State of Kentucky - Christian County S.S.

1832

On this 3rd day of September 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the Justices of the Christian County Court now Sitting William Grey of Said County and State-aged Seventy Eight years past. Who being first duly Sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following Declarations in order to obtain the benefit of the act of the United States Congress passed the 7th June 1832 —

That he entered the Service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated ——

That he was born in the year 1754 — That he resided previous to his entering the Service in Wilks County & State of N. Carolina — That he entered the Militia Service as a private in Wilks County State of North Carolina he believed in the year 1775 as a Volunteer in a Regt of North Carolina troops Commanded by Martin Armstrong — Benjamin Cleveland Capt. Jesse Welton Lieut. and under the Command of Genl Rutherford. He first marched to Salisbury — and remained there this tour for which he Volunteered as three months expired — he did not Receive any written discharge —

He next entered the Service at the Same place soon after the Battle of Cross Creek by Governor Chaswell - under the Command of Ben Cleveland Capt in the Same Regt - he marched then to Cross Creek - where he remained guarding prisoners until this three months tour expired - Genl Rutherford was Commander in Chief - he Rec no written discharge —

The next tour of three months as Lieut under the command of Genl Rutherford in Col M Armstrongs Regt against the Cherokee Indians - We Rendevoused on the Catawba River and from thence marched to the Indian Nation - the Battle with the Indians was fought by the South Carolina troops we got there We beat them and then returned home —

The next tour I again Served as Lieut in the Same Regiment under Capt Cleveland and marched to the old fields on Watauga and our Company was stationed there to keep the Tories in Subjection — We then marched from the old field to Long Island on Holston - We remained there until Col Christian or Christy made the treaty with the Indians — and then we marched again to the old field and remained there some time before we were discharged & Suffered to go home —

The next tour again as Lieut I entered the Service in the same County under the Command of Capt Cleveland - just before the Battle of Kings Mountain - we first marched from thence to Cryders old fort we got there the 15th of Sept 1780 and remained

there a short time and from thence to the Cowpens where we joined headquarters under the Command of J. Shelby - Col. A. Campbell & Cleveland - We remained then but a short time I was in the fort and the Horse men went on and fought the Battle of Kings Mountain We marched on toward Kings Mountain and met Col's Shelby & Campbell returning with the prisoners this was in Oct 1780 —

We held a Court Martial & hung nine of the prisoners - eleven were condemned - We then heard that Col Tarlton was close by and marched from thence to Catawba River from thence to Moravian town - We then were suffered to return home --

The next tour I recd a letter from Col Martin Armstrong to hold an Election for Captain in my company - I done so and was Elected Captain in my own County Wilks — I then Recd orders from Col Armstrong and in pursuance thereof marched in a few days in pursuit of Col Roberts a Tory - We marched to Ramsaws or Ransels Mills - When we arrived a few days after the Battle with said Col Roberts & he was besten & his men dispersed - We then marched home —

That he resided in Christian County for about 25 years — He also states that he rendered other service which he has not stated as tours - that in all he served fully two years - 6 months of which was as a private — the Bal of the time a Lieut & Capt He never was properly commissioned — in writing — He hereby relinquishes every Claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of the agency of any State — Sworn to and Subscribed the day and year aforesaid —

In the name of God Amen - I William Gray of the County of Christian of Sound mind & Memory for which I thank God and knowing the uncertainties of life and being anxious to dispose of all my worldly estate - I give the same in the following marner that is to say my will is that all my lawful debts be paid out of the money thats on hand, my will is that my daughter Rebecca Gray keep and enjoy what she has that is Lettee and her increase to dispose of as she sees proper -My will is that my daughter Sally Gray keep and enjoy what she has that is to say Jemima and her increase to dispose of as she sees proper - My will is that my daughter Margaret Grav keep and enjoy her negro boy called Morgan to dispose of as she sees proper - My will is that my son Curtis Gray keep which he hath already received - My will is that my son Stephan Gray keep which he hath already received - My will is that my son Miles Gray have the sum of one hundred & seventy dollars made up to him - My will is that my son James Gray have and enjoy one regro boy called George - also my will is that my son James Gray have and enjoy the Plantation and tract of lend that I now live on - My will is that my son Russell Grey's heirs have the sum of four hundred dollars to be divided equally among them all - My will is that my daughter Polly Fruit's heirs have the sum of four hundred dollars to be divided equally among them all - My will is that my daughter Phenety Miller's heirs have the sum of four hundred dollars to be divided equally among them all - My will is that my daughter Martha Scott's heirs have the sum of two hundred dollars to be equally divided among them all - My will is that my daughter Elizabeth Fruit keep and enjoy what she hath elready received - My will is that my three daughters have and enjoy the tract of land that I bought of Richard Scott containing 350 acres by survey namely Rebecca, Sally and Margaret Gray for their benefit forever - My will is that all my stock of every kind, all my farming utensils my blacksmiths tools household and kitchen furniture be left on the place for the benefit of my 4 children that is to say namely Rebecca, James Sally and Margaret - Also my little waggon for their own benefit - My will is that my estate by eny means be diminished so that there should not be a sufficiency to make un my deceased Heirs the sums above mentioned that it be divided among them in proportion to my will so for as it holds out - My will is that my son-in-law Richard Scott have one dollar - My will is that my black woman Philliss be free from bondage and to live with who she desires - My will is that my negro boy called Squire go to my 2 daughters namely Sally & Margaret Gray for their benefit - My will is that if there is any overpluss left of my estate - that it be equally divided among all of my surviving children - Also my will is that my Executors have 2 years or more if they deem best to dispose of the belance of my estate which is not already disposed of after my decese. Last of all my will is that my 3 sons be the Executors of this my last will and testament that is Miles, Stephan and James Gray - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of December Year of 1840 - Signed and sealed in presence of


