Aaron Guyton was born Oct. 27, 1761 in Baltimore Co.,Md. He resided in 96 District, SC, later Union District, when he first volunteered in 1779 as a Private in Capt. Jeffries company. In March or April, 1779 he served three monthys as a Private in Capt. John Steen's Company, Col. Woffards SC Regiment and was in the BATTLE OF STONO.

He enlisted in 1780 for three months in Capt. Moses Guyton's company under Maj. Zac Bullock. From the capture of Charleston by the British he served under officers including Colonels Brandon, Farr, Roebuck, Hease and White until sometime in 1780 he went under Col. Washington's calvary on an expedition against the Tories on BUSH RIVER.

He served under Capt. James Thompson's company in the BATTLE OF COWPENS.

In the SIEGE OF 96, in Capt. Montgomery's company of Col. Pickens regiment, and in the BATTLE OF EUTAW SPRINGS, and served until peace was made.

After the war he moved from the 96 District to the York District for 4 or 5 years. In 1796 he moved to Pendleton (later Anderson) District, SC.

He died in Anderson District, SC June 30, 1841

He was granted a pension of \$31.66 per annum from March 1831, granted 24 Oct. 1833 c/o Geo Joseph at Gresham Falls P. O., SC.

After Charleston was taken by the British, which was in May, 1780, I was called out against the Tories. Col. Brandon of our Regiment was our commander. Moses Guyton Lieutenant of our Company we was about 80 or 100 men of us. We was between Fairfax and Tygar (?) Rivers. A Large body of Tories came on us commanded by Wilm Cunningham and defeated us with the loss of some killed and some taken prisoner. At this time the Tories over run our country. A few of us and some refugees from Georgia got together and sometimes pursued our enemy and sometimes tey drove us in. In this time I was out not less than six weeks before I returned home. Was often out in Scouts for the Tories, 1781 we was called out on Command and while out and in Feb. heard of a body of Tory's commanded by Major Lantrip camped at a widow Duggans near Bush River in Ninety Six District and came on them in the night killed and took some of them and defeatyed them at this time I was under the command of Col. Lease and Lieut. Guyton of our company. I was out not less than two weeks at this time. I was home but a few days and called out as a scout after the Torys at this time. I was under Adj. John Montgomery, we had not more than ten or twelve men with us and near to Fair Forrest we came on a few Tories not far from their camp. We killed one or tow and the rest made thei escape and for the want of more men we could not pursue them. and the rest made their escape and we returned home. I think I was out not more than one week at this time. I think the Lst of of Feb. or First of March we was called on pursuit of Torys and when about forty miles from home in Mobly's settlement b between Broad River and Salida we heard of Cunningham at the head of a body of Tories on Bull Swamp not far from the Congaree River. I think we had about 80 or 100 men at this time. I think Major Ben Jolly of our Regiment and Major Outerson was our commander Lieut. Moses Guyton of out company. We marched down to Bull Swamp in pursuit of the Tories and did not come up on them and returned home. I think I was out not less than fifteen days this time. Some time the last of March 1781 was called out in service of my country Col. Brannon was our commander of our Regiment and Capt. Robert Montgomery of our company. and after we was out some time on the Tygar and Enore Rivers after the Torys Brannon rec'd an Express from Gen'l Sumter to join him. Sumter lay at that time on the North side of the C Congare River opposite to the Congare fort which the British held at the time we marched down to join Sumter and crossed Saluda River at Widow Weavers in hopes to join Sumter and we were a few miles from the fort when we found we could not cross the Congaree to join Sumters army. We turned back an d recrossed Saluda and scouted through parts of Tory settlements and returned home. I was not out less than two or three weeks this time. Shortly after I got hom I think about the last of April 1781 was called on to serve one month tour about 25 miles from where I lived. Our men made what we call a block house on fair

as a sort of garrison to keep down the Torys and had men stationed to serve one month at a time. This month I was under command of Col. Bannon and Lieut. Moses Guyton of our company. During this month we was often out fifteen or twenty miles after Torys as required.
