CORNELIUS HOLLIMAN - b. 1792 in Anson Co., N.C., and d. Oct. 26, 1862 in Marion Co. (Lamar Co.) Alabama. He was a Veteran of the War of 1812. He often spelled his name Cornelious Holiman. South Carolina Census of 1820 shows him residing in Lancaster Co., family composition: 2 male children under age 10 and one adult female (which was 1st wife). In 1830, Cornelius Holliman, along with Thomas Blakeney (son of Capt. James Blakeney), was named as one of the trustees of Old Zoar Church and Campground in Chesterfield Co., S. C. Cornelius sold some land in Lancaster Co., S.C. on Nov. 15, 1824 to Martin Plyler and is listed in the 1830 Census of Anson Co., N.C., with four sons and two daughters. In 1835 Cornelius and his two brothers Charles and Warren, traveled to Newtonville, Alabama, on horseback and spent the winter. Stories indicate they were on a hunting trip. In the Spring of 1836 they rode back to North Carolina and moved their families from Anson Co., N.C., to Fayette Co., Ala. All three Holliman brothers purchased land at Newtonville. Cornelius bought 40 acres formerly known as the Yerby Place. After Cornelius' first wife died he remarried and moved to northwest Fayette Co.

- m.1 Mary Elizabeth Plyler b. CA 1793 in Lancaster Co., S.C. She is presumably the daughter of Paul Plyler. She married Cornelius in 1813 Lancaster, S.C., They moved to Alabama in the early 1830s, and received a land grant in 1836 near Newtonville, Fayette Co., Ala. She died between 1836-39 and is buried at Springhill Baptist Church Cemetery near Moore's Bridge (in north Tuscaloosa Co.).
 - 06H01 ELIJAH A. HOLLIMAN b. ca. 1816 in S.C., m. Jemima Yerby in 1837 at Tuscaloosa, AL and moved to Texas. Elijah died in 1888 and is buried near Weston, Texas. 4 children. (see story and lineage)
 - 06H02 URIAH H. HOLLIMAN b. ca. 1817 in S.C., d. - 1862 in Okolona, Miss. while in CSA. m. - Mary Polly Lucas 1836 in Tuscaloosa County, Ala. - 13 children. (see story and lineage)
 - 06H03 DR. JOSHUA C. HOLLIMAN b. 1823 in S.C. d. ca 1902 in Garland Co., Arkansas (moved to Arkansas in 1867 and may have resided in Mississippi.) Became a doctor. married twice and had 13 children. (see story and lineage)

06H04 MARY HOLLIMAN - m. Jacob Sowels and moved to Texas

06H05 SARAH HOLLIMAN - moved with her brother to Arkansas.

- m.2 Elizabeth Lucas Rainswater m. Cornelius Holliman on June 23, 1839 in Fayette Co., Ala. Elizabeth Lucas Rainswater was the older sister of Uriah Holliman's wife. Cornelius and Elizabeth Rainswater, after marriage lived in north Fayette Co., near the Lamar County line. They had 80 acres in Fayette Co. and 10 acres in Marion (Lamar) Co. in the Blooming Grove and Webster beat.
- O5HO2 WARREN HOLLIMAN b. Dec. 26, 1801 in N.C. and d. Aug. 16, 1876. He came to Alabama with his brothers Cornelius and Charles. He later moved to Hot Springs, Arkansas around 1840.
 - m. Millie Walters in Anson Co., N.C. in 1825.

O5HO3 CHARLES HOLLIMAN - b. - CA 1794 d. - prior to 1850 in Newtonville, Fayette Co., Alabama. He came to Alabama with his brothers Cornelius and Warren. m. Barbara (called Barbary) ______. 11 children.

Descendants of Cornelius Holliman (05H01):

- O6HO2 URIAH H. HOLLIMAN b. 1817 in South Carolina d. 1862 in Okolona, Mississippi, while is the service of CSA. After the Battle of Shiloh a Confederate hospital was operated near Okolona for several month. Uriah and son Charles Daniel Holliman were hospitalized there for measles and both later died of pneumonia. They are buried in a nearby Confederate cemetery that has mostly "unknown dead" grave markers. Received a Land Grant in 1857 near Bluff, Alabama.
 - m. Mary Polly Lucas born January 2, 1819 in S.C., m. August 29, 1836 - d. July 6, 1913. Buried in Springhill Church Cemetery near Bluff, Alabama. A tombstone with the epitaph, "Pioneer Strength, Integrity, Human Kindness," marks the grave of Mary Lucas Holliman. She was fondly known as "Aunt Polly." During the illness of her son Dan and husband Uriah she traveled by horse and wagon from her home near Bluff, in Fayette Co., Ala., to the Confederate Hospital at Okolona, Mississippi to nurse them during their last days of illness and remained to bury them. She then drove home alone while suffering from the measles. She was a brave and resourceful woman. "Aunt Polly" was known far and wide as a practical nurse that was skilled in the use of native herbs, and was a noted midwife in her home area. A large number of the children born in her community during the war years and after were brought into this world by her. She made a standard charge of \$ 5.00 for which she handled the entire details of child birth delivery and waited on the mother and child for one week, cooking for the balance of the family. She made her "house calls" on her white mule with side-saddle, tending to the sick and afflicted as well. She was the daughter of Charles Daniel Lucas, an early settler at Newtonville, Ala. (circa 1820s).

Mary Polly Lucas Holliman (aka Aunt Polly) presided at the birth, and delivered five of the six sons of her son John Thomas Holliman. The sole exception being the youngest son, Ulysses S. Holliman.

 Infantry. Name spelled Holiman in C.S.A records.
 - m.1 Sarah E. Corbitt 3 children born of marriage m. Nov. 21, 1867. d. Sept. 18, 1872 from the effects of child birth. Their children included first, a daughter that died at age 4, then a son, William P. Holliman, who was born in 1870, and died in 1941, and another daughter that lived only one day.
 - m.2 Martha Jane Walker b. Nov. 14, 1846 near Shelby Springs, Shelby Co., Ala., m. Feb. 10, 1875., d. July 20, 1931 in Fayette Co., Alabama. Buried at Caines Ridge Baptist Church Cemetery. Five sons were born of this marriage. Martha Jane Walker was daughter of Samuel T. Walker and Elizabeth Johnston Walker, both born in Shelby Co., Ala.
- 07H06 Elijah Holliman b. 1846, Served in Company "I" of the 56th Alabama Partisan Rangers for the C.S.A., died at age 18 of typhoid fever at St. Mary's Hospital at LaGrange, Georgia, on July 10, 1864.
- 07H07 Nancy Palestine Holliman b. April 7, 1848
 d. Dec. 12, 1923, buried in Springhill Baptist
 Church Cemetery, near Bluff, in Fayette Co., Ala.
 m. John Pinion on Jan 24, 1881 and lived near
 Bluff, Ala., no children.

- 07H08 Cornelius Holliman m. Sarah Elizabeth "Sis" Smith and moved to Texas.
 8 children.
- 07H09 William Perry (Pee) Holliman m. Sarah Holliman (m.- his cousin), moved to Texas. 10 children.
- O7H10 Ann Holliman m. Rufus Buckner -moved to Alvoid, TX and later
 to Oklahoma.
 She had 1 child Daisy Buckner that married
 Jim Guyton and had 3 children.
- 07H11 Rebecca Holliman m. John T. "Black John" Holliman He was the son
 of Warren C. Holliman (06H06) and Mary "Polly"
 Blakeney (dau. of Thomas Blakeney and wife Sarah
 Roberts of Newtonville, Ala.)
 Rebecca and John T. Holliman settled near
 Ardmore, Oklahoma. Had large family.
- O7H12 Frances Holliman m.1 Abner McClung on May 1, 1873, which was the
 father of her two children, Ethel and Magnolia.
 Lived near Bluff. CA 1904 she left McClung and
 went to Eustace, TX where she had relatives.
 m.2 Joe Reynolds, no issue.
- O7H13 Joshua Warren "Bud" Holliman, b. Aug. 19, 1861, d. Jan. 6, 1944, He was the youngest of the thirteen children.
 - m. Martha Goolsby by which he had 6 sons and 5 daughters. Lived in Bluff and later settled in Vernon, Alabama.

O7HO3 James Franklin Holliman - b. Jan. 28, 1839 d. ca. 1911. First Lieutenant, Company "B" 58th
Alabama Infantry Regiment, C. S. A. He was company
clerk and was in the battle of Corinth and Shiloh
during his first enlistment and was in the battle of
Missionary Ridge and Chicamauga where he was captured
along with a large part of his Company by Federal
Forces, on November 25, 1863. In the charge of
Federal troops up the mountain side, the defense was
over run, disorganized and broken. He was held
prisoner at Johnson's Island in Lake Erie until
June 3, 1865, and upon the end of the Civil War he
was released from prison and returned home. After
the war he settled on 440 acres near Bluff where he
farmed and taught school.

- m.1 Rebecca Utley Stewart b. Oct. 26, 1829, d. Nov. 21, 1883, m.- July 2, 1865. (daughter of John and Ann Stewart). Buried in Stewart-Holliman Cemetery, Bluff, Ala. 4 children from marriage:
