Granmother Carpenter

On Tuesday morning, June 12, 1923, God, in His infinite wisdom and love, called for grandmother Carpenter and for her the early dawn of that morning brightened into the beautiful sunlight of Eternity. How glorious it must have been for her after all the years of toil and care, pain and sorrow, sun and shadow just to rest sweetly where every tear is wiped away and where there is no more pain nor sorrow, and while our hearts go out in sympathy to the bereaved ones we love to think of what that morning meant to dear grandmother who for eighty-one years, two months and twenty-one days had been traveling Life's Highway.

She left four children, about twenty-eight grand children and eighty-nine great grand children besides a host of other relatives and friends.

Grand mother Carpenter was born March 22, 1836 in the State of South Carolina. When she was two years old her parents moved by land from South Carolina to Millville, Alabama, where she lived until 1854, when she was married to Willis McFadden and came to Mississippi where she resided until her death. Mr. McFadden was killed during the civil war leaving her with four small children three girls and one boy. About one year later she married Azel Clifton who was also killed before the war closed.

This time she remained a widow until about 1886 when she married L. M. Carpenter and they lived together until about four years ago when he too, slipped out into Eternity and for the third time she was left a widow. Grandmother Carpenter professed a hope in Christ many years ago. United with the Missionary Baptist Church and was baptised some time during the civil war. And we believe that her faith in God was the secret of her patience during the years of warning strength, the secret of her willingness. Yea, eagerness to leave this world when the shadows of death were gathering 'round her.

Previous to her death she was confined to her bed about two and one half months, and often she expressed the desire that her loved ones should not grieve for her when she went away.

The body was laid to rest in the Salem Cemetery Wednesday and while friends and loved ones looked for the last time here on face of dear grandmother Carpenter and listened to the words of the good old song, "When the Roll is called up Yonder I'll be there" we can't help but feel that then and there a stronger, firmer resolution was made in some heart to live closer to God.

May each and every one who reads this be able to say from the depth of their hearts, "When the Roll is called in Heaven, I'll be there". God bless the memory of Grandmother Carpenter.

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
