1. James Nicholson Born, circa 1657 (?). Died, 1723, in Surry Co., VA.

A possible ancestor is Richard Nicholson who died 1669 in Isle of Wight
Co., VA. (W & D Book H p. 22 and 118) Mariable, his widow requested
administration Peb 9, 1669, recorded March 2, 1669, security Thomas H---- and
John Richards, and whose inventory of estate on Sept. 9, 1973 is given by
Mariabele Pullen, now the widow of Abraham Pullen, to the best of her memory.

The will of James Nicholson, Surry Co., VA., 1723 did not mention his daughter Elizabeth, who married John Egerton. It was very short, and left everything to his wife, Elizabeth and after her death, to his two sons. He had three daughters not mentioned in the will, all young at the time of his death.

He married Elizabeth Gray<sup>2</sup>, daughter of Capt. Francis Gray and Mary Unknown Surname. Born, circa 1659 (?), in Surry Co., VA. Died, 1767 (?), in Edgecomb Co., NC<sup>3</sup>.

Will of Elizabeth (Gray) (Nicholson) Andrews 24 April 1767, recorded in January Court 1768, ("Edgecomb County Wills - 1758-1830". C. R. 37.036, p. 14):

In the name of God, Amen - I Elizabeth Andrews of Edgecomb Co in the Province of North Carolina, being old and weake in body, but of perfect sens and sound mind and memory, for preventing any disputs (sic) amongst my Children about the Estate I may leave at my Death, do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner following, that is to say- IMPRIMIS - I give and bequeath to my three Daughters, Elizabeth, Mary, and Sarah all my wearing Cloathes to be equally divided between my said daughters, except one Blue and white striped cotton gound ( sic) and one white cotton pettycoat bordered with Callico, which said gound and petticoat I give to my Grand Daughter, Sarah Nicholson. ITEM - I give and Bequeath to my son Benjamin Nicholson, and to his Heirs forever (after my just debts and legacies are paid), all the Remainder of my Estate of what nature or kind soever or where so ever. ITEM - I nominate, constitute and appoint my said son Benjamin Nicholson my Whole and sole Executor of this My last Will and Testament, Revoking all former wills by me made and declaring this only to be my Last Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Twenty fourth Day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand, seven hundred, Sixty Seven. Elizabeth Andrews, her Mark in the presence of Samuel Tanner, his Mark, Pamela Nicholson, her mark, and James Gray.

For the Continuation of this line see the NICHOLSON FAMILY Children:

i. Elizabeth<sup>2</sup> Nicholson<sup>4</sup>. Born, circa 1702, in Surry Co., VA. Died, after 1779, in Granville Co., NC. She married John Egerton Jr.<sup>5</sup>, son of John Egerton Sr. and Rachel Wilmot, 27 Nov 1726, in Surry Co., VA.

In 1779 Elizabeth Egerton, Wilmot Egerton, and Elizabeth Egerton, Jr., petitioned, which was rejected. (Clark's Colonial Records Vol. 4, p. 759.).
