BORDLEY, JOHN, serv., with 18 mos. to serve in 1742 inv. of Jonas Robinson (53).

BORDLEY, MARTHA, ind. for bast., March 1731 (29:225).

BORDSMAN, WILLIAM, orphan, age 13 next Nov., in June 1757 was bound to Robert and Susanna Mills (46:37).

BOREMAN, EDWARD, d. by 30 March 1706 when admin. bond was posted by John Landys and w. Catherine, with John Yates and John Parker (11). See also BOWMAN.

THE BORING FAMILY is the subject of a family genealogy by Edwin G. Hecklinger and Edwin C. Boring. (540).

BORING, JOHN (1), imm. to Md. by 1670 with dau. Ann; d. in Balto. Co. in 1690; may have m. three times; 1st to the unknown mother of Ann; 2nd to Margaret, wid. of Roger Sidwell; 3rd to Ann (?); surv. 50 a. Boring's Range in 1679 and 50 a. Boring's Pasture in 1682; his will, 2 May 1690 - 5 Aug. 1690, named "now wife" Ann, sons Thomas, James, and John (latter to be of age at 18); est. inv. Oct. 1690 by Thomas Long and Francis Watkins and val. at £ 332.11.4; est. admin. 16 May 1704 by Charles Merryman as the orig. exec., John Ferry, was dec. wid. Ann m. 2nd John Ferry; had iss.: ANN, b. by 1670; THOMAS; JAMES; JOHN, b. c.1682/3; MARY (2; 51; 59; 60; 101; 211; 388).

BORING, JAMES (2), s. of John (1), d. c.1738 in Balto. Co.; m. 1st by 4 March 1719 Jane, dau. and coheir of Daniel Welsh, and 2nd Rebecca, wid. of (?) Gain; she m. 3rd John Frazier; in 1719 with Jane conv. Welsh's Adventure to Otho Holland; leased pt. Blathia Cambria from Thomas Bladen in Dec. 1736, the lease to run for the lifetimes of himself, w. Rebecca, and dau. Ann; d. by 15 April 1738 when admin. bond was posted by Rebecca, with Charles and John Green; est. admin. 18 Oct. 1741 by Rebecca, now w. of J. Frazier; est. admin. again on 17 March 1742; had iss.: ANN, living in 1742 (3; 4; 11; 31; 61; 67; 68; 70).

BORING, THOMAS (3), s. of John (1), d. by 1723; admin. bond posted 6 May 1723 by James Boring; est. admin. 10 Dec. 1736; had iss.: THOMAS; JAMES; and MARY (2; 11; 31:100; 67).

BORING, JOHN (4), s. of John (1), was b. c.1683 and d. c.1750; m. 1st by 10 May 1707 Mary (?); m. 2nd Pretiosa (?) who d. 2 Feb. 1734; and m. 3rd Sarah (?) who d. 1763; in May 1707 he and Mary conv. pt. Jones' Inheritance to John Norton; in Jan. 1718 he and w. Pretiosa conv. 202 a. Selsed to Thomas Ford; gave age as 50 in 1732 and said his stepfather John Ferry was alive in 1693; in Jan. 1741 conv. 100 a. The Landing to son-in-law Dutton Lane; in Oct. 1749 conv. land to son John and grandsons William, Reuben (of Thomas), and John (of John); admin. bond posted 6 Oct. 1750 by admnx Sarah Boring; est. admin. 13 March 1751 and 15 Oct. 1751; in 1750 his heirs owned 100 a. Hall's Folly, 100 a. Hall's Discovery, 85 a. Knight's Addition, and 100 a. John's Favor; will of Sarah, 4 Oct. 1757 - 12 Sept. 1763, named Rev. Thomas Chase and Wm. Askew; had iss.: DINAH, m. Dutton Lane; JOHN; and THOMAS (5; 11; 59; 63; 67; 68; 70; 73; 74; 75; 76; 77; 78; 111; 153; 163:157).

BORING, THOMAS (5), s. of Thomas (3), d. test. in 1795; m. 1st, 21 Jan. 1730 Mary Haile (who d. 14 April 1734); m. 2nd Philizanna (?) (who d. 1801); had iss.: MARY, b. 4 April 1734, m. (?) Kelly (she may be the Mary Boring ind. for bast. in Nov. 1740); RUTH, b. 15 Dec. 1745; EZEKIEL, b. 1751; MILENDA, m. (?) Tracey (32:351; 114; 131; 133).

BORING, JAMES (6), s. of Thomas (3), d. c.1819 in Balto. Co. having m. Martha Wheeler on 25 Dec. 1736; Martha was dau. of Wm. Wheeler; in Aug. 1740 James and Martha conv. 100 a. of land to William Merryman; will of James, 15 Sept. 1807 - 29 Dec. 1819, named these ch.: JOSHUA (to have Green's Desire); ABRAHAM (to have Sportsman's Hall); JAMES, and RICHARD (to have jointly Upland and Meadow Ground); MARY, m. (?) Tipton; ELIZABETH, m. (?) Handle; and REBECCA, m. (?) Cullison (4; 133; 236:11).

BORING, JOHN (7), s. of John (4) and Pretiosa, d. by 1763; m. by March 1746 Avarilla (poss. dau. of Charles Robinson); in March John and Avarilla sold Richard Miller Cole part Boring's Gift, and w. Charles Merryman and w. Millicent conv. pt. of same land to Charles Ridgely; in 1750 as John Boreing II owned 50 a. Boreing Gift, 355 a. Boreing's Forest, and 100 a. Boring's Meadow; was d. by March 1763 when Avarilla Boring, wid., sold to Nicholas Britton her right of dower in 1/3 interest of Boring's Forest, Cuckoldmaker's Hazard, and Boring's Gift; Avarilla was alive in 1774; had iss.: JOHN, living Oct. 1748 when his grandfather conv. him land (79; 87; 153; 231:AL#I).

BORING, THOMAS (8), s. of John (4) and Pretiosa, d. by 1761, having m. 3 Feb. 1734 Elizabeth Welsh, who d. c.1785; in July 1736 Thomas and Elizabeth conv. Thomas' Purk to Charles Ridgely; in Feb. 1749 with bro. John conv. Sarah Boring (prob. their step-moth.) lots 17 and 18 in Balto. Town; will, 30 May 1752 - 11 May 1761, named s. James, w. Elizabeth, and s. Reuben; will of wid. Elizabeth, 20 Jan. 1773 - 21 July 1785, named iss.: WILLIAM, b. 19 Feb. 1735, d. 1811; JAMES; REUBEN; and URATH, m. John Frazier. (79; 80; 111; 113).

BORING, EZEKIEL (9), s. of Thomas (5) and Philizanna, was alive in Aug. 1794 when John and Sarah Boring conv. him 2 acres of Green's Chance; by May 1802 was in York Co., Penna. (231-WG#PP: 231-WG#71).

BORING, JOSHUA (10), s. of James (6) and Martha Wheeler, inher. Green's Chance from his father.

BORING, ABRAHAM (11), s. of James (6) and Martha, inher. land Sportsman's Hall from his father.

BORING, JAMES (12), s. of James (6) and Martha, with bro. Richard inher. parts of Upland and Meadow Ground from their father.

BORING, RICHARD (13), s. of James (6) and Martha, with bro. James inher. parts of Upland and Meadow Ground from their father.

BORING, JOHN (14), s. of John (7) and Avarilla, was conv. land by his grandfather John in Oct. 1749; m. Sarah (?), who in Aug. 1794 joined him conv. 2 acres Green's Chance to Ezekiel Boring, and 19 1/2 a. Green's Chance, 138 a. Green's Meadows, and 13 a. Anything at All to Georгу Koller of York Co., Penna.; may have had at least one son: JOSHUA, d. 1822 in Balto. Co. (80; 231-WG#PP).

BORING, WILLIAM (15), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz., b. 19 Feb. 1735, d. 1811; m. Martha (?) who d. c.1815; both left wills; in June 1765 William and Martha, and bro. Reuben and latter's w. Nancy conv. 10t 17 in Balto. Town to Mark Alexander; had iss.: THOMAS; JOSHUA; ELIZABETH, m. Henry Green; PETER; POLLY; JOSIAS; ANN; and GREENBURY (90; 118; 133; 153).

BORING, JAMES (16), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz.; not traced.

BORING, REUBEN (17), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz., in Oct.

CLARK, SAMUEL, b. c.1740, d. 21 April 1798; m. Sophia, dau. of George and Ann (Wilkinson) Harryman; a private in the Balto. Town 8th Co., 1st Batt'n, Md. forces under Capt. Samuel Smith; had iss.: WILLIAM, m. Dorcas Fitz; SAMUEL, m. Mary Lucas; ANN, b. c. 1770, m. Hezekiah Viers; and GEORGE (345; also Wilson M. Cary, chart of Harryman Fam., MHS).

CLARK, SARAH, in June 1709, named Robert Clark as the father of her child (21:43).

CLARKSON, ROBERT (1), d. c.1666; imm. by 1657, settled in A. A. Co., where he rep. that county in the Assembly, 1659/60; m. Milcah (?) who m. as her 2nd husb. Richard Hill; his will, 5 Dec. 1665 - 22 May 1666, named w. Milcah, s. Robert (to have 400 a. Horn Point), dau. Eliza (to have 400 a. South Centre on Patapsco R.), and dau. Mary, to have 200 a. on Todd's Creek; one dau. m. by 1674 John Brown of A. A. Co.; Robert and Milcah had iss.: ROBERT, d. c.1686; ELIZABETH, m. John Brown of A. A. Co.; MARY, m. 1st Thomas Francis, and 2nd Samuel Young (120:33; 206-1:180; 370).

CLARKSON, ROBERT (2), s. of Robert (1), d. c.1686; m. by 1683 Joanna, wid. of John Hillen, and dau. of Thomas Hooker; surv. several tracts of land in Balto. Co., incl. 600 a. Clarkson's Hope and Clarkson's Purchase, also 600 a., both in Sept. 1683; had iss.: MILCAH, m. 7 Oct. 1699 in A. A. Co., John Bowen, Jr.; on 8 June 1711 John and Milcah Bowen sold 200 a. of Clarkson's Purchase to Henry Wright (120:121, 128; 211:44, 45; 219-3).

CLARON, AGNES, serv. of Thomas Hatchman, d. Sept. 1726 (131:43/r).

CLARON, ELIZABETH, in Aug. 1744 bore a child to Charles Mulholland (35:320).

CLARY, JOHN, of Balto. Co., d. by 11 Aug. 1740; m. Mary (?); his will, 25 Feb. 1739/40 - 11 Aug. 1740, named bro. William Devorn, bro. William, w. Mary, and these ch.: VACHEL (to have Clary's Forest), and RUTH (127:93).

CLAWSON, JACOB, in July 1746 sold Thomas Sheredine 50 a. of Pleasant Valley (79:99).

CLAY, ELIZABETH, ind. for bast., in March 1743/4, and tried in June 1744 (35:154, 236).

CLEGATE, THOMAS, had four yrs. to serve, in 1749 inv. of Capt. Robert North (53:374).

CLEGG, JOHN, d. by 8 Nov. 1723 when admx. Ann Clegg posted admin. bond with Edward Hall and Bennett Garrett; est. inv. in 1725; Ann Clegg d. 24 Feb. 1743 (11:291; 52:169; 120:333).

CLEMENS, WILLIAM, m. by 10 April 1749 Ann, exlx. of Leonard Wheeler of Balto. Co. (5:84, 185, 267).

CLEMENTS, (?), m. by 29 Nov. 1769 Martha, dau. of Thomas Wheeler (112:171).

CLIBORN, MARY, ind. for bast., June 1732 (29:289).

CLINCH, THOMAS, in Balto. Co. by 1692 as a taxable in n. side of Patapsco Mund. (138).

CLOSE, GARRETT, ind. as the father of Susanna Simpson's child (21:210).

CLOWDER, JNO., lad, in the inv. of William Orrick, 2 Nov. 1720 (51:164).

COALE. See COLE.

COBB, JAMES (1), b. c.1651, was transp. to Md., c.1676, moved from Calvert Co. to Balto. Co. by Nov. 1721, when at age 70 he pet. the court to be levy free; prob. was the father of a son: JAMES, d. 12 March 1718 (13:625; 388; see Bibliography).

COBB, JAMES (2), prob. s. of James (1), d. 12 March 1718; m. 30 Oct. 1709 Rebecca wid. of Jas. Emson; admin. bond posted 8 Aug. 1722 by John Hawkins with John Hawkins, Jr., and Antil Deaver; est. admin. 12 July 1725, 1 Oct. 1734, and 22 July 1737; wid. Rebecca m. John Hawkins; had iss.: REBECCA, b. 26 March 1710; PRISCILLA, m. John White on 18 May 1726; FRANCES, m. Charles Jones on 26 Dec. 1727; CHARITY, b. 15 April 1712, as Christiana Cobb m. 2 Feb. 1728 Zachariah Spencer; MARGARET, b. 15 May 1714, m. Seaborn Tucker on 2 April 1730; JAMES, b. 16 Sept. 1716 (3:45, 155, 247; 11:297; 128:34, 35, 95; 129:255, 256, 257 ).

COBB, JAMES (3), son of James (2) and Rebecca, b. 16 Sept. 1718, m. 1st on 21 Jan. 1734 Ruth Kiledge, and 2nd, on 18 March 1741 Mary Poge; had iss.: (by 1st w.): JAMES, b. 27 Nov. 1735; JOSEPH, b. 4 Feb. 1737; (by 2nd w.): MARGARET, b. 25 Dec. 1742 (128:95; 129:326, 327; 133:153).

COCHRAN, THOMAS (1), m. Mary, and had iss.: ELLINOR, b. 7 Jan. 1736, and poss. THOMAS (133:53).

COCHRAN, THOMAS (2), s. of Thomas (1), dec., in March 1745/6 was bound to George Jones, joiner, to age 21; in Aug. 1746 was to be kept by Catherine Jones (35:801; 36:118).

COCHRAN, WILLIAM, d. by 20 Sept. 1740 when his est. was admin. by Alexander Black of A. A. Co. (4:62).

COCK, JOHN, was in Balto. Co. by Sept. 1668 when he conv. 200 a. Cock Crow Thrice to Bartlett Hendrickson; in March 1668/9 Hendrickson conv. him None So Good in Finland which he conv. to Edmund Webb in March 1668/9; in Sept. 1669 purch. land from Axell Still, and in Nov. 1669 purch. 100 a. on Back R. from Cornelius Pettersen; in Nov. 1671 he and Ann Cock and Andrew Peterson conv. William Ward 300 a. The Leney (95; 96:229; 97:126).

THE COCKEY FAMILY has been the subject of fuller treatments by Barnes and Newman (259:19-26; 358).

COCKEY, WILLIAM (1), progenitor, d. in A. A. Co. in 1697; as "William Cockey of Severn," m. 1st c.1668 in Som. Co., Md., Frances Vincent, and 2nd Sarah (?) who surv. him; in Oct. 1676 bought 100 a. Ball's Enlargement in Balto. Co. from William Ball; in April 1696 surveyed 300 a. Cockey's Trust; his will, 7 May 1698 - 21 May 1698, named daus. Elizabeth Hammond, Mary, Ann, Sarah, and sons Thomas and John; had iss.: THOMAS, b. c.1676, d. c.1737; ELIZABETH, b. c.1678, m. Col. William Hammond; MARY, b. c.1681; Capt. JOHN, b. c.1682/3; Capt. EDWARD, b. c.1685; ANN, b. c.1686; JOSHUA, d. by 8 March 1720; SARAH, b. c.1689; RICHARD, b. c.1691, m. Elizabeth (?); WILLIAM, d. by Oct. 1721 (101:301; 200-54:279; 259:19-20; 358).

COCKEY, THOMAS (2), s. of William (1) and Sarah, b. c.1676, d. c.1737; m. Elizabeth (Hammond) Moss, wid. of Rev. Richard Moss;

FRANCIS, HENRY, d. by c.1700 when one Harebottle held 200 a. Felks' Forest for his orphans (211).

FRANCIS, WILLIAM, servant, with 2 years to serve, was listed in the 1749 inventory of Capt. Robert North (53:377).

FRANKLAND. See FRANKLIN.

FRANKLIN/FRANKLAND, CHA., m. Hannah Harsh on 19 April 1756 (131).

FRANKLIN, JOSEPH, s. of Mary, was b. 22 May 1736; m. Eliz. Oakley on 15 Jan. 1756 (131; 133:57).

FRANKLIN, THOMAS, was b. c.1706, d. by 27 April 1787; imm. to Md. c.1728; m. 1st on 26 Oct. 1729 Ruth Wilmot; m. 2nd by 22 May 1744 Ruth, admx. of Pousley Ingram, and dau. of Charles Hammond; on 7 June 1732 conv. part Long Crandon to Joseph Perego, Jr., s. of Henry; by 1750 owned 100 a. Leew's Thicket, 100 a. Franklin's Delight and Ruth's Garden, 150 a. of Headingham in Buckingham, 88 a. Industry, and Ingram's Rush Neck; rep. Balto. Co. in the General Assembly, 1751 and 1752-53; at his death owned an est. of over E 1700.0.0 and over 2000 acres in Balto. Co.; had iss.: JAMES, b. 16 Jan. 1730; THOMAS HEATH, d. by 1794; BENJAMIN, d. by 1794; SARAH, m. (---) Smith; ELIZABETH, b. 1745, d. 1771, m. Aquila Paca (5:10; 73:239; 133:18, 149; 153:22; 370:54, 55, 328, 329).

FRANKS, MATHIAS, m. 26 Nov. 1750 Mary Morris (131).

FRAZIER, ALEXANDER, in Nov. 1719 was lic. to keep an ordinary at Whetstone Point; d. by 16 Aug. 1720 when admin. bond was posted by wid. Elizabeth Frazier, with George Walker and Thomas Taylor; est. inv. 5 Sept. 1720 by Lance Todd and John Ashman and val. at E 90.5.2; est. admin. 13 July 1721 by Eliza (1:297; 13:73; 23:244; 51:156).

FRAZIER, ELIZABETH, chose Benjamin Price as guardian in Nov. 1730 (29:50).

FRAZIER, JAMES, m. Eliza (---), and had iss.: JAMES, b. 17 March 1743 (131:104/r).

FRAZIER, JOHN (poss. s. of Alexander Frazier above), in 1729 was named as son-in-law in will of Richard Hewitt; in Nov. 1730 with cons. of moth. chose Benjamin Price as guardian; in March 1731 with consent of his mother was bound to John Steward; in 1750 owned 250 a. Todd's Forest and 35 a. Elizabeth's Diligence; 1st w. unknown; m. 2nd Eleanor (---); d. leaving a will, 7 March 1756 - 2 June 1756, which named w. Eleanor and ch.: Mary, Sarah, Alexander, and John and tracts Weston Run, Todd's Forest, Deep Point, Elizabeth's Diligence and Thompson's Forest; admin. bond posted by Eleanor Frazier on 14 June 1756 with John Wooden and Solomon Wooden; est. admin. by Eleanor on 26 July 1756 and 25 Feb. 1757; had iss.: MARY; SARAH; ALEXANDER; and JOHN (5:309, 324; 13:90; 29:50, 225; 111:94; 125:149; 153:73).

FRAZIER, JOHN, b. c.1713, gave his age as 50 on 29 Aug. 1763 and stated that 24 years previously he had m. Rebecca, wid. of James Boring; moved to the Island of New Providence, where his will, 23 Sept. 1779 - 27 Sept. 1784, proved in New York, named Eleanor and Charlotte Frazier, ch. of testator's dec. bro. Alexander Frazier of New Providence; the est. of his dec. father John Frazier of Md.; Susanna Towson, late wid. of his dec. bro.; mother Eleanor Frazier; Isaac Cox of Phila.; Martha, dau. of John and Susanna Green of New Providence, sis. Sarah w. of Mr. Hall of Md.; Nicholas Garner and Capt. Thomas Towson, both of New Providence, were to admin. the est. of his bro. Alexander; had iss.: RUTH, b. c.1740, m. John Osborn; ELIZABETH, b. c.1742, m. (---) Brown; JOHN, b. c.1744 (89:134; 112:553; Heckinger, Desc. of John Boring, in 540). R3

FREDERICK, JOHN, d. by 18 Oct. 1746 when admin. bond was posted by T. Shoredine with Parker Hall and John Hatton (13:87).

FREEBORN, RICHARD (1), m. Jane (---); lived at Catherington, Hampshire, Eng., where their ch. were born: THOMAS, bapt. 8 Dec. 1650; RICHARD, bapt. 6 July 1652; GILES, bapt. 23 Oct. 1654; JOHN bapt. 18 Feb. 1655; CLEMENT, bapt. 15 March 1657 (Freeborn entries in International Genealogy Index for Hampshire; Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints).

FREEBORN, THOMAS (2), s. of Richard (1) and Jane, bapt. 8 Dec. 1650 at Catherington; came to A. A. Co., by 1674; m. 1st Sarah (poss. Howard), and 2nd Rachel, wid. of Richard Kilbourne and dau. of Robert Proctor; came to Possess 268 a. Johnston Bed, orig. sur. April 1684 for John Johnston; also owned 150 a. Johnston's Rest; his will, 3 Jan. 1713 - 13 Jan. 1713, named dau. Sarah Samson, son Richard, daus. Jane Thomas and Priscilla and Ann Freeborn, and granddau. Freenater Thomas; had iss.: SARAH, d. 15 Nov. 1716, m. Jeremiah Sampson, shipmaster; RICHARD, d. Jan. 1718; JANE, m. 18 Jan. 1704 Robert Thomas; PRISCILLA, m. 8 Dec. 1720 Samuel Howell; ANN, m. David Thomas; ELIZABETH, m. 5 Dec. 1702 Garrett Garrettson; MARY, m. Thomas Tolley (122:257; 129:196; 200-35:24; 211:279; 313:119-122).

FREEBORNE, RICHARD (3), s. of Thomas (2), d. in Balto. Co. by 27 Jan. 1718 when admnx. Priscilla Freeborne posted admin. bond with John Cottrell and Thomas Lofton; est. admin. by extx. Priscilla now w. of Samuel Howell; est. inv. in 1719 by Thomas Cord and William Loney and val. at E 75.4.5; est. admin. 27 June 1721; dec. left no children (1:244, 260; 13:72; 51:148).

FREEBORN, JOHN, was listed in 1759 inv. of Davis Bissett as a servant (52:330).

FREELAND, GEORGE, m. Mary (---), and had iss.: STEPHEN, b. 14 Oct. 1710, d. 20 Dec. 1714; SARAH, age 2 on 15 Aug. 1715; PERDINE, b. 1 March 1715 (128:27, 34).

FREELAND, STEPHEN, was in Balto. Co. by 1659; m. Sarah (---) by whom he had iss.: GEORGE, b. 7 Oct. 1659; SARAH, b. 8 Aug. 1664; JOHN, b. 10 March 1668 (128:13, 15).

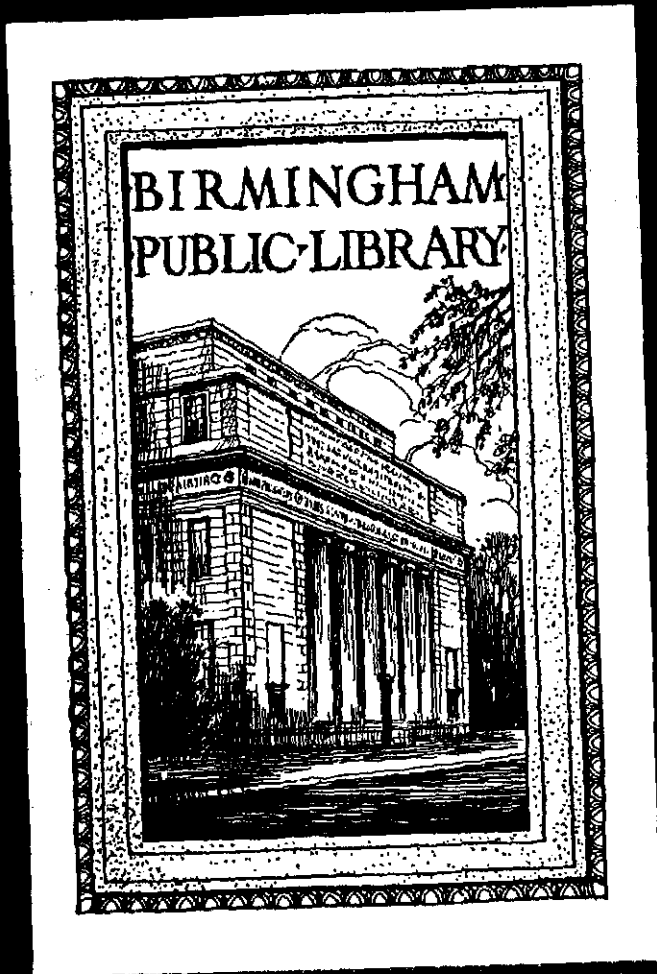

ST. THOMAS VESTRY PROCEEDINGS

January 4, 1747/8: John HAMILTON made a "present of a book" for entering the proceedings of the Vestry.

June 13, 1749: Nicholas DORSEY refused to serve as Vestryman by "reason he is not a free holder."

August 8, 1749: A summons was ordered for Charles MOTHERBY and Ann STRANGE to appear to give reasons why they cohabit together "Contrary to Law." On September 5 Charles and Ann appeared only to have their charge postponed and on that day a summons was ordered to be sent to William AMBRACE and Susanah HAGUE "both to appear as Evidences to Declare what they know of such things as they shall be asked Concerning Charles MOTHERBY and Ann STRANGE." Also on September 5 a summons was issued for James RICHARD, a late sheriff, to settle his accounts.

October 3, 1749: The Vestry "Proceeded to Admonish Charles MOTHERBY to put the aforesaid Ann STRANGE away . . . and [ordered] Ann STRANGE to Leave Charles MOTHERBY immediately and not to frequent his company any more as it suspected to be unlawful." William AMBROSS did not appear to testify in the case and was found in contempt of authority. Also on October 3, a warrant was taken out on William LEWIS, who had a warrant to serve on Dorney Buckler PARTRAGE for the "sum of one pound current money and never paid the Vestry the money nor brought PARTRAGE to justice."

December 5, 1749: Christopher RANDALL was chosen to act as Inspector for the ensuing year at the warehouse in Baltimore Town.

December 6, 1749: Charles MOTHERBY appeared as ordered and "still persists in obstinacy . . ." Ann STRANGE was ordered to appear, but did not.

February 20, 1750: The Charles MOTHERBY - Ann STRANGE case was dropped, "in as much as the said Charles MOTHERBY has put away the said Ann STRANGE before Court."

April 16, 1750: John HAWKINS was appointed to serve as Clerk.

May 1, 1750: Charles MOTHERBY and Ann STRANGE were presented again to the Court for unlawful cohabitating together as were John ROBERTS and Elizabeth BAKER.

September 4, 1750: George ASHMAN and John HAMILTON were chosen for the office of Inspectors for the coming year. Roger BOYCE, sheriff, was summoned to appear to settle accounts.

December 4, 1750: The vestry received a lock of John HAWKINS "which he put to the Vestry house Door" and "came Thomas BOND and begged a longer time for completing of the Church yard . . ."

May 7, 1751: Christopher RANDALL qualified as clerk for the next year and Samuel OWINGS was ordered to settle a final account with Roger BOYCE.

ST. THOMAS VESTRY PROCEEDINGS

June 11, 1751: It was "agreed to sell John HUDGE 81 pounds of tobacco at 22s/6 per hd. and gave an order for the sum on Major Thomas SHEREDINE Sher. accordingly." It was noted that Thomas BOND "put good Iron Hinges to every gate and Bolt or bolts to fasten the same sufficiently well, and put a new post-instead of one now broke and to Ram all such such posts that wants it."

September 3, 1751: The Rev. Mr. Thomas CRADOCK was excused for not appearing as he had gone to the funeral of the Rev. Mr. HENDERSON.

December 3, 1751: Tobias STANSBERRY would "Glase the Church windows."

May 5, 1752: Christopher RANDALL was chosen Sexton and included in his duties was to "provide a sufficient Quantity of water every Sunday."

July 7, 1752: John WILLMOTT failed to qualify as a Church Warden and he was fined "as Law Directs."

September 2, 1752: George ASHMAN was chosen as Inspector for the year. Jacob YOUNG was sold tobacco. William GIST agreed to repair the church pews for 7 years.

April 23, 1753: Thomas HUDGELL (HUDGLE) was appointed Sextant.

September 4, 1753: Cornelius HOWARD was "agreed to make and sett in the Church two Benches Eight foot long and two feet Broad with three posts and a Rail in the middle of each Bench . . ."

December 3, 1753: John HAMILTON was appointed as an additional inspector.

May 7, 1754: "Sold to Thomas WELLS eleven Hundred Eighty & Two pounds of Tobacco."

June 11, 1754: Samuel OWINGS was ordered to buy "for Vestry House a good plate stock lock." Sold Adam GOOSE 382 pounds of tobacco, Michael HUFF 520 pounds, John CARTER 900 pounds, Peter GOSNELL 114 pounds, Arthur CHENOWETH 1375 pounds, Joshua OWINGS 150 pounds, Jacob BARHOVER 561 pounds, George BRAMWELL 1500 pounds, Thomas HUDGLE 75 pounds, "all sold at 12/6 per Ct."

July 2, 1754: The benches of Cornelius HOWARD were received. William GIST agreed to "Tarr the Church and Vestry house twice with Tarr and Red paint by the Last of August." An order was given to Samuel OWINGS to call on "William YOUNG, Sher. for the Ballance Due from him."

June 10, 1755: George RISTEAU did not qualify to serve as church warden.

July 1, 1755: The Vestry agreed to send to England for a large Bible and two Common Prayer Books.
