- 4. Joseph⁸ Chew (Samuel⁸, John¹) was born about 1662/5 and died 1 February 1704/5 in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. By the terms of his father's will he inherited a tract of 450 acres of land called "Sanetley." In Joseph Chew's will, proved 7 June 1705, the testator mentions his "son-in-law" (i. e., stepson) Samuel Battee. He married (1), 17 November 1685, Mary Smith. He married (2), ante 1690, Mrs. Elizabeth (Hanslap) Battee 3 who was born about 1670 and died in 1716. She was one of the daughters of Henry Hanslap (died 1698) of Anne Arundel County. The will of Mrs. Elizabeth Chew, widow, was dated 23 April and proved 27 May 1716 (Annapolis, Liber 14, folio 96). She mentions her sons Samuel Battee, Joseph Chew and Henry Chew, who inherit the residue of her estate; her grandsons Joseph and Henry Chew; her granddaughter Elizabeth Chew; and her sister Susannah Gassaway. Her "brother" (i. e., brother-in-law) Thomas Gassaway was appointed executor of the will, which requests that the testatrix be buried in Herring Creek graveyard.

Joseph and Elizabeth (Hanslap) Chew had issue as follows:

5. WILLIAM³ CHEW (Samuel², John¹) died 28 February 1709/10 in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. By the terms of his father's will he inherited a lot of ground in the town of Herrington.

He married, 20 December 1690, Sydney Wynn, daughter of Thomas and Martha Wynn of Pennsylvania, and had issue as follows:

- 13. I. BENJAMIN' CHEW, born about 1700, died 1762 (of whom later).
 - II. Sydney Chew, married Charles Pierpont (died 1748).
- 6. Benjamin² Chew (Samuel², John¹) was born 13 February 1670/1 and died 3 March 1699/1700. He married, 8 December 1692, Elizabeth Benson (born 1677), daughter of John and Elizabeth (Smith) Benson of Calvert County, Maryland. She married (2), 24 September 1702, Richard Bond of Calvert County, and died in 1725.

Benjamin and Elizabeth (Benson) Chew had issue as follows:

- 14. I. SAMUEL CHEW, born 30 October 1693 and died 16 June 1743 (of whom later).
 - II. Elizabeth Chew, born 13 March 1694/5, died 9 February 1726/7; married 22 December 1710 Kensey Johns (1689-1729).
 - III. Ann4 Chew, born 14 October 1696.
 - IV. Mary4 Chew, born in December 1698.
- 7. Samuel⁴ Chew (Samuel⁸, Samuel², John¹) was born 28 May 1683 and died 31 October 1736 in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. He was a merchant, engaged in commerce and registered his own sailing vessels. He left to his three surviving sons the tracts "Ayres," "Carter Bennett," "Chew's Fortune," "Upper Bennett" and "Abington Manor."

He married, 26 August 1703, Mary Harrison, daughter of Richard and Elizabeth (Smith) Harrison, who was born 10 October 1684 and died 24 August 1725; and by her had issue as follows:

- I, SAMUEL CHEW, born circa 1704, died 15 January 1736/7 (of whom later).
 - II. Ann⁵ Chew, died 1777; married, 11 August 1724, Philip Thomas (1694-1762), son of Samuel and Mary Thomas.

64. BERTHA COHEN.

Born April 12, 1838. Fourth daughter and fifth child of David I, and Harriett Cohen. Unmarried.

65. JACOB I. COHEN.

Born November 6, 1841. Died January 22, 1920. Second son and sixth child of David I. and Harriett Cohen. Married Ellen Mordecai (daughter of Moses C. and Isabel Mordecai, of Charleston, S. C.), who was born June 25, 1837, and died August 13, 1915. Issue: David I. Cohen (69) and Alan M. Cohen (70). Both Jacob I. and Ellen Cohen are buried in the family cemetery.

Jacob I. Cohen was a well-known lawyer in Baltimore. He is said to have been the best examiner of titles in Baltimore. When asked how he managed to attain his proficiency in spite of the poor condition of his eyesight, he replied that, as he knew where to look for the important items in records, he was able to avoid much unnecessary labor. He was also a member of the Maryland Guard Battalion, 1860-1861.¹²¹

66. REBECCA JACKSON.

Born September 25, 1844. Died June 13, 1899. Fifth daughter and seventh child of David I. and Harriett Cohen. Married Eugene J. Jackson, who was born April 9, 1833, and died December 13, 1883. Issue: Corinne Johnson (71), May Long (72) and Harriett Cohen Coale (73). Eugene J. Jackson was a son of John D. and Louisa Solomon Jackson. The latter was a granddaughter of Haym Solomon. Both Rebecca and Eugene J. Jackson are buried in the Saratoga Street cemetery.

67. EMILY CLARA COHEN.

Born August 3, 1866. Died September 18, 1903. Only child of Mendes and Justina Cohen. Unmarried. Buried in family cemetery, Baltimore.

68. MIRIAM COHEN MYERS.

Born December 28, 1873. Died September 3, 1900. Only child of Catherine and Charles D. Myers. Unmarried. Buried in family cemetery, Baltimore.

69. DAVID I. COHEN.

Born September 14, 1870. Died June 20, 1871. Elder son and child of Jacob I. and Ellen Cohen. Buried in family cemetery, Baltimore.

70. ALAN MORDECAI COHEN.

Born January 21, 1872. Died September 6, 1913. Younger son and child of Jacob I. and Ellen Cohen. Married Emily Johnson of Ithaca, N. Y. Issue: Alan M. Cohen (74). Buried in family cemetery, Baltimore.

71. CORINNE JOHNSON.

Born February 13, 1866. Eldest daughter and child of Rebecca and Eugene J. Jackson. Married November 25, 1908, Arnold Burgess Johnson, of Massachusetts, who died February 2, 1915.

72. MAY LONG.

Born May 4, 1867. Second daughter and child of Rebecca and Eugene J. Jackson. Married July 16, 1907, David Grigsby Long, of Virginia. Issue: Eugene Jackson Long (76) and Hugh Blair Long (77).

73. HARRIETT COHEN COALE.

Born March 12, 1872. Third daughter and child of Rebecca and Eugene J. Jackson. Married November 16, 1898, Isaac Coale, Jr., who was born June 2, 1861.

COFILL, PAT., m. Mary (?) and had iss.: JAMES, b. Dec. 1749; MARGARET, b. 30 June 1752 (131:131/r).

COGELL, JAMES, d. by 14 March 1676 when James Phillips posted admin. bond with Thomas Long and Richard Ball (11:282).

THE GEORGE COLE FAMILY

COLE, GEORGE (1), was in Balto. Co. by Nov. 1709 when he purch. from Thomas and Christian Stone 174 a. Stone's Range on w. side Back R., and d. there by June 1751; m. Elizabeth (poss. Love); in 1750 owned Stone's Range; his will, 16 June 1749 - 4 June 1751, named w. Elizabeth and s. George (who was to have afsd. tract); had iss.: GEORGE (prob. the George was was b. 13 March 1713), and poss. RICHARD MILLER (67:26; 133:7; 153:61; 210-28:66).

COLE, GEORGE (2), s. of George (1) and Elizabeth, poss. the George who was b. 13 March 1713 in St. Paul's Par.; d. by 2 Aug. 1762; his will, 5 July 1762 - 2 Aug. 1762, named sons Richard and William (to have 60 a. Stoney Hill), and sons Nathan and George (to share Stone's Range); had iss.: RICHARD; WILLIAM; GEORGE; NATHAN, b. after 1746 (111:134; 133:7).

COLE, RICHARD MILLER (3), poss. s. of George (1) and Elizabeth, is placed here because his s. George who d. 1766 also owned 194 a. Stone's Range; prob. the Richard Cole who m. Sabina Haile on 15 May 1735; d. by 1766; in March 1746 John Boring, Jr., and w. Abarilla conv. him part Boring's Goft, and in 1750 he still owned 50 a. of this land; had iss.: GEORGE, b. 18 March 1735/6; SARAH, b. 27 March 1745 (79:478, 481; 133:48, 90, 153; 153:14).

COLE, GEORGE (4), s. of Richard Miller (3) and Sabina, was b. 18 March 1735/6, and d. by 16 June 1767; m. Patience (?); his will, 20 March 1766 - 16 June 1767, named w. Patience, dau. Ruth, land Stone's Range, 194 a.; in a codicil dated 21 March 1766 he directed that Boring's Gift which had been conv. to his f. by John Boring, should be made over to Capt. Charles Ridgely; had iss.: RUTH (112:58; 133:48).

THE JOHN COLE FAMILY is the subject of a chart by Johnston.

COLE, JOHN (5), no known rel. to any of the above, was b. c. 1669, and d. in 1746; m. 1st Johanna Garrett (b. c.1675, d. c. 1715, dau, of Dennis and Barbara (?) Garrett), and 2nd Dinah Hawkins, alive in 1747, day, of Matthew Hawkins; Cole's birth date determined by depositions giving his age as 38 in 1707, 63 in 1732, and 67 in 1737; Cole testified at the trial of Capt. John Oldton for the murder of Cole's father-in-law Dennis Garrett; in Sept. 1702 John Broad (who m. Dennis Garrett's wid. Barbara) made a will naming Thomas, s. of John and Johanna Cole; in Aug. 1712 Barbara (?) Garrett Broad conv. prop. to her grandson Dennis Garrett Cole. s, of John and Hannah Cole; in Nov. 1712 John conv. his s. Joseph part Daniel's Whimsey, and conv. part of same tract to his son John in March 1733; with w. Dinah, Thomas Nowland and w., Thomas Broad and w. Anna, and Rebecca Hawkins, conv. to Lancelot Todd land of the late Matthew Hawkins, In June 1731 was made exempt from paying taxes; his will, 12 Nov. 1745 - 5 Nov. 1746, named w. Dinah and ch., Charles, Joseph, and Matthew; admin. bond posted

23 Nov. 1747 by Joseph Taylor with William Barney and Thomas Williamson; est. admin. by Taylor on 5 Feb. 1747/8 and 7 Nov. 1754; had iss.: ELIZABETH, m. John Ensor; JOSEPH, d. c.1721; JOHN, m. MARY; THOMAS, m. Sarah; SARAH, b. c. 1693, d. 1758, m. Charles Gorsuch; DENNIS GARRETT; WILLIAM, d. c.1770; (by 2nd w.): CHARLES; JOSEPH; MATTHEW (4:177, 244; 11:364; 19:276; 29:161; 66:183, 256; 67:362; 68:18; 69:209; 70:340; 73:121; 74:47; 75:25; 77:485, 686; 78:107; 110:373; 122:160; 310:125).

COLE, JOSEPH (6), s. of John (5) and Johanna, d. in Balto. Co. by 13 March 1720, having m. Susannah (?); his will, 22 Jan. 1720 - 13 March 1720, named w. Susanna, dau. Sarah (not yet 16), and dau. Susanna (begotten of his w. Susanna); Charles Gorsuch and his w. Sarah (formerly Cole), Thomas Cole and his w. Sarah; had iss.: SARAH, b. after 1704, m. 24 Nov. 1735 Anthony Chamness and moved to N. C. by 1764; SUSANNA (90:82; 110:167; 112:133; 133:154).

COLE, JOHN (7), s. of John (5) and Johanna, alive in 1750 when he owned 100 a. Cole's Chance; m. Mary Chaffinch on 25 Dec. 1730; in Oct. 1737 he and his w. Joined his f. John in selling part Daniel's Whimsey to John Ensor; in March 1740 he bought part of Spring Garden from Edward and Mary Richards; and in March 1745/6 James Tracey of Craven Co., N. C., appointed John Ensor of Patapsco. his atty. to ackn. sale of James Meadow and Teague's Park to John Cole, Jr.; had iss.: JOSEPH, b. 15 April 1736 (75:25, 472; 79:248; 133:150; 150:6).

COLE, THOMAS (8), s. of John (5) and Johanna, alive in 1781; m. Sarah (?); in 1725 surv. 100 a. Christopher's Lot; between 9 Jan. 1726 and 6 March 1733/4 obtained portions of Levy's Tribe, Addition to Levy's Tribe, and Green's Chance; in 1750 owned 100 a. Christopher's Lot, and 56 a. Thomas Lot; in March 1768 he sold and bought back these two tracts to and from his s. Thomas, Jr.; in 1781 conv. to s. Christopher tracts Christopher's Lot and lease of Mountain; had iss.: CHRISTOPHER, b. by 1718; THOMAS, b. 14 Feb. 1718; JOANNA, b. 28 May 1720; SARAH, b. 15 Aug. 1722; BROAD, b. 12 Aug. 1725; ABRAHAM, b. 10 Jan. 1727/8; MARY, b. 12 May 1730; ELIZABETH, b. 13 Feb. 1733/4 (70:290, 406; 72:21, 193; 74:32; 207-IL#A:557; 207-PL#6:65; 231-WG#G:230, 232).

COLE, DENNIS GARRETT (9), s. of John (5) and Johanna, d. c.1773 in Balto. Co., having m. Rachel, dau. of Mordecai and Mary (Parsons) Price; in 1750 owned 50 a. Price's Favor and 50 a. Maynor's Beginning; his will, Dec. 1772 - 16 June 1773, named grandson Dennis Cole, sic ch. of his dec. dau. Edith Mallonee, grandson Stephen Gill, born of his dau. Cassandra Gill, daus. Urith Price and Rachel Pearce, s. Henry, granddau. Rebecca Pitt, and w. Rachel, sons-in-law John Price, Jr., and Stephen Gill; had iss.: EDITH, b. 28 Aug. 1728, m. 8 Nov. 1748 John Mallonee; URITH, b. 25 Nov. 1731, m. John Price, Jr.; DENNIS, b. 9 Dec. 1734, d. 1770; RACHEL, m. (?) Pearce; HENRY; CASSANDRA, b. 1751, d. 1811, m. 1772 Stephen Gill; REBECCA, m. (?) Pitt (112:252; 131:32; 133:50; 153:12).

COLE, WILLIAM (10), s. of John (5) and Johanna, d. in Balto.
Co. in 1770; m. Mary Giles; prob. the William Cole of Deer Creek
who in 1750 owned 183 a. Arabia Petrea; his will, 18 Jan. 1769 25 June 1770, named lands Cross' Park, Cole's Favor, Cole's Manor,
Cole's String, Cole's Castle, Cole's Struggle, and Cole's Chance,
his f. John, w. Mary, and ch., William, Giles, Vincent, Joseph,
Allice, m. Caples, Hannah, Cordelia, Elizabeth, Mary, and Rebecca,
Sarah, dau. and heir of testator's bro. Joseph and Sarah's husband
Anthony Chamness, kinsman Joseph Ensor; had iss.: WILLIAM; JOHN;
GILES; VINCENT; JOSEPH, b. c.1752; ALICE, m. Robert Caples; HANNAH;
CORDELIA; ELIZABETH; SYBIL; REBECCA; and MARY (112:144; 153:51).

COLE, CHARLES (11), s. of John (5) by his 2nd w. Dinah, b. c. 1717, alive in May 1744 when he leased from Thomas Brerewood a lot in Charlotte Town, the lease to run for the life spans of himself, then age 27, and his bros. Joseph, 18, and Matthew, 12 (79:360).

COLE, MATTHEW (12), s. of Joseph (5) and Dinah, b. c.1736, was alive in 1744, and d. by 12 Nov. 1754 when admin. bond on his est. was posted by Charles Cole with Isaac Sampson (11:376; 79:360).

COLE, CHRISTOPHER (13), s. of Thomas (8), b. c.1718, d. by 7 Dec. 1785 when his est. was admin. by Sarah Cole; m. Sarah Tipton, b. 3 Oct. 1722, dau. of William and Hannah (Price) Tipton; may have m. 2nd Sarah Hooker; in Jan. 1737 bought 100 a. Panthers Hills from John Parrish; still owned this land in 1750; in 1781 his f. Thomas, Sr., conv. him Christopher's Lot and the lease of Mountain; est. admin. 7 Dec. 1785 by Sarah Cole; had iss.: CHRISTOPHER, Jr.; EZEKIEL (75; 153:14; 231-WG#G:230, 232; 231-WG#VV: 592. 594).

COLE, THOMAS (14), s. of Thomas(8), b. 14 Feb. 1718, d. c. 1793; m. 1st Elizabeth (?) who d. by 25 Jan. 1747, and m. 2nd on that date Sarah, dau. of Mordecai and Elizabeth Price; was disch. from Gunpowder Meeting on 23 d, 5 mo., 1759 for drinking to excess and for gaming; bought part Price's Good Will from Aquila Carr in June 1760; his will, 27 Aug. 1792 - 9 Jan. 1793, named grandch., Stephen, Elisha, Micajah, Salathiel, and Aquila Cole, and Thomas Wheeler, and the following ch. (Thomas is said to have had three by his 1st w. and seven by his 2nd w.): THOMAS, m. Rebecca; CHRISTOPHER; SALATHIEL; MORDECAI, m. Artridge Price; ELIZABETH, b. 31 Jan. 1747; SOPHIA, b. 8 Nov. 1751, m. William Price; RACHEL, b. 19 Nov. 1753, m. John Bond, Jr.; SARAH, m. Joshua Ford on 10 June 1786; ANNE, m. (?) Bosley; REBECCA; MARY, m. (?) Wheeler (84:267; 112:252; 131:32; 133:50; 136).

COLE, ABRAHAM (15), s. of Thomas (8), b. 10 Jan. 1727/8, d. c. 1822 in Balto. Co.; his will, 12 June 1818 - 20 March 1822; m. and had iss.: SARAH, m. (?) Bosley; ANN, m. Thomas Donovan; RUTH, d. by 1 Feb. 1843; EDITH, m. (?) Hall; BELINDA, m. William Stansbury; ELEANOR; ABRAHAM, b. c.1760; JAMES. (236-11:404).

COLE, JOSEPH (16), s. of William (10) and Mary, b. 1752, d. 21
Oct. 1821, m. Sophia Osborne by lic. 24 Dec. 1788; had iss.: VACHEL,
m. Jemima Ensor; KEZIAH, m. Abraham Cole; URITH, m. (?) Price;
RACHEL, m. (?) Benson; ERNESTUS, m. Mary J. Cole; JOSEPH; RUTH;
SALATHIEL; STEPHEN; SOPHIA; GILES. (Cole notes, MHS).

COLE, GILES (17), s. of William (10) and Mary, d. by 14 March 1828 when his est. was admin. by wid. Sarah; had iss.: HARRIET, m. Edward Norwood; TALITHA, m. Johnsee Wooden; LUTHER; PENELOPE; MATILDA, m. Patrick Lynch; ABIJAH, under age in 1828; ALFRED, under age in 1828; WILLIAM; under age; JOHN, under age (237-25:456).

COLE, ANGELICO, in Dec. 1758 was named as dau.-in-law in will of Alexander Grant of Balto. Co. who also named his w. Elizabeth (127:13).

COLE, CASSANDRA, d. testate in Balto. Co.; her will, 19 June 1745 - 13 May 1746, named s. Skipwith, s. William (and his ch.); dau. Cassandra Rigbie, dau. Ann Johns, grandch., Skipwith, Cassandra Johns, Susanna Rigbie, and son-in-law Nathan Rigbie (110:368).

COLE, ELIZABETH, had iss.: COMFORT, b. 7 Feb. 1714; COMFORT, b. 8 Nov. 1720 (131:5, 38/r).

COLE, GEORGE, m. 2 March 1732 Martha Litton, and had iss.: HENRY, b. 25 March 1736 (128:70, 92).

COLE, JAMES, d. in Balto. Co. by 1 July 1772; m. 19 July 1748 Jane Poloke; his will, 29 May 1772 - 1 July 1772, named tracts Monreal, Paradice, and other land, and his ch.; his est. admin. 5 May 1773 by execs. James and Jane Cole; had iss.: JANE, b. 7 July 1749; JAMES, b. 29 July 1751; EPHRAIM, b. 7 April 1754; COMFORT, b. 14 May 1756; ELIZABETH, b. 2 Sept. 1758; THOMAS; EZEKIEL (6: 317; 112:210; 129:360, 361).

COLE, JOHN, and WILLIAM, were Quakers from A. A. Co., who resided at Bush River c.1700 (433:366).

COLE, JOHN, m. Mary (?), and had iss.: WILLIAM, b. 24 July 1741 (128:116).

COLE, JOHN, d. by 28 Dec. 1745, when admin. bond was posted by William Fell with Robert North and William Hammond (11:359).

COLE, MARY, m. 21 Jan. 1729 John Miles Youngblood (129:254).

COLE, PHILIP, d. by 26 July 1734, when his estate was admin. by Cassandra Cole (See Cassandra Cole above); had iss.: SKIPWITH; CASSANDRA, m. Nathan Rigbie; WILLIAM; MARY (3:172).

COLE, SKIPWITH, prob. s. of Philip above and Cassandra, d. by 11 Oct. 1755 when admin. bond was posted by Margaret Cole with James Rigbie and Richard Johns; in 1750 owned 352 a. Stone Hill and 110 a. Arabia Petrea; m. Margaret (poss. Holland), and had iss.: SKIPWITH, b. 16 March 1736; WILLIAM, b. 5 Aug. 1738; PHILIP, b. 6 Dec. 1740; CASSANDRA, b. 8 Jan. 1742 (11:388; 128:115; 129: 331; 153:62).

COLE, THOMAS and w. Priscilla imm. to Md. c.1649; he and his w. and a Sarah Cole were mentioned in the will of John Godfrey, made 29 May 1672, proved 19 June 1672; in Aug. 1673 Thomas Cole surv. 450 a. Maiden's Choice which was later held by Charles Gorsuch's son; may have acquired other tracts: Cole's Harbour, 350 a. on which the original 60 acres of Balto. Town were laid out, and Marybone, 200 a.; these tracts were sold by Charles Gorsuch and his w. Sarah on 8 Dec. 1679 to David Jones (the deed stated that the tracts were inherited by Sarah Gorsuch by the will of her father Thomas Cole, but no such will has been found); had iss.: SARAH, b. c.1657, m. by 13, 3rd mo., 1677, Charles Gorsuch then living on the Eastern Shore where the Tred Avon meeting called him to account for taking a wife contrary "to the truth" (60:46; 120:69; 211:110; 388).

COLE, THOMAS, m. Elizabeth (?) and had iss.: ZIPPORAH, b. 17 Jan. 1716; JAMES, b. 24 Nov. 1724 (128:84; 131:9).

COLE, THOMAS, d. by 22 May 1745; was in Balto.
