As the Holliman family migrated southward from Virginia to the Carolinas and from there on to Georgia and Alabama, some continued the search for their destiny westward to Mississippi, Arkansas, Texas, Oklahomas and beyond. In this continuing story of the Hollimans we will examine the story of Warren Holliman (05H02). Warren, one of the three brothers that came to Alabama in 1836, initially settled on 80 acres of land located at the Old Shepherd Baptist Church at Newtonville. In the year 1840 Warren Holliman moved on to Arkansas. At some point he changed the spelling of Holliman to Holiman.

Warren Holiman (05H02) was born in Anson County North Carolina on December 26, 1801, and died August 16, 1876 at Prattsville, Grant County, Arkansas. Warren is buried in the Jacobs Cemetery there in Grant County. He was a brother to Cornelius (05H01) and Charles (05H03) Holliman as we previously mentioned in our story.

Warren Holliman (05H02) married Millie Walters in Anson County, North Carolina in 1825. Millie was born there in 1806 and is believed to be the daughter of Elijah Walters and wife Esther Holliman (05H04). Esther Holliman was an older sister of the forementioned brothers: Cornelius, Charles, and Warren Holliman. Thus, there were strong linkages between the Walters and Holliman families by marriage. It is believed the names "Elijah" and "Joshua" used in the Holliman line came from the Walters family. The Walters family settled on Dead Pine Creek in Anson County, North Carolina. The south line of their farm was the state line between North Carolina and South Carolina. Their neighbor, Warren Holliman, had his home in North Carolina and his barn in South Carolina.

Warren Holiman lived in Anson County, North Carolina, until spring of 1836, at which time he removed himself and family to the Newtonville area in Fayette County, Alabama. In 1840 he organized a wagon train of settlers that was comprised of many of the early families of Fayette and Tuscaloosa County. Family names such as, Ashcraft, Guin, Nall, Poe, Price, Shepherd, Yerby, Wilson, Wright and others that previously migrated from the Carolinas were represented in Warren Holiman's wagon train to Arkansas. Warren, serving as wagon master, was said to have had a cow and a horse hitched together to pull his wagon. He lead these settlers to a place about one-half mile west of where Trout Trail intersects the Old Military Road (known as Camden Trail today) which was located in what was at that time Saline County, Arkansas.

In 1840 when Warren Holiman and family found their new home in the Arkansas wilderness, they located near a flowing spring where wild game was plentiful since they depended on this for part of their food. The Warren Holiman house was located on a steep hill just above this free flowing spring which is still flowing today.


Warren Holiman proved himself to be a remarkable man, both witty and well educated. He was a leader and held firmly to his convictions. Warren never owned slaves, nor did he believe in slavery. In 1841, the next year after their arrival in Arkansas, he helped establish Liberty Church, known first as Lost Creek Meeting House. He was a postmaster at the Old Belfast Post Office. Warren served as Internal Improvement Commissioner of the State of Arkansas and served as a member of the Arkansas State Legislature. Politically, he was a Whig, but later he became a Republican.

Warren is believed to be the first Mason in what is now Grant County. On January 7, 1873, a lodge, the Adoniram # 288 F. & A. M. was organized on the Hicks Sugar Farm near Old Belfast Spring in Grant County. They met in the upper story of a big log store at Old Belfast and later moved to Sardis and from there to Mabelvale. Lodge records included the following officers and charter members:

Warren Holiman, Junior Warden Elijah Holiman, charter member Hiram Holiman, charter member Warren Holliman, along with W. G. Poe, some of the Halberts, Wilsons and some from what is now Shaw Township in Saline County, and possibly others, had made a map for a new county just prior to the Civil War. The boundaries were not the same as Grant County with the Liberty Community at the center of the county to be the county seat. They had chosen the name Anson for the county and Poe for the county seat. After the Civil War a Colonel Vance came to power. The county was named for a federal general and the county seat for another federal general. In 1870 Warren Holiman's land near Old Belfast became Grant County when the new county was formed from Jefferson, Saline, and Hot Springs Counties.

The spelling of the family name, Holiman, has been confused greatly. One example is the Old Belfast Memorial, the name Waven Holleman on the front as one of the early postmasters should be Warren Holiman. The mistake was made due to dim and faded records.

Warren Holliman had ten children. Four of the ten were born in North Carolina, two in Alabama, and four in Arkansas.



The Warren Holiman story that follows will provide more information about his lineage.

Warren served in the Legislature and on the Commission of Internal Improvements. He was the postmaster at Old Belfast Post Office. He and his wife are buried in the Jacobs Cemetery which is now in Grant Co., Arkansas. 10 children were born of their marriage.

 Roddy Corder but before the could marry he became
 ill and died. It is said that when "Aunt Suz"
 (as she was called) was asked why she never

 Suzanne is buried in the Jacobs Cemetery in
 Grant Co., Arkansas.

They caught the stage coach at this intersection and held together, cried, and said their goodbyes. Joshua Holiman served in the Confederate Army. He enlisted June 17, 1862 at Benton, Arkansas, and in September of 1862 he was wounded at Helena and sent home to recouperate. He later joined the Union Army. The family later moved to Sweet Home and from there to Sheridan, Arkansas, where they are buried in the Sheridan Cemetery. 10 children were born of this marriage.

Warren Holiman place which was one-half mile due

she worked a big eagle swooped down and got him
by his clothing and would have carried him away
had it not been for Nancy stricking the eagle
with a stick.

Elijah Holiman served the CSA, enlisting at Benton, Ark., July 9, 1861, Co. A, 11th Reg., discharged a year before end of War. His wife, Nancy, a brother-in-law, Benjamin Reynolds, who was living with her, and Elijah's father, Warren Holiman, went to Camp Hope at Old Austin above Little Rock and brought him back in a wagon on a feather bed because his condition was so fragile. He had measles and they believed he had consumption. He carried his discharge for a year in his pocket, fearful of being picked up as a deserter. Elijah and Nancy are buried in the Poe Cemetery.

The preceding information of the lineage of Warren Holiman (05H02) was accumulated by various relatives over a number of years. Some of these contributors are acknowledged as follows:

- (1) Mrs. Joyce Holiman Wiley, a descendant of Warren Holiman, received information from her mother that outlined Warren Holiman descendants. This information also described his journey with brothers Cornelius and Charles Holliman from Anson County - N.C., to Fayette County - Ala. It also described his journey from Newtonville, Alabama, to Grant County, Arkansas. Mrs. Joyce Holiman Wiley passed this information to Sarah Holliman Hatch (daughter of John Hall Holliman of Pleasant Grove, Ala.). Interestingly Sarah Holliman Hatch and Joyce Holiman Wiley met through their husbands that worked at a Colorado State Park on the Republican River. It is said they were close friends for ten years before they learned that they both had maiden names of Holliman. Since her husband's retirement Joyce Holiman Wiley now resides about twenty miles from the Colorado Line in West Kansas.
