Whereas David Ross late of the City of Richmond State of Va. departed life on 4 May 1817...having published his last will and testament ..did divide the residue of his estate among his four children Elizabeth Myers wf. of Jacob Myers, Amanda Duffield wf. of John Duffield, David Ross Jr. and Frederick Ross...equally to be divided among them....one tract being in what is termed the Island Flatts of the Holston River called the Fort place...another tract called Funk's place...another called the Pendleton and Taylor tract, by the lands of Thos. Titsworth and () Childress and Frederick and Daniel Branstetter...one called the furnace tract...several tracts sold to Jacob Myers. (Grantors: John and Amanda Duffield, Fred'k. A. Ross, Benj. Lewis) 5 Apr., 1820 (Bk. 9, p. 95)

An indenture made 7 Dec., 1820, between Hugh Berry of Washington Co., Va., and Joseph Mahaffey...land which was purchased from Stanton Pemberton as exr. of Estate of (blank) Offield by Abraham Bradley Hugh Mahaffey Hugh Berry Harvey King Moses McSpaddin and Isaac Baker....Wit.: Isaac DeBusk, John Berry, Moses Berry. (Bk. 10, p. 72)

"I, Stephen Moror...in consideration of the love and affection for my son Thomas Moyer (?)...give one negro man by name of Top, "but reserving the services of said Top for myself and my wf. during our natural life time." Feb. 7, 1808. Wit.: Wm. Blevins. (Editor's note: At the end of this document, where the seal is mentioned, the name is Moyers. See Bk. 4, p. 579, and see also the following abstract.)

"I, Stephen Majors (?)...for love and affection for my son Thomas..give 100 a., land where I now live, cattle, three bulls...My son Thomas Mayoires is to pay to my dau. Ann Hawkins, wf. of Henry Hawkins \$150.00...and Thomas is to maintain me and his mother during our life time in a decent like manner." Acknowledged at May session of court 1806. (See Bk. 4, p. 739. The old writing here looks like Majors, with never a dot on the "j." This deed, the one above, and the succeeding one are all given as for Majors in the county index. Editor)

Henry Hawkins and wf. Ann Hawkins of Grainger Co., descendant heirs of Stephen and Elizabeth Majors dec'd...relinquish for \$300.00 paid by Thomas Hawkins... their interest in and...of the land will (willed?) by John Cawood Senr dec'd late of Sullivan Co. Will (sic) to Elizabeth Majors and her heirs 100 a. part of the old patent belonging to John Cawood senr. decd....part of the plantation where Thomas Hawkins now lives on the N. bank of the Holston. Ann Hawkins was questioned in Grainger Co. by Jas. Moore and N. Jarnagin in 1818. (See Bk. 8, p. 95) Deed is dated Nov. 24, 1817.

XIV. John Hawkins of Tavistock, married Joan, daughter of William Amados (XV) of Launceston, and held lands under the corporation of Plymouth, where he probably lived. "All evidence" says the Dictionary of National Biography "points to the Hawkynses as being a Devonshire family settled for many generations at Tavistock." (Vol. 25, p. 227, under title William Hawkins) John Hawkins died before the year 1490.

XIII. William Hawkins (or Hawkyns) sea captain and merchant son of John Hawkyns of Tavistock was probably born at Plymouth. Feb. 1554/5 he is spoken of as recently deceased. He m. Joan, dau. of William Trelawney (XIV) and left issue: two sons, William (d. 1589) and John. Sir Francis Drake is sometimes spoken of as the nephew of Sir John Hawkyns. (See Dict. of Natl. Biog. Vol. 25, p. 228 and p. 229-230)

XII. Sir John Hawkins b. Plymouth 1532 m. ca 1559 Katherine, dau. of Benjamin Gonson, treasurer of the Navy, son of William Gonson, previous treasurer of the Navy, captain of the "Mary Grace" in 1513. (Dict. of Natl. Biog. 5:212-219, 223-225 Dame Katherine will dated 23 June 1591. He m. 2 Margaret, dau. of Charles Vaughan of Hergest Court in Hertfordshire. No issue by her. She died 1619.)

XI. Sir Richard Hawkins, only son of Sir John Hawkins by his first wife, Katherine Gonson (XII) b. 1561/2, captured by the Spanish in 1593, m. Judith _____. Issue: 4 daughters, son John and son Richard.

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X. John Hawkins, older son of Sir Richard, b. ca 1600 m. Hester. Issue: Robert d. 1644 in childhood; John b. 1639, d. 1642; John b. 1643.

IX. John Hawkins, b. 1643 m. Mary Dewe, daughter of Edward (X) son of Richard (XI) and Elizabeth Tesdale (XII) descendant of Thomas Tesdale, one of the founders of Pembroke College, Oxford. They had 14 children born 1671 to 1698. 2nd child: William Hawkins b. 1673 was a great criminal lawyer, author of "Treatise of the Pleas of the Crown."

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VIII. John Hawkins, younger son of John and Mary Dewe, b. ca 1680, emigrated to Virginia ca 1705, settled at St. Anne's Parish, Essex Co.

XVIII. William Trelawney at Trelawne in Cornwall before the Norman Conquest, conveyed land 1366 in the vill of Trelawne to his son.

XVII. Sir John Trelawney, knight, mar. Matilda, dau. of Robert Mynwenich (XVIII) living in 1406/7.
