## RICHARD MASON OF SURRY COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Although a man of some prominence and author of one of the most popular works ever published in the state of Virginia, very little is known of Richard Mason. The work, reprinted over twenty times in at least nine different editions, over a period of seventy-five years, must have been well known from Maine to Florida. But of the man who wrote it, nothing! His principal claim to fame (and probably his only literary effort) was entitled "The Gentleman's New Pocket Companion, comprising a general description of the noble and useful animal, the horse; - - -" The first edition was printed at Petersburg in 1811\* by John Dickson. The true merit and value of the work was such that for three generations it was the standard manual for the horsemen of the country.

From the Albemarle Parish Register comes the following entry: Richard Mason b. October 27, 1747, son of James Mason and Mary his wife. Godfathers—Harbod Marabel and Edw<sup>d</sup> Petway. Godmothers—Mary Marabel and Susanna Moon.

Richard Mason was a native of Sussex County and apparently lived there until the close of the eighteenth century. He appears on the tax books in 1782 as paying personal taxes but not as a land owner until 1792 when he paid taxes on 168 acres. He married Mary Burrow (widow of William Burrow) bond dated September 21, 1773. William Burrow's will dated 1770 leaves his estate to his wife Mary and his son Allen Jones Burrow.

In the early part of the nineteenth century he appears in the Surry County records for a number of reasons. He made money but was a poor collector for as early as November 23, 1803, he brought suit against Archibald Campbell for debt. Again on March 28, 1805, he sued John M. St. George for payment of debts.

On April 22, 1806, the Commonwealth felt called upon to interfere with a proposed duel between Richard Mason and Edward Butts. Upon a Recognizance entered into by the defendants before John Judkins, Gent., a Justice of the Peace, for their appearance before the Court they are charged with "an intention to fight a duell" . . . "The said Richard Mason and Edward Butts appeared in discharge of the said Recognizance and John Judkins, Gent., Reuben Butler and Charles Butts having been sworn and examined, on consideration of the evidence it is the opinion of the Court that the said defendants have intended to fight a Duell." (They were bound for \$400 each and Richard Mason offered William Edwards and Josiah Savedge as his securities.)

At a court held for Surry County April 26th, 1808, Mason presented into court a commission under the hand of his Excellency William H. Cabell, Esquire, appointing him Captain in a troop of cavalry in the Fourth Regiment and Fourth Division, and took the several oaths prescribed by law. The following entry comes from the Calendar of Virginia State Papers, Vol. X, p. 38: "Richard Mason (Captain) to the Governor; Tenders the services of the Surry Volunteer Troop of Cavalry, consisting of 36 members, including officers, conformable to the act of Congress passed March 30, 1808."

In a deed dated February 7, 1807, David Price and Susan, his wife, convey to Mason 200 acres of land, more or less, known as the "Cross Roads" with certain reservations of property leased within the bounds noted, among other reservations being—"saving and reserving to the Justices of Surry

In 1619, a year marked by several important events in the Colony, including the assembling of the first General Assembly, the London Company adopted a "Cote for Virginia". The coat-of-arms has been a puzzle and source of speculation to every historian and has been sometimes confused with the proper seal of the Colony itself. It is found as a book plate or frontispiece in nearly all of the printed acts and official proceedings of the Colonial government. It appears in Smith's *Generall Historie of Virginia*, editions 1624 and 1632; in Beverley's *History of Virginia*, in several issues of the *Virginia Gazette*, and in Stow's *Survey of London*, published in 1633. It was changed slightly from time to time to make the quarterings agree with the arms of the different reigning houses, and after the union of England and Scotland "quartam" succeeded "quintum" in the motto. The illustration is from the title page of *Merchants of Virginia* in the Virginia State Library.
