His Honor the Lieut Governor inform'd the Board that the Head of the French Colonists were to set out on Monday next and that the rest of the Colony wou'd soon follow—and Communicated the following Letter which he thought proper for their regulation and a Copy of which regulation he had sent to Mr Calhoun

SIR

You will receive this by the hand of Mr Roger whom I have app'd a Justice of the Peace to decide differences amongst his countrymen of the Colony and given him Simpsons Justice for his guide in cases of difficulty I have directed him to Confer with some discreet Justice in his Neighbourhood in w^h I rely on your good Character to Assist him according to the best of your Knowledge.

I have given Commiss'n of Capt. to Mr. Due Lieut to Mr. Leoron and Ensign to LeViollette that they may do militia Dutys by themselves and not be liable to misunderstandings with officers who cannot give their Order in a Language at present understood by the Colonists

Some Persons with the Name of Commissary must be chosen by them to take care of and Issue their Provisions once a Week at the rate of 1 lb of wheat flour or 1 quart of Indian Corn a day to each Person

You are to furnish them with 3 months Provisions 1/2 flour & half Indian Corn and I will pay you for it every 3 or six months on your producing a Certificate from Mr. Roger of the delivery thereof and provided I have no cause to find fault with the Price which from my present good opinion of your honesty I hope I shall have no room to do And as I have thrown many benefits into your hands in running their Lands I expect you will do every friendly office for them which besides discharging your own Conscience by so doing will most certainly if this Colony should thrive and become very Populous as it will if properly encouraged now promote the value of all the Neighbouring Lands these being men who fly from the religious oppressions in france will be followed by many also the account of enjoying Civil and religious Liberty here

had hitherto done and therefore Prayed his Excellency to Grant them such Relief as in his Goodness he should see fit.

His Excellency thereupon observed to them that the Bounty given by the Province had ceased long since, & that they had no Reason from Government to expect any such assistance as they craved But it appearing that they were very poor his Excellency proposed to the several officers to deliver out their Warrants without expence to them and to take the Risk of being paid by the Public which they severally agreed to and the Secretary was Ordered to prepare Warrants of Survey for the undermentioned persons VIZ'T

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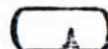


