Dear Walt:

At last I have arranged the Mary (Molly) Guyton information which you furnished, along with limited record I already had, in the format to be included in the genealogical listing which I have prepared. Enclosed are copies of the pages relating to this branch of the family. I shall appreciate your reviewing the information and advising me of corrections and/or additions that should be made.

I truly appreciate your sharing your records. There was such a wealth of additional data included that I decided to discontinue distribution on the listing which I had just completed, and revise it to include the enhanced Mary (Molly) Guyton line. Now, the only child of Joseph & Hannah for which I have only the barest of records is Sarah Guyton who married John Smith. My inquiries so far have developed very little additional data. If you know anything about this line, please let me know.

The data which follow in regard to Aaron Guyton were obtained from the papers in the claims for pension and bounty land under File No. W. 21237, based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

Aaron Guyton was born October 27, 1761, in Baltimore County, Maryland; the names of his parents are not shown.

*conjecture*

While residing in Ninety Six District, which was later known as Union District, South Carolina, Aaron Guyton volunteered in 1779, served one week as private in Captain Jeffers' company. He enlisted in March or April, 1779, served three months as private in Captain James Steen's company, Colonel Wafford's South Carolina regiment and was in the battle of Stone. He enlisted in 1780, served three months as private in Captain Moses Guyton's company (relationship to Aaron not shown), under Major Zac Bullock, and was discharged sometime in 1780, 1780. After the City of Charleston was taken by the British, he served under different officers including Colonels Brandon, Farr, Roebuck, Hease and White, until in December, 1780, when he went under Colonel Washington "of the cavalry" on an expedition against the Tories on Bush River in which engagement prisoners were taken, and many others killed or wounded. He was in the battle of Cowpens in Captain John Thompson's company; in the Siege of Ninety Six in Captain Montgomery's company, Colonel Pickens' regiment, in the battle of Eutaw Springs and continued to serve until "peace was made", amounting in all to not more than two years. All of his service was in the South Carolina troops and his name was borne on the military rolls as Aaron Guyton.

The soldier moved from Ninety Six District to York District, South Carolina where he lived four or five years, and in 1786 moved to Pendleton later known as Anderson District, South Carolina.



Aaron Guyton was allowed pension on his application executed October 1, 1833, while a resident of Anderson District, South Carolina. He died there June 30, 1841.

The soldier married October 8, 1789, in York District, South Carolina, Margaret McGurdy who was born December 2, 1773; the place of birth and names of her parents were not given. At the time of their marriage they were both residing in York District, South Carolina, and were married by soldier's brother-in-law, Abraham Smith, a magistrate.

Margaret Guyton, soldier's widow, was allowed pension on her application executed February 10, 1845, while residing in Anderson District, South Carolina.

Soldier's widow, Margaret, was granted one hundred sixty acres of bounty land, also, on account of his service, on Warrant No. 36605, under the Act of March 3, 1855. At that time she was still living in Anderson District, South Carolina.

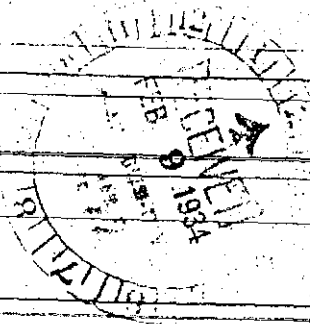
Soldier's brother, Joseph Guyton, born in 1776, was living in Union District, South Carolina, in 1845, where he was a member of the Baptist Church. In 1833, reference was made to soldier's nephew, William W. Guyton, whose post-office address in 1845 was Aiken, South Carolina; the names of William's parents were not designated.

In 1866, one C. Guyton witnessed the signature by mark of soldier's widow, Margaret Guyton, in Anderson District, South Carolina, his relationship to the family not shown.

If you desire information in regard to location of the land granted Margaret Guyton, widow of Aaron, you should apply to the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Interior Department, this city, and furnish that official the number of the warrant, the acreage and date of the act under which issued.

Aaron Guyton a resident of Anderson District  
and being duly sworn makes the following declara-  
tion, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of  
Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832. This deposition  
was born 27<sup>th</sup> October 1761. That he was engaged  
in the ~~war~~ of the Revolution war in the various  
grades under the following named Officers, viz:

In the Year 1779 he turned out volunteer under  
Capt. Jaffe, of Union District South Carolina he  
served not less than one week as a private against  
the Tories. In March or April 1779 he was drafted  
or called out under Capt. James Steen under Col. Maffers  
marched to Augusta & went on to Ogechy then returned  
into S.C. to join Genl. Lincoln, met Lincoln at Parker  
Ford on Edisto, continued with him till after the Battle  
at Stono 20<sup>th</sup> June. at this time Lieut. Bullock was Major of  
the Battalion, a few days after the Battle was discharged  
having served out the Term of Three months. In 1780  
I was drafted again for three months under Capt. Stone,  
Guyton. Maj. Lieut. Bullock we marched to a place  
called Chalk Hills near Savannah River how long we  
were there I do not recollect. we then crossed Savannah  
River at Augusta, we then joined General Wilkinson or  
his army in a few days we marched 3 or 4 miles further  
in Georgia we camped near Cuthberts Creek we were  
then under command of Genl. Williamson, we lay at  
this place till we were discharged and returned home  
some time in May - I was out this time not less than  
Three months, about this time Charlestown fell into the  
hands of the British & they established Forts throughout the  
State; I was under a great number of Officers, as many  
of the Officers & citizens took protection about this time  
I was under Col. Brandon who had a few Brave men  
who stood true for the cause of Liberty in the back part of the  
State who composed our little Army I was out the most of this  
some times we had 75 some times 150 men and some times  
we had 4 or 5 Co's with from 50 to 150 men - Each  
of them had command of a Regt. at home & some times not  
more than 50 of his men with him. The Col's were Brandon  
Garr, Robuck, White, - In December 1780

Genl. Morgan & Col. Washington of the Cavalry came out  
and took up Camp near Pocahontas River in winter  
with what few Militia was in our part I think the 1<sup>st</sup> or  
2<sup>d</sup> day he came I joined him. And hearing of 2 or 3 Torys  
in a body on the River Morgan detached Washington  
Horse & the Militia to dislodge them, the distance was about  
40 miles. We came on their Camp & killed & wounded  
numbers of them took many prisoners, and returned to Morgan's  
Camp. In a few days Morgan hearing of a detachment  
under Col. Tarleton coming on him and dreading to engage  
him so near Lord Cornwallis' Army, retreated two days  
up the Country to a place called the Cow Pen, at this  
time we had no Officer in our Company, only had a dozen  
or four men; and this morning before the Battle of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1781  
we joined Capt. John Thompson Comp<sup>y</sup>. We defeated, killed  
& took all except Tarleton & his light Horse prisoners.  
Tarleton let Cornwallis know how times was, who instantly  
pursued Morgan. A part of us and some Georgia refugees  
followed in the rear of Wallis' Army almost to the Cataw  
ba River, and we pushed up a good many of the stragglers  
in the rear of Cornwallis. About the last of January  
1781 I was out at this time not less than one month.  
Morgan this Army having retreated ~~from~~ <sup>out</sup> I state it was  
now almost Fire & faggot. Between Whig & Tory, who  
were contending for the ascendancy it continued so till  
the 15<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup> May, I was almost constantly out in  
many small engagements, some times we beat the Tories,  
some times they beat us. I was out this time at least three months.  
In May 1781 General Greene with his Army came into  
our country we joined him, I was under Capt. Montgomery at  
the time of Col. Brannon's Regt. Greene having in view at this time  
the Reduction of the British Garrison at 96. He laid Siege to it  
on the 22<sup>d</sup> May 1781. a large reinforcement was sent  
from Charleston under Lord Rawdon, who obliged Genl.  
Greene to raise the Siege on 19<sup>th</sup> June, when we were al-  
most in the arms of victory. We were one month at  
least in this service. About the 1<sup>st</sup> August 1781 we  
were called out under Col. Peckham, who was now promoted  
to Brig. Genl. under Major Jolly under Capt. Robt. <sup>officer</sup>  
gomery was marched down on Congaree river, joined some  
other Troops, then we afterwards marched to the Lord  
Tory we were there a day or two when joined by Genl.  
Greene's Army we marched the next morning and took Camp that  
night about 20 miles of the British & the next day, which was the 8<sup>th</sup>  
of September 1781 we fought the Battle of Eutaw Springs  
and in a day or two I was discharged this town I served  
not less than one month & a half. I returned from the  
Battle at Eutaw I was in no general Battle but was from that  
time till the British left Charley ton out often from 20 to 30  
days, at a time from 20 to 50 miles from home about 20

about two months, till peace was made. In all said  
certain I served over Two Years, I am unable to give the  
a more particular description, from the loss of memory & age  
all these years, I was a volunteer or drafted and  
I did all my services as a private. That I had no  
documentary Evidence and that I know of no persons  
whos testimony I can procure, who can testify to my  
services. (Except William Brauty and some who were  
in the Revolutionary War who believe from the facts stated

On this length day of February 1845 personally appeared before William Mitchell Judge of the Court of Ordinary for said District, Mrs. Margaret Gey, (widow of Aaron Geyton dead) a resident of the District and State aforesaid, aged seventy one years, the 2<sup>d</sup> December last, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the acts of Congress of 7<sup>th</sup> July 1838. 3<sup>d</sup> March 1843. and 17<sup>th</sup> June 1844. the first entitled "an act granting half pay and pension to certain widows" and the others in continuation thereof: That she is the widow of Aaron Geyton who was a private in the South Carolina line, in the War of the Revolution, that she was not married to him until after the war, and cannot therefore tell much of his services, she recollects however to have heard him speak of it often, but never took much interest in it, and therefore did not charge her memory with it; ~~He~~ ~~lives~~ at the time of his entering the service, in Union District in this State, and she thinks, states that he was in the Battle of Eutam Spring, she does not know how long he served, or whether he ever got a discharge, he however made proof before his death, and obtained a small Pension; by reference to the said proof much more can be seen, than she can possibly state.

she has in her possession the Certificate of Pension issued to her said husband under the act of Congress of 1832, and herewith submits it as evidence of his having drawn a Pension, and of her identity.

She further declares, that she was married to the said Aaron Guyton on the Sixth day of October seventeen hundred and eighty seven, as will more fully appear by the record of the family herewith sent, which was made by William Guyton a nephew of her said husband, under the direction of the said Aaron Guyton her said husband & himself, taken from an older record, on a slip of paper, which has become worn and defaced, and which is then buried, that the said family record has been kept in her care ever since and she deems it to be correct, that she lived at the time of marriage in York District in this State, that her maiden name was McLowry - that they lived in York until about 45 years ago, when they moved to where she now lives, which was then Pendleton, but now called Anderson District. That her husband, the aforesaid Aaron Guyton died on the thirtieth day of June eighteen hundred and forty one, as will more fully appear by the evidence herewith submitted; that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January seventeen hundred and ninety four, viz. at the time above stated.

They were married by Abram Smith Esq. who married a sister of her said husband.

Enclosed I send you a Power of Attorney to myself from Mrs Margaret Crayton a Revolutionary widow pensioner under Act 29 July 1848, authorizing me to prosecute her claim to an increase of pension, and the certificate of the Comdr. Tholles Genl. showing the amt paid to her husband in May 1786 for his services. The £56.4.3/4 "Sterling" or £393.10 "old Currency" ought to allow her a greater rate of pension per year than she receives, viz, \$31.<sup>66</sup>, for as the enclosed Comdr. Tholles' certificate shows that the pay of a private of Infantry was 10 shillings "old Currency" per day " " " " Cavalry " 20 " " " " " " and hence whether Aaron Crayton claimed & proved the one or the other Character of Service, the amt. stipend he rec<sup>d</sup> & now his widow receives, is not enough, because there are in £393.10 old Currency 7870 shillings, which divided by 20 shillings old Currency the pay of a horseman per day would give 393 days or 13 moe 1 day entitled to a pension of \$54.16 per annum - and the 1870

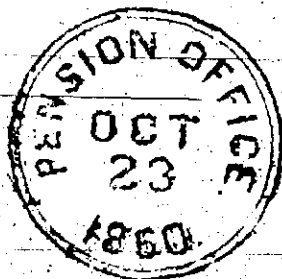


