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The Barbara (#507) Hallinan is probably the mother of Elijah age 44, Irish age 42 and possibly J.C. age 36, as well as Warren and even the Cornelius who is listed as born in N.C. His wife Malissa being at home during the daytime and born in N.C. Lerryl may well have given the wrong information. It is also possible that the census taker made a mistake. There are numerous mistakes in this Fayette Co. 1860 Census. I've found several in both my Askerast and Slater families.

The 1850 Census should give you the husband of Barbara unless he was already dead.

I don't have the 1850 Fayette Co. Census for Hallinans, as I was looking for a Hallinan who married an Askerast. It turned out that the Hallinan I was searching for married the daughter of John Martin Askerast who moved to Arkansas in the 1850s.

As you will notice, some of the names are spelled Hallinan, some Halliman. It is all the same name. The original name is spelled with a 'v' I believe.

There was another Warren Holliman in Fayette Co. He was older and is reported to have been the leader of the wagon train that left Fayette Co. Al. for Arkansas in the 1850's. One of my Ashcrafts, John Mastin, went with Warren Holliman.

The son of that Warren Holliman, George T. Holliman, married Sarah Catherine Ashcraft, daughter of John Mastin.

I have this line if you need it. A descendant of theirs is Bonnie Anderson of Klamath Falls, Oregon.

Bonnie Anderson says that they used only one L. after she checked up on it, when she noticed I used 2 L's, she found that the 2 L's was the original spelling. Her family had dropped one.

Cornelius Holliman got a land grant Mar. 26, 1858. It was # 36102 located in Township 175 south; Range 13 West; Section 36. the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ or N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$.

Warren Holliman got a land grant Nov. 26, 1858 # 37103. The N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35 Township 17 south; Range 13 West.
