These are the seventy kings mentioned in the manuscript preceding Constantine fil. Urguist, sive Fergus, who ascended the throne in 791, and reigned thirty years. He was succeeded by Unnust, sive Hungus, fil. Urguist 821, who reigned to 833, twelve years. Drest, son of Constantine and Talorgan, son of

Uthoil, reigned together from 833 to 835, three years. Uwen, son of Unnust, or Eogen, son of Hingi, 836 to 839, three years, and was succeeded by Wrad, the son of Bargoit, who also reigned three years, and was succeeded by Bred, or Brude, with whom the series of Pictish kings ends. There are besides three names, Kenneth, Brude, and Drust, who appear to have been unsuccessful claimants of the crown before its final transference to the Scots.







THE GENEALOGY OF THE KINGS OF NORTHUMBRIA—CONTINUED.









THE GENEALOGY OF THE KINGS OF THE EAST-ANGLES.





THE GENEALOGY OF THE KINGS OF THE EAST-SAXONS.





THE GENEALOGY OF THE MERCIAN KINGS.




"These descendants of Woden appear to have reigned over the continental *Algein*, a name now limited to the territory between Flensburg and Slesvig. The sixth on the list, viz.: Offa (*Uppo*), the son of Wermund, was blind till his seventh, and dumb till his thirteenth year; and though excelling in bodily strength, was so simple and pusillanimous, that all hope that he would ever prove himself worthy of his station was abandoned. A resemblance to his Anglian ancestor in some or all of these respects seems to have induced the contemporaries of the young Winefrith (for such we are told was the original name of the great Mercian king), to call him a second Offa; though the author of the *Vita Offae II.* ap. *Matt. Paris* (edit. *Watts*), seems to have supposed that the first, or Anglian Offa, likewise ruled in England. *Creoda* was probably the founder of the English kingdom of Mercia. See a *Saga of the Anglian Offa* in *Beowulf*, p. 258 and 11 p. xxxii. sq. He is also celebrated in the tale of the *Scop* or *Bard Cod.* *Exon.* p. 320. See also *Lappenberg's England* 1 pp. 227, 228, and the places there cited."

THE GENEALOGY OF THE KINGS OF KENT.



Victoria, seventh Edward, and fifth George, the last.
