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DARBY, LUKE (1), d. leaving a will, 20 Jan. 1742 - 2 March 1742, making his wife extx., naming a son Nathaniel, and leaving 40 a. called Darby to Philip Jones; in 1750 the wid. Darby owned pt. of Todd's Range and pt. Darby; had iss.: NATHANIEL (127:197; 153:36).

DARBY, NATHANIEL (2), s. of Luke (1), is prob. the Nathaniel who m. the widow Elizabeth Demitt on 10 April 1721, was ind. for assault and battery in Nov. 1724, but the bill was marked "Ignoramus;" had iss.: NATHANIEL, b. 16 Feb. 1732 (27:43; 133:2, 146).

DARBY, JOHN, m. 3 Dec. 1733 Alice Gay, and had iss.: DANIEL, b. 4 Aug. 1734; JAMES, b. 28 Jan. 1735/6; JOHN, b. 14 Dec. 1737 (133:17, 51, 57, 131).

DARBY, MARY, was ind. for bast. in Nov. 1745 and tried in March 1745/6; ind. for bast. again in Nov. 1746 (35:734, 809; 36:220).

DARLIN, JOHN, was in Balto. Co. by 1692 as a taxable in s. side Gunpowder Hund. (138:5).

DARLINGTON, WILLIAM, m. 4 June 1745 Ann Hind (133).

DARNAL, FRANCIS, m. 12 Sept. 1756 Margaret Hernley (131).

DARNAL, HENRY, in 1750 owned 2000 a. Land of Promise (153:100).

DARNALL, PHILIP, in 1750 owned 400 a. Hee Convenience, and 100 a. Hee Refuse, as well as 800 a. Rich Level (153:100).

DARTE, or DARFE, WILLIAM, was in Balto. Co. by 1692 as a taxable in s. side Patapsco Hund. (138).

DAUGH, BRIDGET, was the mother of: ELIZABETH, b. 31 March 1701, and OWEN, b. 11 Dec. 1710 (128:29).

DAUGH, WILLIAM, m. Ann (?); had iss.: WILLYALMAH, b. 7 March 1740 (131:88/r).

DAUGHADAY, JOHN, was in Balto. Co. by 25 Feb. 1754 when he bought 50 a. Panther's Ridge from Benjamin and Elizabeth Knight; in Nov. 1757 was tried for begetting a bast. on Sarah Taylor; in Oct. 1761 bought 50 a. Knight's Addition from Benjamin Long, and also bought 201 a. Daughaday's Purchase, being part of Chenoweth's Adventure from Richard and Keziah Chenoweth (44; 82:175; 85:337, 340).

DAUGHADAY, JOSEPH, b. 26. 12 mo., 1738, called bro. of Richard Daughaday, who was a cousin of Richard Taylor (136).

DAUGHADAY, RACHEL, b. 26, 10 mo., 1740, called sis. of Richard Daughaday, who was cousin to Richard Taylor (136).

DAUGHADAY, RICHARD, b. 28, 9 mo., 1736, called bro. of Joseph and Rachel Daughaday, was cousin of Richard Taylor (136).

DAUGHERTY, JOHN, age 15, with the consent of Margaret Wiley was bound to Samuel Collar in Oct. 1745 to learn the trade of Blacksmith in Oct. 1745 (78:331).

DAUGHERTY/DOUGHERTY, NATHANIEL, of Cecil Co., in Nov. 1729 conv. 94 a. Creek Plantation to Gregory Farmer (72:152).

DAUGHERTY/DOCHERTY/DOUGHERTY, WILLIAM, m. 2 Oct. 1737 Mary Bartle; in Nov. 1745 purchased Mary's Repose and Roberts Choice

from Amos Garrett, son and heir of Bennett Garrett; his will, 19 Aug. 1767 - 3 May 1768, named ch. George, Margaret, and Eleanor (each to have one shilling), William (to have all the land), and Usen (not yet 21); had iss.: GEORGE, b. 11 Oct. 1737; MARY, b. 28 March 1739; ELEANOR, b. 20 Dec. 1742; WILLIAM, b. 22 April 1745; UFAN, b. 25 June 1753; MARGARET (78:396; 112:85; 128:105; 129:328, 342, 365).

DAVICE. See DAVIS.

DAVID, BENJAMIN, age 15 on 11 Nov. 1739, in June 1739 was bound to Obadiah Pritchard; called s. of Elizabeth Evans (32:402).

DAVID, ELIZABETH, tried for bast. in Aug. 1725 (27:312).

DAVIDGE, HUDSON, m. Susanna (?); in Aug. 1747 conv. prop. to Jacob Lusby; had iss.: ELIZABETH, b. 29 Aug. (year not given) (79:530; 128:111).

DAVIDSON, PATRICK, d. by 1705 when his est. was inv. by William Eden and Jno. Wells and val. at £8.2.0 (48:67).

DAVIDSON, ROBERT, d. by 11 April 1763 when his est. was admin. by James Wood; est. also admin. on 29 July 1765; m. Elizabeth (?), and had iss.: ELIZABETH KEY, b. 30 Sept. 1760 (6:72, 150; 133:108).

DAVIES. See DAVIS.

DAVIS/DAVICE/DAVIES, ANN, servant to Joshua Merriken, pet. the court (23:212).

DAVIS, BENJAMIN, in March 1739/40 was exempt from the levy (32:149).

DAVIS, BENJAMIN, of Augusta Co., Va., in April 1750 conv. John Risteau 50 a. Benjamin's Prospect; Margaret Davis wit. the sale (80:424).

DAVIS, BENJAMIN, m. Mary (?) and had iss.: JOHN, b. 28 May 1754, and ELIZABETH, b. 26 May 1757 (129:360).

DAVIS, EDWARD, m. Susanna Cope on 4 June 1735 and had iss.: ESTHER, b. 25 April 1736 (133:57).

DAVIS, ELIZABETH, ind. for bast. in March 1724; m. Evan Miles on 24 July 1726; had iss.: BENJAMIN, b. 20 Jan. 1724/5 (27:127; 128:51).

DAVIS, GEORGE, m. Mary (?) and had iss.: BARTHOLOMEW, b. 25 Oct. 1714 (131:7).

DAVIS, HENRY, d. by 31 July 1714, leaving a will, 24 Dec. 1713-31 July 1714, left entire est. to his wife who was to be extx., named s. Henry (not yet 18), dau. (not yet 16); admin. bond was posted 31 July 1714 by extx. Ann Davis, with Peter Bond and Wm. Hamilton; est. inv. same day by latter two, and val. at £7.4.6; had iss.: HENRY, b. after 1695; dau., b. after 1697 (11:592; 48:215; 123:19).

DAVIS, HENRY, m. Sarah (?), and had iss.: DAVID, b. 6 Jan. 1734; HENRY, b. 2 Jan. 1730; JANE, b. 3 June 1733; MARY, b. 13 Oct. 1737; CHARLES, b. 23 Jan. 1739; ELEANOR, b. 5 May 1742 (128:89, 102, 108; 129:328).

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BORDLEY, JOHN, serv., with 18 mos. to serve in 1742 inv. of Jonas Robinson (53).

BORDLEY, MARTHA, ind. for bast., March 1731 (29:225).

BORDSMAN, WILLIAM, orphan, age 13 next Nov., in June 1757 was bound to Robert and Susanna Mills (46:37).

BOREMAN, EDWARD, d. by 30 March 1708 when admin. bond was posted by John Landys and w. Catherine, with John Yates and John Parker (11). See also BOWMAN.

THE BORING FAMILY is the subject of a family genealogy by Edwin G. Hecklinger and Edwin C. Boring. (540).

BORING, JOHN (1), imm. to Md. by 1670 with dau. Ann; d. in Balto. Co. in 1690; may have m. three times; 1st to the unknown mother of Ann; 2nd to Margaret, wid. of Roger Sidwell; 3rd to Ann (?); surv. 50 a. Boring's Range in 1679 and 50 a. Boring's Pasture in 1682; his will, 2 May 1690 - 5 Aug. 1690, named "now wife" Ann, sons Thomas, James, and John (latter to be of age at 18); est. inv. Oct. 1690 by Thomas Long and Francis Watkins and val. at E 332.11.4; est. admin. 16 May 1704 by Charles Merryman as the orig. exec., John Ferry, was dec.; wid. Ann m. 2nd John Ferry; had iss.: ANN, b. by 1670; THOMAS; JAMES; JOHN, b. c.1682/3; MARY (2; 51; 59; 60; 101; 211; 388).

BORING, JAMES (2), s. of John (1), d. c.1738 in Balto. Co.; m. 1st by 4 March 1719 Jane, dau. and coheir of Daniel Welsh, and 2nd Rebecca, wid. of (?) Gain; she m. 3rd John Frazier, in 1719 with Jane conv. Welsh's Adventure to Otho Holland; leased pt. Blathnia Cambria from Thomas Bladen in Dec. 1736, the lease to run for the lifetimes of himself, w. Rebecca, and dau. Ann; d. by 15 April 1738 when admin. bond was posted by Rebecca, with Charles and John Green; est. admin. 18 Oct. 1741 by Rebecca, now w. of J. Frazier; est. admin. again on 17 March 1742; had iss.: ANN, living in 1742 (3; 4; 11; 31; 61; 67; 68; 70).

BORING, THOMAS (3), s. of John (1), d. by 1723; admin. bond posted 6 May 1723 by James Boring; est. admin. 10 Dec. 1736; had iss.: THOMAS; JAMES; and MARY (2; 11; 31:100; 67).

BORING, JOHN (4), s. of John (1), was b. c.1683 and d. c.1750; m. 1st by 10 May 1707 Mary (?); m. 2nd Pretiosa (?) who d. 2 Feb. 1734; and m. 3rd Sarah (?) who d. 1763; in May 1707 he and Mary conv. pt. Jones' Inheritance to John Norton; in Jan. 1718 he and w. Pretiosa conv. 202 a. Selsed to Thomas Ford; gave age as 50 in 1732 and said his stepfather John Ferry was alive in 1693; in Jan. 1741 conv. 100 a. The Landing to son-in-law Dutton Lane; in Oct. 1749 conv. land to son John and grandsons William, Reuben (of Thomas), and John (of John); admin. bond posted 6 Oct. 1750 by admx Sarah Boring; est. admin. 13 March 1751 and 15 Oct. 1751; in 1750 his heirs owned 100 a. Hail's Folly, 100 a. Hail's Discovery, 85 a. Knight's Addition, and 100 a. John's Favor; will of Sarah, 4 Oct. 1757 - 12 Sept. 1763, named Rev. Thomas Chase and Wm. Askew; had iss.: DYNAH, m. Dutton Lane; JOHN; and THOMAS (5; 11; 59; 63; 67; 68; 70; 73; 74; 75; 76; 77; 78; 111; 153; 163:157).

BORING, THOMAS (5), s. of Thomas (3), d. test. in 1795; m. 1st, 21 Jan. 1730 Mary Halle (who d. 14 April 1734); m. 2nd Phillizanna (?) (who d. 1801); had iss.: MARY, b. 4 April 1734, m. (?) Kelly (she may be the Mary Boring ind. for bast. in Nov. 1740); RUTH, b. 15 Dec. 1745; EZEKIEL, b. 1751; MILENDA, m. (?) Tracey (32:351; 114; 131; 133).

BORING, JAMES (6), s. of Thomas (3), d. c.1819 in Balto. Co. having m. Martha Wheeler on 25 Dec. 1736; Martha was dau. of Wm. Wheeler; in Aug. 1740 James and Martha conv. 100 a. of land to William Merryman; will of James, 15 Sept. 1807 - 29 Dec. 1819, named these ch.: JOSHUA (to have Green's Desire); ABRAHAM (to have Sportsman's Hall); JAMES, and RICHARD (to have jointly Upland and Meadow Ground); MARY, m. (?) Tipton; ELIZABETH, m. (?) Handle; and REBECCA, m. (?) Cullison (4; 133; 236:11).

BORING, JOHN (7), s. of John (4) and Pretiosa, d. by 1763; m. by March 1746 Avarilla (poss. dau. of Charles Robinson); in March John and Avarilla sold Richard Miller Cole part Boring's Gift, and w. Charles Merryman and w. Millicent conv. pt. of same land to Charles Ridgely; in 1750 as John Boreing II owned 50 a. Boreing Gift, 355 a. Boreing's Forest, and 100 a. Boring's Meadow; was d. by March 1763 when Avarilla Boring, wid., sold to Nicholas Britton her right of dower in 1/3 interest of Boring's Forest, Cuckoldmaker's Hazard, and Boring's Gift; Avarilla was alive in 1774; had iss.: JOHN, living Oct. 1748 when his grandfather conv. him land (79; 87; 153; 231:AL#1).

BORING, THOMAS (8), s. of John (4) and Pretiosa, d. by 1761, having m. 3 Feb. 1734 Elizabeth Welsh, who d. c.1785; in July 1736 Thomas and Elizabeth conv. Thomas' Park to Charles Ridgely; in Feb. 1749 with bro. John conv. Sarah Boring (prob. their step-moth.) lots 17 and 18 in Balto. Town; will, 30 May 1752 - 11 May 1761, named s. James, w. Elizabeth, and s. Reuben; will of wid. Elizabeth, 20 Jan. 1773 - 21 July 1785, named iss.: WILLIAM, b. 19 Feb. 1735, d. 1811; JAMES; REUBEN; and URATH, m. John Frazier. (79; 80; 111; 113).

BORING, EZEKIEL (9), s. of Thomas (5) and Philizanna, was alive in Aug. 1794 when John and Sarah Boring conv. him 2 acres of Green's Chance; by May 1802 was in York Co., Penna. (231-WG#PP: 231-WG#71).

BORING, JOSHUA (10), s. of James (6) and Martha Wheeler, inher. Green's Chance from his father.

BORING, ABRAHAM (11), s. of James (6) and Martha, inher. land Sportsman's Hall from his father.

BORING, JAMES (12), s. of James (6) and Martha, with bro. Richard inher. parts of Upland and Meadow Ground from their father.

BORING, RICHARD (13), s. of James (6) and Martha, with bro. James inher. parts of Upland and Meadow Ground from their father.

BORING, JOHN (14), s. of John (7) and Avarilla, was conv. land by his grandfather John in Oct. 1749; m. Sarah (?), who in Aug. 1794 joined him conv. 2 acres Green's Chance to Ezekiel Boring, and 19 1/2 a. Green's Chance, 138 a. Green's Meadows, and 13 a. Anything at All to George Keller of York Co., Penna.; may have had at least one son: JOSHUA, d. 1822 in Balto. Co. (80; 231-WG#PP).

BORING, WILLIAM (15), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz., b. 19 Feb. 1735, d. 1811; m. Martha (?) who d. c.1815; both left wills; in June 1765 William and Martha, and bro. Reuben and latter's w. Nancy conv. 10t 17 in Balto. Town to Mark Alexander; had iss.: THOMAS; JOSHUA; ELIZABETH, m. Henry Green; PETER; POLLY; JOSIAS; ANN; and GREENBURY (90; 118; 133; 153).

BORING, JAMES (16), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz.; not traced.

BORING, REUBEN (17), s. of Thomas (8) and Eliz., in Oct.

The Lord Baron of Baltimore did grant at St. Mary's on 23 Jun 1680 to James Nuttall 300 acres in the woods on the west side of the Patuxent River called *Hatchet*; James Nuttall and his wife Margaret sold the land to Robert Skinner 8 Mar 1686; Robert Skinner gave the land to his 3rd son William Skinner and he sold 111 acres of the land to his brother, Clarke Skinner, for an unspecified amount of money; bounded by land Cornelius Cannaday sold Ignatius Craycroft

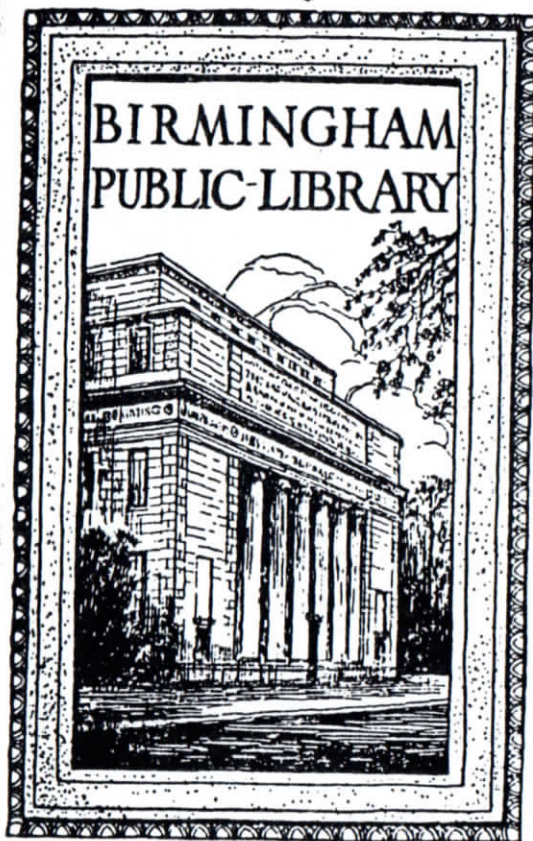
