EARLY EASTERN KENTUCKY SETTLERS

AARON STRATTON... "Aaron Stratton was one of the earliest permanent settlers in Lewis County. He owned a huge tract of land near the mouth of Kinniconick Creek, where part of the present day town of Garrison stands. It is assumed that he is buried in the family graveyard behind the Garrison Elementary School, although there is no gravestone. Stratton died in 1833, leaving the following heirs: Thompson N. Stratton, Lovina Calvert, Adelia Griffith, Mary Swearingen, Frances Smith, Mariah Garth, Sarah Kenyon, Eliza Griffith, and Matilda Griffith. See File No. 1947, Lewis County Lawsuits, John Griffith vs. T. N. Stratton and others." Salt Lick Creek and Its Salt Works, by William M. Talley, Kentucky Historical Society Register, April 1966.

RICHARD PITMAN... Born in 1753 in Lancaster County, Virginia, son of Thomas and Hannah Fielding Pitman. Married Lydia Briscoe Warren, born March 22, 1766, in Maryland. Their first son, Lot, born on a boat on the Potomac River, March 12, 1790. They moved to Woodford County, Ky., 1790 but removed to Laurel County in 1801. Ambrose Pitman, a brother, purchased 1600 acres of land in 1802 on Raccoon and Hazel Patch creeks. Issue of Richard were Elizabeth, m. Urich Christopher; Polly; Lot, m. Nellie Sharp Christopher, 1816; Louis Warren; Green; Jefferson; Lindsay; Martha; Amanda; Eliza; Holland, m. Elizabeth McNeill; Sallie; Patsey; Susanna, m. Thomas Green; Jane, m. Dave Bruster; Pamela, m. Fielding Pitman; Lawson, m. Eliza Pitman; Parthenia, m. Sevier; Lydia.

DAVID TRIMBLE... David Trimble (1760-1827) married Lucy Lacy, Greenbrier County, Virginia, now West Virginia, Aug. 28, 1781. Moved to Montgomery County, Ky. 1797, settled near Mt. Sterling. Eleven children: William, Mark, Polly, Nancy, John, Isaac, Lucinda, Louisa, Jane, Clark, Elizabeth. Louisa, Elizabeth and William later settled in Wolfe County, Ky.

ROBERT PING... Born Dec. 13, 1785, probably son of John Ping. Married Jemima Smith, October 2, 1805, Pulaski County, Ky. She was born Jan. 16, 1786. Both died at Willow Hill, Illinois. Robert died Oct. 6, 1858; she preceded him Sept. 30, 1855. Issue were Nancy, m. Tolbert Colier; William, m. Elizabeth Reid; Margaret, m. John Milton Woodall; John, m. Susannah Varley; Frances, m. Neriah Lewis; Elizabeth, m. Richard Hargis; Elisha, m. Lucretia Kuykendall; ~~Esa~~, m. Margaret Hawkins; Anderson S., m. Rachel C. Smith.

JOHN STAFFORD... Married Nancy Runyon, daughter of John Runyon, in Tazewell County, Va., May 10, 1803. Moved first to Lick Creek, Logan County, Virginia, now West Virginia. Later moved to Pike County, Ky. Died 1832. Issue were Sarah, m. Andrew Varney; Mary Ann, m. Randolph McCoy; John, m. Levisa Spratt; Compton, m. Eleanor McCoy; Parlina, m. John Sanson; Matilda, m. John Farley; Nancy, m. Daniel Scott; Flemons; Elizabeth.

JOHN JACKSON... "John Jackson and Mary Forest Hancock were issued the first marriage license in the new county of Madison, Jan. 15, 1786. Mary had come to Boonesboro with her father, Stephen Hancock, a member of Daniel Boone's party in 1775. John and Elizabeth, parents of John Jackson, followed shortly for their son Joe at the age of 17 was captured by the Indians in 1777. John Jackson and Mary Forest Hancock had nine known children: Jarvis (1788-18830, m. Fannie Coldwell; George, went to Missouri; Catherine Minerva, m. Goodman Oldham, went West; Hancock Lee, married Ursula Oldham; Lee; John, m. Mary Ann Scales; Humphrey Tunsil, m. 1888 Kattie Luker; Stephen Marshall, m. Minerva Moore." Contributed by Mrs. Daniel G.
