Thomas COOKE of Grays Inn Esq. needed £50 and being acquainted with one Philip EDEN Esq. who was a moneyed man and one that lent money, asked h.m. to lend him this sum. The plaintiff was to become bound with Thomas COOKE for payment in 6 months. The bond was entered into in lune 1640 for payment of £51 13. 4. the following November at Philip EDEN'S house in Fleet Street. In 1654 Thomas COOKE died, and in 1665 Philip EDEN also died and administration of his estate was committed to Anne, now the wife of John BUNCE. who having found the old bond among the paperson PhilipEDEN sued the plaittiff on it with the intention of making him unprepared. The plaintiff was werned of it by a friend, who saw his name in the Exigents Book when searching there for another name. The Plaintiffs son ordered an Attorney to appear notwithstanding to state that the debt had long since been settled by Thomas COKE who was a man of good estate, practised as Counsel and lived in Grave Inn long after the debt was contracted. Philip EDEN had never made a claim for payment until now although COOKE had been dead 12 years. The plaintiff by his son Richard DEREHAM and by his solicitor, Mr. Richard ABBOTT, appointed a meeting with John BUNCE and his attorney at a house called the Holein-the-Wall in Baldwins Gardens in the county of Middlesex, at which the plaintiff finally agreed a judgement and consented to enter bond for the payment of £60 to BUNCE on condition that the former bond be camcelled. The plaintiff being an old man and living four score miles from London was unwilling to undergo the rigours of the journey and of a lawsuit, more especially as he was credibly informed that Thomas COOKE died possessed of a personal estate of £2,000 at least which came to his wife as Exix. He felt confident he would be able to recover the principal out of Thomas COOKE'S estate. He trusted BUNCE to hand over the original Bond, since this was the only condition on which he had authorised his son and his solicitor to treat with the sd BUNCE. But BUNCE and his wife now refuse to hand over the Bond to be cancelled.

Answer of John BUNCE and Anne his wife 8 April 1667

They do not know whether the debt was Thomas COOKE'S own proper death they do not think he died in 1654, but think it was much earlier. Philip EDEN died in January 1643 and not in 1665. The defendant Anne was then a minor aged 10. Philip EDEN was her father and she came under the guardianship of Sir James BUNCE, John BUNCE'S father, who for his loyalty to King Charles was forced for many years to forsake this realmand live beyond the seas where he was denied the benefit of the laws of this land, which was the true cause of the bond being not put up in suit earlier. After the Restoration of King Charles II the bond was found uncancelled in the papers of the late Philip EDEN and being satisfied that the moneys due upon it had not been satisfied John BUNCE made several applications for payment. The plaintiff so far from denying that the debt had been settled tried to compel the defendant to accept a composition of £60 in spite of the fact that many years interest had not been paid and that the total due was by now much greater. In June 1665 John BUN-CE took upon him the administration of Philip EDEN'S estate and instructed his attorney Mr. HORSMANDEN to serve a writ on the plaintiff.
