deed records in Shelty. I have proof on three of his children, and have identified them, but due to missing marriage records in Shelby County from 1828 to 1837, I can only surmise that other known Walkers were his children. Like all genealogical work you can never be certain that you are through. About the time you think you have all the worth while data, you discover a new tangent, and off you go on a new trail. James Walker's son Andrew married Jean Evaline Camble in Shelby County, and Samuel Taylor Walker was their oldest son. He married Elizabeth Johnston, and they moved to Fayette County around 1858. Elizabeth died in 1879, and is buried in the old cemetery at Prigrim's Rest, and her grave is marked. He laser married Salina Moss, and the family had a big argument and the two boys then at home, Greene and Andrew He died of a lip and face cancer late in 1899 or early 1900. He is buric next to Elizabeth at Pilgrim, but the grave is not marked, unless Carey's brother put up the Confederate monument he obtained and kept at home for many years. Two Daughten Samantha Ann and Keroline are buried next to Elizabeth's grave.

I had Carey read "John Walker of Wigton Scotland" in the Southern History Section of the Birmingham Library - approximately 400 pages, published in 1902. We Checked a lot of Walkers in North Carallina, and especially Union County. Carey was of the opinion that James Walker's father was a John Walker, from Union County. I

not the same John Walker from Union County. I wonder where the story started that James Walker, and family, and particularly Samuel Taylor Walker, came from Union County, N.C. I have been to Monroe, N.C. at number of times, and have done research there and in Anson County. My Hollimans came from Anson County, which then included Union County. The Blakeneys at Newtonville came from Chesterfield County, S.C. actually only a mile or from the Hollimans site. There were then and still are a lot of Walkers there. My baker line came from Mecklinburg County, which adjoins Union, so I have had a lot of checking done in that area. Our great grandfather, Samuel Taylor Walker was definitely born in Shelby County, Alabama, and was a grandson of James Walker, who was prominent in the area and a County official when the County site was at Montevallo. The earliest court records (still available for inspection by the public), are in his handwriting.

You asked about John J. Holliman (called "Crippled John". He was a distant cousin of Grandpa John Thomas Holliman. During their boyhood, there were three John Hollimans living in the same neighborhood around Hico. There was Crippled John, who had spiffered a brokenship as a child and had a limp in his gait. Grandpa Holliman was called "Hico John" because he lived near there. "Black John", a swarthy complected son of Charles Holliman, who lived at Newtonville was the third John. Crippled John, son of Cornelius, killed at Petersburg, married Keroline Walker. Grandpa married Martha Jane Walker, sister of Keroline. Grandpa and Martha Jane are buried at Cain's Ridge Cemetery. The other John T. Holliman, who obtained the first government land purchase in Fayette County, and who is probably buried at Hopewell, I have never been able to identify, but do not know of any relationship.

I have pretty good family information on Grandma Martha Jane Holliman's descendants. I have fair information on Samantha Ann's descendants, and fair information with some blanks on Keroline W. Holliman's line. Your Grandfather Pinkney Monroe Walker was born in 1865 in Shelby County, and I have the census records on much of the Walker background there. I have good information on Uncle Greene Walker's descendants and on Uncle Andrew Walkers family.

Willis Johny Holliman, the youngest son of Aunt Keroline and husband Crippled John had the family Bible of Samuel Taylor Walker. It had originally belonged to Andrew and wife Jeaney, and both families were entered therein. Johny is now dead, and his daughter, Jewell Howard, route 2, Kennedy supplied me a good bit of data on Keroline's line. I hope that she is taking care of that bible, and that it will not be lost.

Incidentally, Elizabeth Scrivner, the wife of John R. Scrivener, was originally Elizabeth Clar Walker, sister of Samuel Taylor Walker.

James Aaron Gamble Walker, was another brother of Samuel Taylor Walker. ne moved to Lawrence County, Alabama, before 1870, and settled in the outskirts of Moulton. He became County Tax Assessor, and so did one of his sons. Andrew Walker and Jeanie were there in 1870 when the Census was taken, and made their home with Aaron. They are probably buried at Moulton. Another Brother, Robert Gamble LaFayette Walker married Narcissa Bragg in Shelby, had a family, and I think moved west, as I find no Trace of him. Another Brother Thomas C. Walker evidently died young, as I find no record him in Shelby. There were three other children, of which I have no record.

Be sure to supply me with a list showing the full names of your children, and Edwina's children, dates of birth, education, occupation, and if different from yours their permanent mailing addresses. If any are married, then supply also names of spouses

Incidentally I have partially completed manuscrips on the Blakeneys, Holliman's and Bakers, of Newtonville, and hope to complete them in the next few years, if I can hold out. Edwina might be interested in the Blakeneys for her husband is a descendant of Thomas Blakeney, grandson of Captain John Blakeney of Chesterfield Co. S.C. He was a Captain in Frances Marion's troops in the Rev. War. My grandmother Baker died at Fayette in 1855, then over 100 years age. She was Belzianne Blakeney, grand daughter of Thomas, of Newtonville. She and Dr. Curt Branyon were 1st Cousins.

His Father Cornelius Holliman was a son of Charles Holliman and wife Barbury, who came to Alabama with two other Holliman Families, in 1836 and settled at Newtonville.. They came from Anson County, Cornelius Holliman was a Private in Company "B" of the bist North Carolina Alabama Infantry CSA, and was killed by a stray bullet at Petersburg, Va., in late 1864. Cornelius was a brother Wif Warren Holliman, who was also a member of the same CSA organization. Caroline (Keroline) F. Holliman is buried at Pilgrim's Rest Cemetery, and John J. Dear Cousing

I have been working in my spare time over the last few years on some family histories, among which is the family of great grandfather Samuel T. Walker. He was born in Shelby County, Alabama, and was the son of Andrew Walker, and grand son of James Walker. James Walker came to Shelby County around 1817, and was one of the first judges of the County Court. At the present time my material is largely in the form of notes taken over the years from county records, census records and so forth. According to the 1880 Census of Fayette County, the family of Frank M. Laboon (Wife Samantha Ann Walker - daughter of Samuel Taylor Walker), shows that they had two children, viz: Mary E. Laboon, age 8, born in Ala., and Martha M. Laboon, age 2, born in Ala. Frank M. Laboon and Samantha Ann Walker were married, according to my records, in 1871. She died in 1881, and is buried at Pilgrim's Rest. It was a ten year marriage, and I judge the two children mentioned above were all that was born to them.

I need some information for my records, and for the mamuscript I hope to prepare. I need to know the names, bate of birth, date of death if deceased, name of cemetery where buried, if deceased, and if alive the present mailing address, date of marriage, of these two children, and their descendants. The information should be shown by families, so that the data will be readily understandable. This would include your children and your generation and your mother's generation.
