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HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

This book contains two indices. The first is an index to the names of the deceased; the second, an index to the names of the executors or administrators.

- 1. All names have been transcribed to duplicate the entries in the county records as accurately as possible. Obvious misspellings have been copied.
- 2. The DOC column contains and A, an I, or is blank. The A and I indicate that the record is either an administration or inventory document. If the column is blank, the document is a will.
- 3. Entries in the BOOK column represent a system of coding which appears to be unique to Maryland. After Will Book 1 was filled, books thereafter were coded with the initials of the Register of Wills. All entries in the BOOK column refer to recorded copies of documents.
- 4. The FILE column contains the numbers of the files of original documents beginning in 1845 at which time the file numbering system was initiated. Such files may contain a variety of pertinent data.
- 5. The REF column contains arbitrarily assigned keys to additional facts that may help you decide the usefulness of the designated document.



- Oct. 21 Jacob Duckett had platted for him, this date, 2 parcels of land one of 141 a., and the other of 94 a., both in "Old 96 Dist." [Plat Bk., Q Series, vol. 3, pp. 85, 89, ibid.]
- Dec. 9
 Jacob Duckett purchased for 50 lbs. Sterling, 50 a. on S. side of Enoree River, from Samuel Bishop and Mary, his wife, all parties of Laurens Co. Land originally granted to Charles King & Charity his wife, on Nov. 5, 1755, sold to Samuel Bishop on Nov. 23, 1769. Wit: Samuel Bishop (Jr.?), Joel Whitten, John Odell. [Laurens Co. Deed Bk. B, p. 44.]
- May 17 Margaret Edmondson of Union Co., S.C., acknowledges debt of \$100. to Jacob Duckett and deeds 1200 a., formerly property of her late husband, Isaac Edmundson. Wit: Thomas Gitzendanner, John Dillard, Mary Kennedy. [Union Co., S.C. Deed Bk. D, p. 375.]

A paucity of records in Laurens and Newberry Co's., in Jacob's name, indicate that he may have left the Province, or at least, the area, early. Family tradition has it that one of the brothers", presumably this Jacob, removed to Buncombe Co., N.C., and that later he or, more probably, a son, settled in Habersham Co., Ga., C1823. The Bucketts below are almost certainly descendants of this Jacob Duckett, Jr., and others may have been the Ducketts of Madison Co., N.C. (where a mountain is locally known as "Duckett's Bald"), and of Haywood Co., N.C.

We believe they were the couple shown infra, in the 1850 census for Gilmer Co., Ga. Mr. Wells further stated to us that he has a copy of an 1899 afidavit signed by Thomas X Browning and T.J. Wells in Murray Co., Ga., stating that "Allen Duckett gave one acre of land in 1867 to the Methodist Episcopal church where Loyal Cove Church now stands".)

John & "Alsey" Whitmore, of Laurens Dist., S.C., bef. 1797.

On Nov. 4, 1797, Laurens Co. Deed Bk. F, p. 344, shows, "Sarah, Lydda, Mary Duckett and Margaret Prude and Annie Whitmore", sold to George Young, 250 a. on Duncans Creek, for 210 lbs, and that they were "joint beirs of the Estate of John Whitmore, deceased of Laurens Co., S.C." The land was "Tying upon the drafts of Dunkins Creek which was called Berkley Co., when surveyed, but now Laurens County...whereon the said George Young now lives...granted unto said John Whitmore, dec'd., Aug. 30, 1774...Recorded in Grant Bk. SSS, p. 525 (in Secretary's office)...bounded W by Andrew McCrery & part vacant; N by Joseph Whitmore & part vacant: NE by Lefus Rayley & part vacant; SE by Thomas McCrery & part vacant..." /s/ Sarah X Duckett; /s/ Lydda Duckett; /s/ Mary X Duckett; /s/ Margaret X Prude; /s/ Annie X Whitmore. Wit: John Watson, Andrew McCrery. Alis or Alsey Whitmore, widow & relict of John Whitmore, dec'd., released her dower, July 17, 1798. A later instrument, executed in 1819, Laurens Co. Equity Records, Bill No. 17, shows that the husband of the above Mary Duckett, was Richard Duckett. He is listed in the 1800 census for Laurens Co.[THE SECOND FEDERAL CENSUS 1800 SOUTH CAROLINA, LAURENS COUNTY (1959), University of South Carolina, Columbia, p. 8], as being between ages of 26-45, with one son under 10, his wife 16-26, and dau., under 10, and living 3 doors away from the widow "Alse Whitmore".
