If they do not like to live with him, they may Choose to go to any of my family they may think best, and always to draw the aforesaid Interest, to keep them in Decent Cloathing till to appear abroad the principle Still to Continue with him. If my Son Andrew does not See fit to undertake the above property, and pay the above legatee the above Sums, then I allow, my Son Wm. to fall in to the place in every Respect. If he Will not take it then my Will and pleasure is that the named property be Sold by my Exors. Still Reserving all the property otherwise Bequeathed by me, and the Whole amount to be distributed amongst my Legatees agreeable to the above proportion.

If the above property be Sold, the Exors is to keep the above named four hundred Dollars nominated to Mathew and Sam^l. at Interest and pay as above, principal and interest as thier necessity may Require, if there be any over When they the have no more need I allow it to be disposed as above.

If my Wife sees Cause to move from here I allow her twenty Bushel of Corn yearly during her life
