THIS INDENTIVE: Witnesseth that I John Cole planter, of Union county and State of South Carolina, calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, and being at present blesed with the rational excercixe of my Understanding (as is Usal with me) enjoying a smal measure of health tho' imfirm in body DO ordain and constitute this my last will and Testament, First I resign my soul to the Mercy of God, and Body to the dust to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors. Secon ly my worldly estate to divided as follows. Viz. To my son Richard Cole I will and bequeath all that tract or <sup>d</sup> land percel sopposed to be one hundred And fifty Acres being partof a tract of two hundred Acres purchased by me from John Weinman refference being had to the Original Grant, or deeds of conveyance will more fully appear. Begining at a Red oak on the East Side the <sup>a</sup> Reedy branch, and runing North eighty west to pine onside said line, and there or near about, then runing a direct line to take the upper corner of the improvmnt made by said Richard Cole and running the same course with the Upper line of fence till its intersecs the mouth of folly branch then up the several courses of Said branch till falling on the line of the original grant then with that line inclining to the begining to the next corner, then from that corner to the Red oak first mentioned, with all the improvmnts and appurtances thereunto belonging &----Unto my Daughter Eucy Baley I will <sup>all</sup> and bequeath that percel of land sopposed to be fifty Acres the remaining part of the tract above mentioned withall appurtances thereof &

Elizabeth Cannon, Mary Hendric, Nancey Baley, Lucey Baley & Rhoda Yerbey.--Lastly I do appoint, will, and constitute My beloved wife Mary my Executrix, and my son Richard Cole my Executor to put in excution this will and testament as the law directs, and do by these presents revoke all former wills laga- cies or bequeathe by me made, and this, and this only to be my last will and testament. IN WITNESS whereof I have Set my hand and affixed my seal this eight day of Aprill in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninty nine--NB in the 13th line the word-of land, was interlined before signed. and also the word Sale in the 35 line.

# Will of South Carolina

I KNOW all men by these presents that we, Elizabeth Henderson, Joseph & J. Franklin  
all of Union County and State aforesaid, are held and firmly  
bound, unto the Judges of the County Court aforesaid, and their  
successors in office, in the sum and full sum of One hundred  
Pound<sup>s</sup> which payment well and truly to  
be made and done we bind ourselves, our heirs executors and  
administrators firmly jointly and severally by these presents  
Sealed with our Seal's and dated the eighth — day of  
January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
and eighty, in the town of Columbia.

The condition of the above obligation is such  
that if the above bound, Elizabeth Henderson  
in the administration of the goods chattels and  
credits of John Cope deceased, do make a true  
and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods,  
chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have  
or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the  
said Elizabeth Henderson  
or onto the hands or possession of any other person, or persons  
for him and the same or persons do administer in the County  
Court of Union when she shall be thereto required, and  
such goods, chattels and credits do well and truly adminis-  
tered according to Law, and do make a Just and true account  
of her actions and doings therein when required by the  
said court, and all the rest of the said goods chattels and  
credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account  
of the said administration, the same being first allowed by  
the said Court, shall deliver and pay unto such person respec-  
tively as are entitled to the same by Law, and if it shall  
hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was  
made by the said deceased, and the same be proved in  
Court and the Executors obtain a certificate of the probate  
thereof and the said Elizabeth Henderson  
do in such case, if required render and deliver  
up the said letters of administration. Then this obligation  
to be void, or else to remain in full force."
