BINNET SMITH and ROBERT VILLIAMSON. These all attended court from other parts of the country, as some met in BURCOMES. The first lawyer who actually lived in BUNCOMER COUNTY was HOBERT MERCET, who was admitted to practice at the JULY Term of Court in 1802. He was a native of LIE-COLF COUNTY and had a most interesting history.

MORE LAWYERS. The lawyers who were admitted and licensed to practice in the Courts of HOW MAKE after BORERT KENRY and between the year 1804 and up to 1812 were THOMAS BARROW, ISRAEL PICKERS, who afterwards was Governor of ALABAMA. Joseph Vilson, Joseph Carson, MORRET BURTOW, who was a Judge on the Bench, HENRY HARRISON, Senders Donoho, John C. Blliott, HENRY Y. WEEB, Touch Cox, JR., A. R. Buffin, and JOHN PAXTON, a Judge of some distinction.

JOHN BURTOW received a grant of land JULY 7. 1794, which he divided into town lots, thus giving the first start to what is now the CITY Hof ASHVILLE.

SAMUEL LUSK in 1795 bought Lot No. 13. COL. WILLIAM DAVIDSON bought Lot No. 21. JAMES DAVIDSON bought Lot No. 26. HUGH TATE bought half of Lot No. 13, from

the original purchaser, SAMUEL IUSK. JOHN PATRON bought Lot. No. 16. PATTON & ERVIN bought Lot. No. 4. This list, of course, constitutes an in complete list of the original purchasers of lots in what is now the City of Ashville.

PATTOM & MRWIM afterwards acquired an in terest in the BURNON property and sold off large numbers of the lots as the town gradually began to expand and grow.

MATHABUEL HARRISON received a lend grant from the State of North Carolina, No. 2926 to 100 acres of land on TURKEY CHEEK Jammary 3, 1831. Book 19 p. 347.

WILLIAM CASSADY sold WATHAFIEL EARRISON and others 100 acres on TURKEY CREEK in BURCOMER County, October 29, 1835. Book 21 page 496 of the Deed Records of BUNCOMBE COUNTY.

WILLIAM KING bought 100 acres of land on SANDY MUSE CHEEK from NATHANIEL HARRISON on April 2, 1811, in BUNCOMBE COUNTY. Book C. page 291 of BUNCOMBE COUNTY.

JERENIAR DAVIS bought 100 acres of land on SANUT MUSE CHEEK from MATHANIEL HARRISON March 10, 1819. Book 11, page 540.

PATRON & ERWIN, on May 5, 1807, bought 10 acres of land on a branch of CARET RIVER from JESSE HARRISON. Book A p 304 Deed Records of BUNCOMER COUNTY.

ASHEURN BALL bought 50 acres of land on BEE BRANCE in EUECOMES COUNTY, from THOMAS HARRISON November 31, 1806. Book I page 58, Deed Records of BUNCOMBE COUNTY.

JOHN PIRMONS, bought 100 acres of land from THOMAS HARRISON in BUNCOMBE COUNTY, December 1, 1806.

RICHARD STOCKTON'S WILL, written January 14, 1826, was recorded in BUNCOMBE COUNTY in Will Book 1 p. 74, in the month of FERRUARY in 1840. in which he mentions my daughter. MARY HARRISON.

M. H. GARRISON on March 7, 1838 sold 24 acres of land on CAMP BRANCH in BUNCOMBE COUN-TY, to NATHANIEL HARRISON. Book 21, page 170.

JAMES BLACK on August 12, 1826, sold LINE EARRISON STRACTOR of land on DEAVER'S BRANCE in BUNCOMBE COUNTY. Book 21, page 497. MATHABIEL HARRISON, Clerk of the Court.

REV. JOSEPH HARRISCH, ancestor of the HARRISCHS who figure in most of the above recorded deeds in BUNCOMEN COUNTY at about the time or a little after its formation, was a revolutionary soldier, and a contemporary of RICHARD GENTRY, AARON JOHNSON, WILLIAM RALDWIN, RICHARD JACKS and DAVID SMITS. Bev. Marrison was the minister of the historic old "THREE FORKS BAPTIST CHURCH" of Western North Carolina.

A revolutionary soldier's marker has been placed at his grave in the old TURKEY CHEEK Courying ground near LEIGESTER, a short distance from ASSVILLE, where he lived at the time of his death, on which the date of his birth is given as 1733 and his death as 1811.

The account of the marking of his grave declares that his wife was MARGARET HILL, who was the daughter of a s. C. revolutionary soldier. His descendents do not agree on a list of his children. We think they were probably:

ANSON COUNTY. It's ancestor is NEW HANOVER COUNTY, which was formed in 1728, from which BLAD-EN COUNTY was taken in 1734, and thereafter in 1749 ANSON was established out of a part of BLAD-IN, so that, genealogically speaking, NEW HANOVER was the grandfather of ANSON. For a period of FOUR years ANSON COUNTY comprehended all of the Western Part of the State, and except for claims of the Indians extended through Tennessee to the Mississippi River. Deeds or grants of land located in ANSON COUNTY between 1749 and 1753, otherwise not identified, may have been anywhere WIST of Wadesboro, the county seat in this day. ROWAN COUNTY was carved out of this huge area in 1753 & embraced approximately the Northern half of ANSON including SURRY, WILKES, IMEDELL and all that tier of counties; deeds, grants and other such instruments for the following NINE YEARS (1753 to 1762) labelled ANSON belonged somewhere in the area now covered from WADESBORO, West to the Tennessee line including Union, Meclenburg, Cabarrus, Lincoln, Gaston, Butherford and other counties farther on West. In 1762 both Mecklenburg and Tryon were established, but after SEVEN YEARS, Tryon was abelised and LINCOLN and RUTHERFORD in (1779) came into existence. Butherford was the BIG COUNTY and extended to Tennessee, while LINCOLN included only its present area and the new county of GASTON. All this to enable the reader to more clearly "place" records here cited from ANSON COUNTY, by a comparison of these dates. (Authority: Wheeler.).

The following items are taken from the records of ANSON COUNTY, N. C. on file at WADERBORD, the county seats

JAMES ARMSTRONG, will; dated May 11, 1760; he names his sons WILLIAM, JOHN, MARTIN, JAMES, JO -SEPH. BENJAMIN and MATTERNY (the last two his youngest sons) and denighter MARY ARMSTRONG. Children JAMES ARMSTRONG and daughter MARY his executors. CHARLES MOORE, JOHN RETTY (HEATTY) and JAMES PRICE, witnesses (Vol. 1, p.8). (It is likely these were the ARMSTRONGS who lived on the South Fark of the CATAMBA RIVER in what was then ANSON, but is now in either LINCOLN or GASTON).

JOSEPH MARTIN, will. Dated February 13, 1787. Names wife CATHERINE and children JESSE, MANCY and JOHN HAIL MARTIN (Book 1 p. 56.)

JOHN HICKS, will. Dated April 24, 1760. Wife OBEDIENCE HICKS: sons WILLIAM and JOHN HICKS, and daughters FRANCES and MARY HICKS; grand-daughter SARAH HICKS. Signed JOHN HICKS. Witnesses were ALEXANDER GORDON and WILLIAM HICKS (Book 1 p. 12)

HENRY ADCOCK, will. October 1802, Names his wife SUSANNAH, and children HENRY, JAMES, ELENDER, MANCY and JOHN ADCOCK. (Book 2 p 2).

THOMAS ADCOCK. April 8, 1823. Will names wife MARAH and children NOSMETY, MARY, DELILAH, FRANCES, MOURNING, BARSHERA, MATILDA and B. B. AD-000K (Book A. p 84).

WILLIAM LOVE, will. Dated May 7, 1753. Leaves all of his property to his father. Done in presence of ROBERT x LOVE and RENJAMIN x LOVE. Signed WILLIAM TOVE.

ANDREW HERRY (BARRY?) Inventory of his goods, chattels, rights and credits, by RICHARD BARRY, administrator. No date, but about the year 1765.

WILLIAM RATLIFF, will. Dated February 1777. Names wife SUSANNAH and children WIL LIAM, ZACHARIAR, THOMAS, JAMES, JOHN, HOHE CLOVEN RATLIFF and ELIZABETH CURTIS (Probal the wife of SAMUEL CURTIS); WILLIAM THOMAS and PHILEPON THOMAS executors, and THOMAS D SON, G. JEFFERSON and SAMUEL CURTIS witness (Book 1, p. 26).

STEPHEN VAUGHAN, will. Dated March 5, 1785. Mames wife MARY and children WILLIAM HARMON and SARAH VAUGHAN: Witnesses were JE EMIAH LEWIS and THOMAS LEWIS (Book 1).

JOHN McCLENDEN WILL. Dated April 9, 17 Children ANN, DENNIS, SAMUEL, RESECCA and S MON McCLENDEN (Book 1).

SAMPSON LANIER, will. Dated June 8, 1 Mentions his son JAMES LAWIER, and appoint BURWELL LANGER, WILLIAM LANGER and COL. JOH STOKES his executors. Witnesses were JOHR HINGS, BENJAMIN FELLY and JAMES B. PORTER (1 p. 70).

ROBERT McCORKALL. An inventory of his tate, July 23, 1757. Wife MARGARET is ment Inventory taken by JAMES MCCORKAIL, MARGARE M. McCORKALL and JAMES LINN, witnessed by J CROCKETT. (Book 1, p. 123).

SMITTS FIELDS. Vill. Dated March 15. 1 Hemes children JAMES, JOHN, MISAJAE, CELIA and ELIZABETH FIELDS. Signed SMITH X FIELD Witnesses were JOHN AULD, JOHN CASON, JAM LEGGETT. (Yol 2 p. 37).

SARAH JACKSON. Will in 1813. The wit es were JAMES COLEMAN, SR. and JAMES COLE

TOD ROBINSON, Clerk of ANSON in 1814.

HARDI, JAMES, EMIZABETH (FRANKLIN), DAVID, RICH-HARD and JEARC (DOM and daughters DUCY FAIR and CHARITY RUTNERCOM). Friends STEPHEN HYDE and JAMES MARSHALL executors; witnessed by ROBERT LIEF J. WATE, Mc DAVIDSON and JOHN SCOTT (Book 2, p. 118

JOHATHAN YARDOROUGH will. Dated March 6, 1811. Names one son William YARDOROUGH and a son in law JOHN CULPEPPER; witnesses ANY MAR—MALL and TEMPY COS (COES); recorded at the Occober session 1912. TOD ROBINSON, CLERK.

EARUEL MOORE and SARAH his wife convey to PATER CHUB, 250 acres on the South side of the CATAWRA RIVER, on both sides of KILLIAN'S CHEEK, between the lines of KILLIAN and HORRET LETPER, totober 19, 1763. Recorded in ANSON CCURTY Deed

GASTON COUNTY, through which KILLIAN'S CREEK runs; but at the date of the execution of the deed (1753) it was a part of ANSON COUNTY.)

DANIEL HILL left will in ANSON COUPTY in 1826. His wife was MARTHA HICKMAN, and the children named are SARAH, MAHY, MANCY, WILLIAM HICKMAN HILL, GHEEN HILL, MILDRED HILL, ELIZABETH, LUCINDA and SUSANNA SMITHERS HILL. (NOTE: WILLIAM HICKMAN HILL died in TEXAS in 1867, where he left namerous descendants, and ELIZABETH HILL married HENRY CLAYTON EWING of Nashville, Tenn.).

MATTHEW MOORE, of ANSON COURTY died before 1794 and left HERRY MOORE his heir, who employed JOSIAN DOEDS that year to recover a slave from JOHN REIK. (Book D-E p. 71).

SOME RECORDS FROM CASWELL COUNTY

CASWELL COUNTY - GENEALOGY. According to THEELER Casuell County is a descendant of two of the old original precincts, CRAVEN and BLADEN. In 1751, CRANGE, its immediate parent was formed From GRANVILLE, JOHNSTON and HLADEN. Edge combe and Johnston both came from CRAVEN, and GRANVILLE as taken also from Craven. From 1746 until 1751, FIVE YEARS, Caswell territory was a part of FRANVILLE, and after that until 1777, for 26 Tears it was a part of ORANGE until the Legisla-sive Act that established it as CASWELL. All instruments between 1751 and 1777 in the territoby that is now CASWELL bore the name of CRANCE, and for five years prior to that period GRAN-TILLE. The leading men of CASTELL in its earliest years was JAMES WILLIAMSON, COL. JOHN WIL -IAL'S (brother of JALES WILLIAMS, the gallant Efficer killed at King's Mountain during the revlution, the GRAVES, BURTONS, SHELTONS, LEAS, Luke Lea family of Tennessee) Marmaduko WILLIAMS DOMULUS SAUNDERS, RARTLETT YANGEY, the McAUSIS, BROWNS and KERRS, according to WHEELER'S records, Colly Payme Madison is said to have been born in ASUELL COUNTY. WADDY TATE, died leaving will in (1789) in which he mentions his wife AIN TATE and his hildren, without naming them. His wife ANN and riend TIME HARRIS Executors (W. B. B. p. 275).

JOHN LEWIS, SR. and JOHN LEWIS JR. indenure with SARAH TAYLOR the wife of PHILLIP TAY-OR, Witnessed by N. CUNNINGHAM. (Book A) 1790.

JAMES SANDERS and WILLIAM HUTSON execute an instrument in the form of an indenture on Karch 3, 1783, relating to the adoption of NA -HAN WINGFIELD, an orphan . (From Book A. p. 835. MATTERW DUTY died and left will in 1782 in which the name of his wife is not mentioned, or wher living. He named the following children: JUHYLETON, THOMAS, MARY, ANN, WILLIAM, SOLOMON and RICHARD DUTY (Will Book A, p. 215.)

HUNDHREY DONALDSON died leaving will in 1781 in which he mentions his wife LMRY, and his children WILLIAM, ANDEEM, ROBERT, EMETEZER and HUMPHHEY DONALDSON Will Book A. p. 144.)

JAMES WILLIAMS (This was evidently COL. JAMES WILLIAMS who fought and was killed in the battle of KING'S MOUNTAIN) left will dated in 1780 in which he named his wife MARY and his children DANIEL, JOSEPH, JOHN, ELIZABETH, MARY, SARAH, JAMES and WASHINGTON WILLIAMS (From W. Book A p. 113.)

HENNY WILLIAMS died and left will in 1796 in which he mentions the following children: DANIEL (m. ANN RIGE in 1786), JOSEPH, MATHAN, HENRY, ELIZABETH, MARY SLADE, NACHE, RICE, ELIZABETH, SUSANNAR, WESLEY DUKE PEOPLES, SALLY BROCKS and JANE WILLIAMS. (From W. B. B p.92).

SANUEL FARMER left will in CASWELL in 1779 (two years after the county had been organized) in which he names his wife CASSANDRA, and children DANIEL, WILLIAM, STEPHEM, HATHAN, RACHEL WILSON, MARY WILSON, SUSAYMA FARMER and ELLINER MCMAPON. Witnesses were RICHARD HOLMAN, WILLIAM DERNIS and SAMUEL HOLMAN. (From Will Book A. p. 234.)

JOHN WILLIAMS died and left will in 1805, in which he mentions his wife HETSY and his children DUKE WILLIAMS (Hon. Manmaduke Williams, M. C. at that time) BETSY GRAVES, and HEIRIETTA SIMPSON and her children. (From Will Book E p. 168.

MATHANIEL WILLIAMS, JR. died and left will in 1816 in which he mentions several children. (Will Book g p. 133).

NOAH COME, died leaving a will in CASWEIL COUNTY in 1808, in which he mentions his wife ELIZABETH and children EBENEZER, ELLUZER, IEVI, NATHAN, NOAH and NANCY PAGE (Will Book F p 3).

JEFFERON, JOHN, JAMES, HARGI ENOCH, MART EROWN and FRANCES McCAULET (Will Book P D. 188).

RICHARD WILLIAMS died leaving will in 1819 and named wife ELIZARETH and his children RICHARD WILLIAMS and ELIZARETH WILLIAMS; JOHN CRISERM to be Executor. The witnesses were R. POWELL and GEORGE COKER (Book R p. 205).

DIMIEL WEER left will dated AUS: 23, 1827, and mentions DANIEL WEER, grandson THOMAS JEN-FRESCH, grand-daughter ELIZA WEER, DANIEL DAYIS, my half-siter's son; JOSEP WEER and my grand-children ALEXARDER M. WEER, DANIEL JEFFERON WEER and MARY A. ELIZABETH WEER, Sons DANIEL WEER and JOSEPH WEER, Recentors, and the witnesses were RICHARD W., RAMBER and WILLIAM H. TREST (Book H. p. 409).

WILLIAM STEELE left will in CASWELL COURTY dated September 9, 1774; names wife ELIZARFIN a children JOHN STEELE, MARCHHET CILLESPIE and BONERT STEELE; witnesses were JAMES KERR and D. OSBORNE (Book A. p 168).

THOMAS STANS left will in CASTELL COUNTY dated Hovember 21, 1795, and names his wife CATE-RELIE and children WILLIAM, RILZARTE, THOMAS, ISAAC, AMS (wife of ABRAHM LAWRENCE), MARTHA, MARY, MATTHEW and JAMES SMARN; wife GATHERINE & ABRAHM LAWRENCE, RESCATORS. (Book D p. 27).

ANIRUW HARRISCH left will in CRANCE COUNTY, W. C. (In that part which in 1777 become CASWELL COUNTY) nemed wife JANE (DILLARD) and children WILLIAM, THOMAS, ANN (m. JUHLAW MOORE) MULIAN ELIZAMETH, MILDRED (m. WILLIAM MOORE) MOLITE, MARCY, JANE and ANDROW HARRISCH.

JAMES WILLIAMS left will in 1787 in CASWELL COUNTY and named wife ELIZABETH and children RES-JAMES, HEAL, MARY, LUCY, MATTHA and ELIZABETH MOCKE, a married daughter.

JOHN WALKER left will in CANWELL 1790 named wife RACHEL, and children THOMAS, BETSY, HENJAMIN, WILLIAM, POLLY and BARBARA WALKER.

SAMULE WAIRER left will CASWELL in 1798 and Remed wife HIGHER and children JAMES, JAME 1006 and ELIZABETH 1006, daughters.

WILLIAM WILLIAMS died leaving will in CAS-WELL COUNTY in 1786, naming TOBIAS, MARY, ACRES and OMMDIFACE WILLIAMS.

JOHN DOUGLAS, REQ. AND MARTIN COOPER, contract dated Jamuary 20, 1791 in CASFELL COURTY in which SOLOMON MARKUM, an orphan now four years eld is indentured to MARTIN COOPER to live after the manner of an apprentice. Witnessed by A. E. MURPHY. H. HARALDSON, Clerk of the Court for GASMELL COUNTY.

(89) RECEN STARCT. The account of the STARCT femily, beginning with RECEN, who was an early Sheriff of GRANVILLE COUNTY, begins on page 217, under the head of the "STARCY FAMILY OF GRANVILLE".

THE HAWKING MAMILY OF GRANVILLE COUNTY

(92) PHILEMON HAWKINS (See SHARCY MAP) must have been one of the earliest settle; who came down from VIRGISIA and located South of the ROANOUS RIVER as far West as the original Granville County territory. He was living in what afterwards became a part of old extinct BUT County, in 1754, when his distinguished son, COL, RESIANIE HAWKINS was born on August 15, 1756. The early records of YORK and GLOUCESTER Counties, Virginia, carry frequent reference to the name HAWKINS. It is a mere conjecture (but probably correct, at that) that he was the son of a COL, JOHN HAWKINS who lived in ESSEN COUNTY, Virginia, whither he had drifted northward with the WILLIAMS and other families, from GLOUCESTER and YORK COUNTIES. One writer has stated that he was born in GLOUCESTER COUNTY, Virginia, Sept. 28, 1717 and that he came to RORTH CAROLINA and settled when only twenty years of age, which would have been in 1737. One JUHN HAWKINS was in AIREMARLE FRECINCY and a Lord Deputy of the Province in 1707, with GOV. WILLIAM GLOVER (See p. 62 of this completed Volume), but as there does not appear anywhere among these earlier members of the Hawkins family, one named PHILEMON, it is unlikely that the GRANVILLE PHILEMON descended from that branch of the family, though I have no doubt they were of the same family or tribe.

He served in the Congress of the United States, and on the 21st of March, 1785, being them a member, he was appointed by Congress, a Commissioner, together with DANIEL CARROLL and WILLIAM FRENT to treat with the Cherokee Indians; the same year he was appointed by Congress with GRM. AMMENT PICKENS, JOSEPH MARTIN and LAUCHLIM MCINTOSH to negotiate with the CREEK INDIANS. These duties were performed, and in 1786 he was again elected to Congress. In 1789, with SAMUEL JURNSTON he was elected UNITED STATES SEMATOR from North Carolina. He served out his full term of six years in the United States Senate, after which Gen. 




