Sarah (?), bapt. 1706 aged 20 in St. Ann's Par., A. A. Co.; she m. as her 2nd husb. Charles Wells by 3 June 1726; will of Anthony, 20 July 1721 - 9 Oct. 1721, nmd. w. Sarah, ch. William, Joseph, John, and Anthony, all to be of age at 18, dau. Mary to be of age at 16, and an unborn ch.; admin bond posted 9 Dec. 1721, extx. Sarah with Patrick Murphy and Thomas Taylor; est. admin. by Sarah now w. of Charles Wells on 3 June 1726; had iss.: WILLIAM; MARY; JOSEPH; HENRY, bapt. 23 (?) 1708 in St. Ann's Par.; JOHN, bapt. 27 March 1709; ANTHONY, bapt. 1 Oct. 1716; poss. unborn ch. (3; 11; 124:74; 133: 219-2).

ARNOLD, JOSEPH (3), s. of Anthony (2) and Sarah, d. in Fred. Co., Md., in 1757, having m. Susanna Chapman on 20 July 1736; in 1750 owned 50 a. Pleasant Level; his will, 3 Aug. 1757 - 30 Sept. 1757, named w. Susanna, tract Arnold's Harbor (owned by his bro. Anthony in 1750) and the following ch.: BENJAMIN, b. 21 Aug. 1736; JOSEPH, b. c.1744; GREENBURY; ELIZABETH; RACHEL; PATIENCE; and SUSANNA (133; 153; 210-10:377).

ARNOLD, ANTHONY (4), s. of Anthony (2) and Sarah, bapt. 1 Oct. 1716 in St. Ann's Par., A. A. Co.; d. in Fred. Co., by 27 Sept. 1792; m. Margaret (?) by 19 June 1742 when she joined him in conveying 50 a. Arnold's Chance to William Cole; in 1750 owned 20 a. Arnold's Harbour or Arbour; conv. said tract to bro. Joseph in 1752; will of Anthony Arnold, 13 Aug. 1792 - 27 Sept. 1792, named these ch.: ANN; SAMUEL ARCHIBALD; ANTHONY; JOHN; CATHERINE; WILLIAM; and JOSEPH (81; 153; Fred. Co. Wills, GM#2. p. 453).

ARNOLD, THOMAS, m. Sarah Smith on 15 Sept. 1742 and had iss.: WILLIAM, b. 13 Sept. 1743 (129).

ARNOLD, WILLIAM, adm. pat. of Mary Tregill's ch. in June 1746 (36:5).

ARNOLD, WILLIAM, m. Sarah (?) and had iss.: WILLIAM, b. 24 March 1746; JOSEPH, b. 3 April 1754 (129).

ARNOLD, WILLIAM, m. Elizabeth Gilbert on 23 Nov. 1722 and had iss.: THOMAS, b. 10 Dec. 1723; WILLIAM, b. 5 July 1726; MARY, b. Dec. 1730; JOHANNA, b. 22 Dec. 1732; SARAH, b. 20 June 1735; ELIZABETH, b. 4 March 1737; FANNY, b. 9 April 1740; MARTHA, b. 20 Aug. 1742 (128:45, 47, 68, 89, 100, 113: 129).

ARNOLD, WILLIAM, m. Comfort Courtney on 10 July 1747; had iss.: EPHRAIM, b. 22 Oct. 1752 (129).

ARNOLD, WILLIAM, in 1750 owned 100 a. part Hammond's Hope; another William in 1750 owned 100 a. Hammond's Richland; another William in 1750 owned 50 a. part The Division (153).

ARUNDEL, or ARRINDELE, JOHN, age 6 in March 1724/5 was bound to Thomas Wright by John's father William Ingle, to age 21 (27: 128).

ARUNDEL, WILLIAM, b. 20 June 1719 (no parents named) (133).

ASELWORTHY, CHARLES JOHN, m. Blanche (?) and had iss.: LINNAH, b. 21 Oct. 1757 (129).

ASHBURN, JOHN, serv. of James Todd, assigned to William Wilkinson on 15 June 1703 (66:283).

ASHBY, WILLIAM, was in Balto. Co. by 1692 as a taxable in Spesutia Hund. (138).

ASHEE, JOHN, petitioned the court in March 1721/2 that he had entered Md. in the Cone of Bristol, Capt. Neale commander, as a serv. to sd Neale; was cheated of his indenture, and sold as a serv. in Md. for 5 years (18:11).

ASHER, ANTHONY, was in Balto. Co. by 1727 and d. there by 15 Oct. 1764; m. Susanna (?) who survived him; admin. the est. of Jacob Grove in Feb. 1752; in 1750 owned 220 a. Asher's Purchase; his will, Aug. 1764 - 15 Oct. 1764, named w. Susannah, sons Anthony and Abraham, and tract Asher's Purchase; had iss.: SARAH, b. 6 July 1727, prob. the Sarah who m. Daniel Nusewonden on 4 Nov. 1761; ANTHONY, b. 2 July 1732, m. Sarah Beven on 19 Dec. 1749; ANNE, b. 21 Sept. 1735, m. James Robeson on 7 June 1752; RACHEL, b. 20 Sept. 1737, m. Joseph Beven on 15 Jan. 1754; ELIZABETH, b. 31 Dec. 1742; ABRAHAM, b. 29 Feb. 1744; ANTHONY (3; 111; 131; 153).

ASHER, MARY, m. Samuel Wilkinson on 14 April 1748 (131).

ASHES, JOHN, conv. Shaw's Choice by Christopher and Elizabeth Shaw; d. by 20 Oct. 1692 when admin. bond was posted by Christopher Shaw with Roland Thornbury and Edw'd Baxter (11; 59:211).

ASHFORD, RACHEL, bur. 13 Dec. 1701 at John Kemball's (129).

ASHFORD, THOMAS, m. Mary Cox on 1 June 1735 (128:89).

ASHLE, (?), and his w. were the par. of ELIZABETH, b. 20 June 1693; WILLIAM, b. 27 July 1694; JOHN, b. 25 July 1695 (128:12).

ASHLEY, HENRY, was listed as a servant in the 1759 inv. of David Bissett (54:331).

ASHLEY, SARAH, was ind. for bast. in March 1746/7; as serv. to Darby Lux was tried for bast. in June 1750 (36:378; 37:11).

ASHLY, MARY, serv. of John Smith, confessed to having a bast. in Nov. 1741 (33:178).

FRANCES, b. 1 Nov. 1743, d. 24 Dec. 1743 (2:111; 12:348; 29:229; 30:63; 37:151; 53:320; 54:527; 110:411; 133:20, 27, 65; 153:6, 103; 259).

NORTH, THOMAS, d. leaving a will, 13 Dec. 1698 - 3 March 1699, naming w. as extx., s. Robert, and daus. Jane, Eliza, and Avies; est. was inv. by William Foreman and Thomas Knightsmith; had iss.: ROBERT; JANE; ELIZA; and AVIES (50:93; 121:165).

NORTH, THOMAS, was made levy free in Nov. 1756 (41:303).

NORTON, JOHN (1), was b. c.1678, d. 24 March 1726/7, giving his age as 37 in 1714/5, and stating he had lived in Balto. Co. for about 17 years; was in Balto. Co. by 1694 as a taxable in s. side Gunpowder; in May 1707 purch. Norton's Lot (being part of a larger tract called Jones' Inheritance) from John and Mary Boring; his will, proved, 3 April 1727, named w. Elizabeth and ch.: William, John, Richard, Ann, Elizabeth, and Mary; admin. bond was posted 15 July 1727 by execs. Thomas and Elizabeth Harryman, with George and Samuel Harryman, John Norton having ren. his right to admin.; est. was inv. 14 June 1728 by Benjamin Bowen and Richard Lenox and val. at £ 12.6.0; additional inv. was filed in 1728; est. was admin. by Eliza, w. of Thomas Harryman, on 10 April 1729; dec. left a wid. and five ch.: WILLIAM; JOHN; RICHARD; ANN; ELIZABETH; and MARY (2:281; 12:341; 51:82, 272; 59:612; 68:18; 125:15; 133:193; 139; 203-3:110).

NORTON, WILLIAM (2), s. of John (1), was left 1 shilling by his father's will; might be the William Norton who m. Elizabeth Clark on 1 Feb. 1732; on 31 March 1739 William Norton and w. Ann conv. 50 a. Jones' Addition and 40 a. Norton's Addition to William Lynch (75:218; 128:77).

NORTON, JOHN (3), s. of John (1), may be the John Norton who m. Susanna (---) by Aug. 1719, and was conv. Cole's Adventure by John and Dinah Cole (68:18).

NORTON, RICHARD (4), s. of John (1), was bd. to Thomas Sligh in June 1731 (29:156).

NORTON, RICHARD, s. of Peter Norton who lately left the county was age 11 next Oct., in June 1712 was bd. to serve Martin and Sarah Taylor to age 21 (21:314).

NORTON, SAMUEL, d. by 10 May 1722 when admin. bond was posted by Thomas Sheredine with William Galloway and Samuel Harryman; est. was inv. on 7 July 1722 by Thomas Sheredine, Benjamin Bowen and John Eaglestone and val. at £ 10.5.6, and was signed by Susanna Norden, Thos. Cockey, and Jona. Tipton; est. was admin. by Thomas Sheredine on 15 Jan. 1722 (1:102; 12:335; 52:19).

NORVIL, JANE, d. 27 Jan. 1739 (128:110).

NORVILL, JOHN, m. Mary Bayley on 2 Feb. 1735 (she d. 9 July 1744), and had iss.: SARAH, b. 23 Dec. 1736; MARY, b. 20 Sept. 1738; JAMES, b. 26 March 1741; HANNAH, b. 4 Aug. 1743 (128:91, 94, 101, 114; 129:335).

NORWOOD, Capt. JOHN (1), progenitor, came to A. A. Co., Md., from Va. in 1649, nephew of Edward Bennett, merchant; d. in A. A. Co., c.1672, having m. Anne (---), who m. as her 2nd husb. James Boyd; she d. 1674; Norwood was Sheriff and Chief Justice of A. A. Co.; had iss.: ANDREW, d. c.1701; PHILIP, d. c.1724; JOHN, d. c. 1683; SAMUEL, d. 1709; poss. JOSEPH, d. c.1684; poss. EDWARD, d. by 1729, m. Ruth Owings (200-65:192; 388; Johnston, "Norwood Notes," at the Md. Hist. Soc.).

NORWOOD, EDWARD (2), poss. s. of John (1), was listed as "dead; no effects," in the est. of Thomas Hedge of Balto. Co., in 1699; may be the father of: EDWARD, d. by 1729 (2:49).

NORWOOD, EDWARD (3), poss. s. of Edward (2), d. by 1729 in Balto. Co., having m. c.1718 Ruth, dau. of Richard and Rachel Owings; on 3 Nov. 1729 Richard Owings and w. Sarah conv. his sis. Ruth Norwood, wid., a parcel of land called Owings' Addition; Ruth Norwood was listed as the owner of this tract as late as 1750; in the Dorsey Family, Edward and w. are stated to have had iss.: EDWARD, d. by 1770; RACHEL, m. (Samuel?) Gott; RUTH, m. John Hurd on 8 June 1739; SAMUEL, d. c.1773, m. Sarah Bankson; SARAH; ANN, b. 1 Aug. 1729 (72:113; 133:29; 134; 153:86; Dorsey et al, The Dorsey Family; Owings et al, Owings and Allied Families, 3rd ed., p. 4).

NORWOOD, EDWARD (4), s. of Edward (3) and Ruth, d. in Balto. Co. by 1772; m. Mary Fitzsimmons, dau. of Nicholas and Martha (Morgan) Fitzsimmons, on 9 Nov. 1746; in 1750 he owned 10 a. Norwood's Chance, 22 a. Partnership, 128 a. Bachelor's Fear, and other lands; d. leaving a will, 25 March 1770 - 21 Jan. 1772; had iss.: NICHOLAS; EDWARD; SAMUEL; JOHN; ELIZABETH; RUTH; and MARY (112:200; 133:160; 153:86).

NORWOOD, SAMUEL (5), s. of Edward (3) and Ruth, d. c.1773; m. Sarah Bankson; d. leaving a will, 10 July 1773 - 2 Aug. 1773; left iss.: RUTH, m. by 10 July 1773 Charles Ridgely (112:263).

NORWOOD, PHILIP, in Nov. 1754 admitted he was the father of Mary Odle's illegitimate child (39:448).

NOWELL, AVARILLA, m. James Preston on 17 July 1726 (131).

NOWELL, JOHN, d. by 6 Aug. 1741, when admin. bond was posted by Alexander Lawson with John Carroll and Patrick Lynch (12:344).

NOWELL, JOHN, d. by 27 Feb. 1748 when admin. bond was posted by John Paca with William Dallam (12:349).

NOWELL, LEWIS, d. by 20 Jan. 1724; on 7 March 1716 Lewis Nowell purch. 20 a. Aberly Lodge from James Isham and w. Julian; on 4 March 1723 Lewis and his w. Jane conv. that tract, part John's Interest, and 100 a. Crow Perches to Henry Wetherall; wid. Jane ren. right to admin. his est. on 20 Jan. 1724 and admin. bond was placed by James Maxwell with Luke Raven and Bloys Wright (12:338; 67:455; 69:277).

NOWLAND. See NOLAND.

NUGENT, JOHN, d. by 26 July 1746 when admin. bond was posted by John Kelly with William Daugherty (12:345).

NUSUM. See NEWSOME.

O(---), WILLIAM, d. by 18 April 1693 when his est. was admin. by Martha, now w. of Robert Gibson (206-10:332).

OAKDIN, JOHN, m. Susannah Harps on 23 Oct. 1748 (131).

OAKERSON/OKINSON, ISAIAH, d. by 13 Feb. 1749 when admin. bond was posted by John Stinchcomb with Christopher Randall and Joshua Randall; est. was admin. by Stinchcomb on 1 Feb. 1753 (5:282; 12:406).

Oakey, THOMAS, serv., was listed in the 1732 inv. of Thomas Hutchins (52:244).

OAKLEY, THOMAS, was b. c.1712; m. Prudence (---) who was b. c.1715; with s. Thomas they were named in a 1742 lease of part of My Lady's Manor; had iss.: THOMAS, b. c.1741, alive in 1742; THOMAS, b. 16 June 1744 (77:135; 131).

OAKLEY, THOMAS, m. Susannah, and had iss.; WILLIAM, b. 16 June 1744 (131).

OAR, CHARLES, m. Margaret (---), and had iss.: JOHN, b. 26 Sept. 1721; DANIEL, b. 13 Sept. 1724 (133:11).

O'BRYAN, DANIEL, m. Mary (---), and had iss.: CHARLES, b. 5 May 1708 in Cecil Co. (128:29).

O'BRYAN, MARY, in June 1757 was tried for bast. (46:35).

O'BRYAN, TERENCE, m. Margaret (---), and had iss.: DANIEL, b. 19 Sept. 1709 in Cecil Co. (128:28).

O'BRYAN, THOMAS, m. Amelia Wooling on 14 June 1757 (131).

OCAIN, MANNUS, m. Eliza McKearly on 26 Nov. 1750 (131).

OCHISSON, JOSEPH, m. Elizabeth (---), and had iss.: JOHANNA, b. 25 April 1739 (128:103).

O'DANIEL, THOMAS, was in Balto. Co. by 1663 when he surv. 150 a. Daniel's Neck or Nest; d. by 5 Nov. 1684; left iss.: MARY, m. by 5 Nov. 1684 William Horne who joined her in sale of 50 a. of afsd. tract to John Hall; JANE, m. by 27 Feb. 1686 Thomas Thurcall who joined her in sale of 50 a. to William Westbury; and MARGARET, m. 1st William Westbury, and 2nd, by 4 June 1695 Robert Oless (59:101, 188, 466; 211).

O'DANIEL. See also DANIEL.

ODELL, WILLIAM, was in Balto. Co. by June 1742 when he purch. 50 a. Arnold's Chance from Anthony and Mary Arnold; d. by 24 Dec. 1748 when admin. bond was posted by admnx. Elizabeth Odell with Edward Oursler and John Hurd; in 1750 his heirs owned 50 a. Arnold's Chance, 50 a. Odell's Addition, and other land; his est. was admin. by Elizabeth Odell on 30 May 1750 and 21 May 1753; had iss.: MARY, b. c.1736 (may be the Mary Odell who named Philip Norwood as the father of her child in Nov. 1754); JOHN, b. c.1738; WILLIAM, b. c.1740; WALTER, b. c.1742; ELIZA, b. c. 1744; RICHARD, b. c.1745; RIGNAL, b. c.1746; TALBOT, b. c.1748 (5:150, 292; 12:401; 37:163; 39:449; 77:50; 153:66).

OFFLEY, JAMES, in Nov. 1719 stated he was aged and infirm, and pet. the court to be made levy free (23:241).

OG(---), WILLIAM, left an est. val. at E 4.4.0 by Thomas Beson and John Garner (48:69).

OGBURN, WILLIAM, was in Balto. Co. before 1700 when he surv. 100 a. Eastland Hills on 9 June 1672; d. by 1700 without heirs (211).

OGDEN, JOHN, m. Susanna Harps on 19 Nov. 1748 (131).

OGG, GEORGE (1), progenitor, was in A. A. Co. by 1703 when he was involved in a lawsuit with George Peacock; was in Balto. Co. by 1723; m. Elizabeth (---) also alive in 1723; in 1697 he acqu. 300 a. Parrishes Range from Edward Parrish, surv. 150 a. called Bashan in 1706; purch. 100 a. Addition from Thomas Randall in

1711; and surv. 100 a. George's Beginnings in Nov. 1715; in Nov. 1713 was named father-in-law in the will of William Talbot; in Dec. 1722 conv. all his goods and chattels to his s. George Ogg, Jr., on cond. that the s. would provide for his mother and bro. John, and that he would pay his sister Catherine Risteau E 25 in current money; in Dec. 1723 George and w. Elizabeth conv. all their real est. to s. George, Jr., retaining a life interest in the property; had iss.: JOHN, b. 24 Sept. 1691, alive in 1723; GEORGE, Jr., b. 30 April 1696; CATHERINE, m. 1st William Talbot and 2nd John Risteau (64:76; 67:176; 69:56, 232; 110:108; 207; 259; 340-15:225).

OGG, GEORGE, Jr. (2), s. of George (1), was b. 30 April 1696 in A. A. Co.; was alive in Nov. 1756; m. Mary Potee on 22 Aug. 1722; in Sept. 1723 surv. 50 a. Security; in 1750 owned 150 a. Morgan's Tents, 30 a. Plumb Tree Bottom, and 25 a. Hobson's Choice; was Constable of Upper Hund. of Patapsco in June 1731, and donated 500 pounds tobacco for the building of St. Thomas' Church; in Nov. 1756 conv. personal prop. to his ch.; had iss.: GEORGE, b. 12 April 1724; SARAH, b. 5 Sept. 1728, m. by Nov. 1756 John Whips; KATHERINE, b. 15 July 1728, m. George Shipley, Jr., by Nov. 1756; MARY, b. 10 Oct. 1730 (may have m. Philemon Barnes); REBECCA, b. 16 Oct. 1732, m. by Nov. 1756 William Shipley; RACHEL, b. 20 Sept. 1735; DUNCAN, alive in 1756; WILLIAM, may have been b. before 1724 (in 1742 was granted 25 a. William's Delight), m. Sarah, dau. of William Beasman; RUTH, alive in 1756 (22:232; 29:159; 61:310; 77:251; 78:331; 79:382; 82:377, 613; 92:202; 112:108; 133:14, 45, 48, 49; 153:4; 207; 219-1; 229; 228 ff.; 259).

OGG, GEORGE (3), s. of George (2), was b. 12 April 1724; d. leaving a will 13 Aug. 1767 - 23 Aug. 1770; m. by 29 April 1748 Helen, dau. of William Hamilton; in 1750 he owned 200 a. Carga-furgus; had iss.: BENJAMIN, b. 29 April 1748; GEORGE; RACHEL; WILLIAM HAMILTON; MARY; and JAMES (111:315; 153:96; 259).

OGG, WILLIAM (4), s. of George (2), was granted 25 a. Williams Delight in 1742; on 5 Oct. 1767 he and w. Sarah (dau. of William Beasman) sold the land to William Lyon, Charles Graham, and James Dick (92:202; 112:112).

OGG, BETHIA, m. William Garland on 10 June 1728 (129:245).

OGG, FRANCIS, d. in Balto. Co. on 26 Dec. 1733; m. 1st, by June 1710, Katherine (Stockett), admnx. of Henry Rhodes; m. 2nd, by 3 Aug. 1726, Mary, admnx. of William Beady; d. leaving a will, 25 Dec. ---, 18 March 1733, naming w. Mary, s. Stockett, and mentioning 5 younger ch.; admin. bond was posted 18 March 1733 by Mary Ogg with Edward Sanders and John Ellson; est. was admin. on 5 Nov. 1739; left iss.: four unidentified ch., and CATURINAH, b. 31 Dec. 1721, may be the Katherine tried for bast. in March 1743/4; STOCKETT, d. 28 Dec. 1733 (2:161, 323; 3:61, 203; 12:389; 21:156; 31:43, 103; 35:172; 52:23; 128:52, 78).

OGG, LABAN, alias Laban Hicks, with w. Ruth, conv. prop. to James and Rebecca Yeo (82:491).

OGG, THOMAS, m. Sarah, dau. of Joseph and Rachel Beasman.

OGLE, Rev. HENRY, was inducted into St. Johns Par., Balto. Co., on 24 July 1739; and served until he resigned on 21 July 1742 when he was inducted into Portobacco Parish, Charles Co. (303).

OGLE, JOHN, m. by 24 June 1743 Rosanna, admnx. of Jonas Robin-

el and Jean Overton; Thomas d. by 15 Dec. 1677 when admin. bond was posted by George Gunnell and John Stanesby with William Hollis; est. was admin. by Gunnell who had m. the wid. Jane; had iss.: JANE, m. by 22 April 1700 William Loney who sold Penny Come Quick and Natty's Island, formerly the prop. of Thomas Overton, to Robert Gibson; (poss.) JOHN; (poss.) NATHANIEL (2:72; 12:382; 66:54, 81; 94; 101; 120:88; 200-3:414).

OWEN, OWENS. See OWINGS.

OWINGS, RICHARD (1), progenitor, was in Balto. Co. by 1703 as a taxable in n. side of Patapsco Hund.; d. by 14 Nov. 1716; m. Rachel Robert, dau. of Robert Pugh of Llwyn-dedwydd, and sis. of Hugh Robert, the Quaker minister; she d. 1729; Owings was a captain of rangers along the frontier and the Potomac; on 20 Oct. 1706 was living at Herring Creek, A. A. Co., when he purch. Cole's Chance from John and Johanna Cole; d. by 14 Nov. 1716 when admin. bond was posted by Rachel Owings with Richard and Henry Owings; Rachel was d. by 27 May 1729 when her s. and heir, Richard, offered the home plantation for sale; had iss.: RACHEL, b. c.1683, d. May 1761, m. John Wilmot, Jr.; RICHARD, b. c.1688; HENRY, b. c.1692; JOHN, b. c.1694; RUTH, b. c.1696, m. 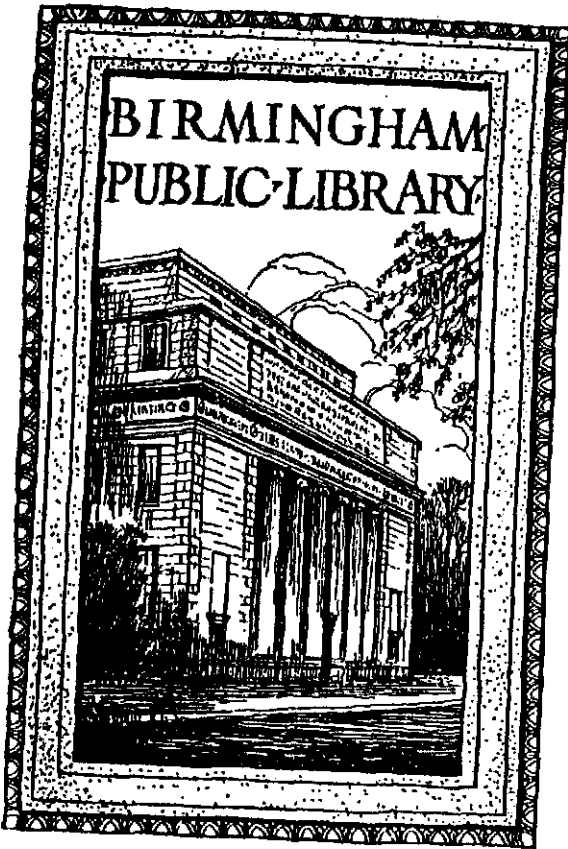
