WILLIAM JEFFREYS

War of 1812. . . .Photostat. . . .Treasury Dept. 3d Aud. Office Novem-
ber 3, 1871. Rolls of Capt. ABNER PEARCE'S Company of Tennessee Militia
show that WILLIAM JEFFREYS, private, served from September 20th 1814 to
April 10, 1815. . . .War of 1812. . . .Declaration of soldier for pen-
sion. . . .State of Alabama, Marion Co. 4 Apr. 1871 before JOHN D.
TERRELL, Probate Judge, WILLIAM JEFFREYS, 75, residing near Barnes-
ville, Marion County, Alabama. He declares he is married; wife's name
was MALINDA BORDAINZ (BORDEN) to whom he was married at Morgan County,
Alabama on 7 April 1820, that he served full period of 60 days in
military service of U.S.; that he was drafted in Captain ABNER A.
PIERCE'S Company at Sparta, Tennessee in Sept. 1814; discharged at
Huntsville, Alabama in March, 1815; he was one of Tennessee Militia,
marched from Sparta (to) Fort Williams on Coosa River stationed there
during the winter. Returned from there to Huntsville, Ala. and was
there discharged, the war having closed. His Post Office is Pikeville,
Marion Co., Ala. place of abode near Barnesville, Ala. . . .WILLIAM
JEFFREYS. . . .Attest: JOHN A. POPE, JACOB JEFFREYS. . . .State of
Alabama, County of Marion 21 April A D 1955, WILLIAM JEFFREYS, 59,
private in Tennessee Militia. Was drafted in White County, Tennessee

during the fall for 6 months. Served more than 4 months. Discharged at Huntsville, Ala. in the spring of the year 1815 on account of his service being no longer required. Issued Bounty Land Warrant for 80 acres under Act of September 1850 numbers of which were 18000 issued on 5 November 1851 and that he has legally located said warrant and cannot return. He received a certificate of discharge but it is lost or destroyed. This declaration is for the purpose of obtaining 80 acres Bounty Land under Act of 3 March 1855. The above statement is according to best of his recollection. . . WILLIAM x JEFFREYS (his mark). . . .

JAMES DAVISON and BENJAMIN M. RIGGINS, resident of Marion Co., Ala. declare they saw him sign etc. he made his mark this time as his eyesight has failed so badly. . . . Claim of widow for service pension. . . .

State of Alabama, Marion County. 10 May 1881. On 10 May 1881 MALINDA JEFFREYS, 87, resident of Barnesville, Marion Co., Ala. and Widow of WILLIAM JEFFREYS; says he was drafted at Sparta, Tennessee in 1812 and served until the close of the war. Since his discharge from the service he has resided as follows; at or near Barnesville, Marion County, Alabama and a portion of the time in Madison County, Alabama. He was 5 ft. 10 inches high, fair complexion, rather orban (auburn) Hair weighed 160 to 170 pounds. . . . MALINDA x JEFFREYS (her mark). . . .

N. J. JEFFREYS, MARY JEFFREYS. . . . MARY JEFFREYS, 60 and R.J. JEFFREYS, 62, of said co. testify that they had known MALINDA for 50 and 56 years respectively.
