United States of America this Indenture made this first day of October in the year one thousand Seven hundred & Ninety Six between John Anderson & William Shellion of the County of Sullivan of the one part & Matthias Creek of the County of Sullivan as aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the P, John Anderson & Wm Shellion for & unconsideration of the sum of one hundred & ten pounds Virginia money to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath & by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff & confirm unto the P, Matthias Creek his heirs & assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land containing Seventy two Acres be the same more or less lying & Being in the County of Sullivan being part of a tract joining Peter Morrison & granted to John Anderson & Wm Shellion Beginning at three poplars trees thence South 70 deg^r West 120 poles to a post tree thence South 106 poles to a gum & white oak thence North 70 deg^r East 120 poles to a hickory & white oak thence due North Course 106 poles to the Beginning including the plantation & improvement whereon the P, Matthias Creek now lives with all & singular the appurtenances whatsoever to the P, tract of land belonging or appertaining & the reversion & reversions rents & issues thereof & all the estate Right title property claim & demand of them the P, John Anderson & Wm Shellion their heirs of in & to the same & every part & parcel thereof either in law or equity to have & to hold the sd, seven by two acres of land with the appurtenances unto the P, Matthias Creek his heirs & assigns forever against the lawfull claim & demand of all and person or persons whatsoever shall & will warrant & forever defend by these presents in witness whereof the P, John Anderson & Wm Shellion hath hereunto set their hands & Seal the day & year above written, signed & sealed & delivered In the presents of us.
