I have to advise you ~~that~~ from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 5451 it appears that John Hawkins enlisted in Berkeley County, Virginia in September 1780 and served six months as private and artificer in Captain Culbert Anderson's Company, Colonel Lucas' Virginia Regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application awarded October 22, 1832 while a resident of Hampshire County, Virginia aged eighty-two years; date and place of birth not stated.

There ^{are} is no data on file as to his family.

The above noted is the only soldier named John Hawkins of Virginia found on the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau.

Carolina to headquarters near Lakeview hills, that
after he reached that location he was taken from
the ranks and performed the duty of an artificer
that he was present at the battle of Guilford
and having been one of the great with prisoners
in the most recent by Virginia. That the only
regular officers he knew were General Greene
I think one of his aids whom I would be mistaken
that he has no other evidence of his service other
than the annexed affidavit.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a
pension or bounty of any kind at the present, and declares
that his name is not on the pension roll of
the agency of any State
