FRANCES FULLER BAKER, Born 1843, Died December 31, 1863, Private, Company E. 28th Alabama Infantry, C.S.A. Wounded at Murfeesboro, found on the battlefield by his brother, Wm. Harvey H. Baker, who went for help. During his absence Frances was murdered by battlefield scavengers. He was an older brother of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. WILLIAM HARVEY MARRISON BAKER, known as "Uncle Tip". Born 8-4-1841, Died 9-25-1925 at Northport, Alabama. Private, Company "E" 17th Alabama Infantry C.S.A. Burial was at Greenwood Cemetery, Tuscaloosa, He was an older brother of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. Alabama. RICHARD JONES BAKER, oldest of the Baker children, born 9-3-1833, at Jonesboro, near Bessemer, Alabama. Died 3-17-1888, buried on his farm near Copeland's Ferry in Walker County, Alabama. He was a Private and Sargeant in Company H. 56th Alabama Partizan Rangers. Also at one time was Private Co. D, 13th Btn. Alabama Partizan Rangers, C.S.A. and 13th Btn. Alabama Cavalry. He was oldest brother of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. ALFORD NEWTON BAKER, Born 4-1-1835, died 12-28-1862 at his farm on Blackwater Creek, Walker County, Alabama. He died of Small Pox contracted while in C.S.A. at Chattanooga. Was furloughed home,

thinking he had malaria, but it developed into Small Pox. His entire family contracted desease. He died at home, and was buried in the side yard. Later the house was moved about 1 mile away, and still stands. Burial place is now Old Jones Cemeteryt. Grave marker made by his Father, Frances Richard Baker, still stands. Service record and military unit information not yet developed.

ISAAC MARION WHITNEY, "Uncle Marion", born 7-24-1830, died 8-6-1903 at his farm at Newtonville, Alabama, buried Old Shepherd Church Cem. Married Elizabeth A. Baker, oldest sister of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. She was born 7-2-1837, died 3-6-1916. He was a Private C.S.A. but service record and unit information not yet developed. His widow ** Confederate States Pension.

CALEB BURTON, Born 1838, Private C.S.A. Died in service at Salge of Vicksburg. Married Cynthia Lenora Baker, older sister of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. She was born in 1839. After his death she married Thomas W. Smith and eventually they settled near Lancaster, Arkansas. She had two children by Burton, and others by her second husband.

Wm. J. Hassell, born 5-27-1841 at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, died 5-13-1930 at his farm 5 Mi. N. of Fayette, Alabama, Married Lavinia Guyton Baker, a sister of my Grandfather, George W. Baker. Both buried at El Bethel Cemebery in Fayette County, Alabama. He was a Private in Company "K" of 20th Alabama Infantry C.S.A. Enlisted9-13-61, and surrendered at Salisbury, N.C. in May 1865 after Appearation.

SAMUEL TAYLOR WALKER, born in Shelby County, Alabama 11-11-21, son of Andrew Walker, Grandson of James Walker born 1765 in Penn. Enlisted at Fayette Court House 9-10-1862, discharged 4-9-1865 near Appamatiox. Buried next to his wife Elizabeth Johnston at Pilgrim's Rest Cemetery, 6 miles S. of Fayette, Alabama. His death was in or around 1900. His wife died in 1879. He was father of my grandmother Martha Jane Walker Holliman, wife of John Thomas Holliman. He was a Private in Company "Eye", 8th Alabama Regiment, C.S.A. (Gettysburg)

JAMES HOLLIMAN, Born May 25, 1750 in Johnston County, N.C. His home property later became a part of Wake County, when Johnston was divided. He was in Wake in 1790 census. Moved to Northern part of Lancaster County, S.C. 'up near state line' in 1793. 1800 Census showed him in Mecklinburg Co. N.C., 1810 census showed him in Chesterfield County, S.C. 1820 census showed him in Anson County, N.C. and 1830 Census showed him in Lancaster County, S.C. His pension application was#S-9590, granted 1833. Died May 7, 1836. Rev. War Soldier. I have his pension record. He was my great-great-great grandfather. Burial place unknown.

- JOHN THOMAS HOLLIMAN, born 4-23-1844, died 7-12-1930 at Fayette, Alabama, burial at Cains Ridge Cem. Recruited as Private in Company H, 41st Alabama Infantry, C.S.A. at age 18, on April 20, 1862. Surrendered at Petersburg, Virginia, with group on February 16, 1865, then supplied shoes & winter clothing and set to Camp Potter. Took oath of allegiance at City Point before U.S. Provo. Marshall, and paroled out to a farmer to work. Supplied Transportation to Holly Springs, Miss., and walked home from there after the war, arriving some months after surrender. Married 1st Sarah E. Corbett, one child, she died and he then married Martha Jane Walker, 4 children. During service he had smallpox at University of Alabama, and was in hospital at Louden, Tennessee for considerable time. He was my Grandfather.
- URIAH H. HOLLIMAN, Born about 1817 in Landaster County, S.C. died May 8th 1862 near Okalona, Mississippi, of measles-pneumonia, age 45 years, burial place unknown, Married Mary "Polly" Lucas, daughter of Charles Daniel Lucas at Tuscaloosa on 8-29-1836. She was neighborhood 'Herb Doctor' and mid-wife. Delivered large number of births during her careeb. He was a member of Company "B", 9th Alabama Batn of Volunteers, C.S.A. He was the son of Cornelius and Elizabeth Plyler Holliman, and my great grandfather.
- CHARLES CORPREIL (Americanized word for Corprelli), an italian emigrant, bown in Genoa, Italy, came to U.S.A. 1856, he was a stone mason by trade, enlisted in Confederate Army in Green County, Alabama on 12-28-1861, as Private in Company "B" 32mm and later 58th Alabama Regiments, C.S.A. Organization was Ambulance Corps. Married Sarah Jane Holliman, oldest sister of my Grandfather, John Thomas Holliman, moved to West, finally settled in Eustice, Texas where he died 7-3-1926. Burial at Cottonwood Cemetery, Eustice, Texas. Sarah J. Holliman was born 10-3-1840, and died 8-15-1915. He was brother-in-law of my Grandfather, John Thomas Holliman.
- JAMES FRANKLIN HOLLIMAN, "Uncle Jim", Teacher, Fayette County, Ala., born 1-28-1839, enlisted in C.S.A. in September 1861 at Fayette Court House, as Private in Co. B, 9th Infantry Batn. Remained there until after Battle of Shiloh then consolidated as 1st Lieutenant 17th Ala. Regt. to 11-3-63. Acting Captain 1864. Captured by Federals and imprisoned at Johnson's Island Prison, Lake Erie, Ohio, until 6-13-1865 and then paroled. His unit prior to capture had been sonsolidated to Co. "B" 56th Ala. Inf. Married 2 times, 1st to Rebecca Utley Stewart and 2nd to Bertha Lee Powell, and his burial place is Stewart-Holliman Cemetery, near Bluff in Fayette County, Ala. He was oldest brother of my Grandfathery John Thomas Holliman. He died in 1913.
- CORNELIUS HOLLIMAN, Born 9-25-1792in Lancaster County, S.C. Married 14. Elizabeth Plyler in 1813. Trustee of Old Zoar Church and Camp Ground (Methodist) in 1830, by Appointment of Captain John Blakeney. Location in Chesterfield County, S.C. near Dudley. Came to Fayette County, Alabama in 1835 with relatives, settled near Newtonville, where wife died. He then married Elizabeth Rainwater, a widow, and moved to North part of Fayette County, then Marion County. He owned NE% of NE% 29-17-12, and other lands totaling 100 acres at Newtonville. Had 5 known children by 1st marriage, none by 2nd. Became trustee of Springhill Baptist Church in Tusc. Co. Ala. in 1836. Died 1862 on his return from 2 year trip to Arkansas. Burial place unknown. Age 70 at death. He was a Private in Company commanded by Capt. John McNeal in War of 1812. Enlisted at Chesterfield Court House June 18, 1812 Discharged near Charleston S.C. October 20, 1812. He was my great-great grandfather.

- 15. CHARLES DANTEL HOLLIMAN, born 1843, died May 1862 of measles-pneumonia in C.S.A. near Okalona, Mississippi. Military Unit and service record not yet located. He was a brother of my Grandfather John Thomas Holliman. Burial place unknown. Large number of graves at Okalona marked "Unknown".
- 16. ELIJAH HOLLIMAN, born 1846, died in C.S.A. at Confederate Hospital at Newman, Georgia. Military unit and service record not yet located. He was brother of my Grandfather John Thomas Holliman. Burial place unknown.
- WILLIAM BLAKENEY, son of Thomas Blakeney at Newtonville, Alabama, born ca 1832 probabily in Fayette County, Alahama, mother Sarah Roberts, buried near negro school 2 mi west of Newtonville, He was 3rd Seargent Company B of the List Infantry, C.S.A. and died supposedly at Charleston, Tenn. of an illness. He was married twice, 1st to Elizabeth Corder, by whom he had 2 sons, then she died, and me married Elizabeth Clanton, by whom he had 2 daughters and 1 son. He enlisted 3-22-1862 at Fayette Court House for 3 years or the war. In Nov. & Dec. muster of 1863 shown in Hospital at Charleston, Tenn. No further record. Burial place unknown. His father, Thomas Blakeney of Newtonville, was a grandson of Captain John Hlakeney of Chesterfield County, S.C. a Revolutionary War soldier. William Blakeney was my great grandfather.
- JOHN BLAKENEY, Born 1732 at Mt. Blakeney in County Limerick, Ireland. came to America around 1750. Wife was Meg, otherwise unidentified. Settled in Northwest part of Chesterfield County, S.C., near Dudley. Was merchant and indian trader. Gave 15 acres of land as site for Old Zoar Church and camp ground. Named Cornelius Holliman as one of the trustees. This was in 1830. During Revolutionary War he was a Captain of troops in General Frances Marion's command. 2 of his sons also in the Rev. Army. Furnished many supplies and cattle to troops. Buried in Blakeney Cemetery near Dudley in Chesterfield County, S.C. Cemetery is owned by D.A.R. Chapter at Monroe, N.C. Has perpetual care. He was 100 years old at death on August 8th, 1832. He was my great-great-great-great grandfather.
