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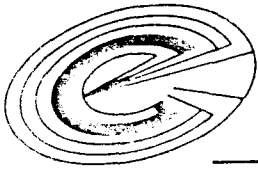

Early Times in Pickens County

with his father Samuel William Alexander, 50 to 60, was listed in the 1830 Pickens County census with a wife, 40 to 50, two sons and four daughters. The oldest son, Thomas Houston Alexander, born in 1815, census date in Kentucky, married Caroline Brogin, born in 1785 in South Carolina who was living with them in the 1860 census. Their children were Erastus, 13, born in Alabama; Sarah, 11, Ala. John W., 8 (John W. 1852-1910 is buried at Pine Grove Cemetery); Ann, 4; Frances, 2, and Druic Alexander (1860-1942) and wife Eudora (1866-1942) are buried in Macedonia Cemetery. Thomas Houston Alexander died Jan. 10, 1905, at his home west of Macedonia Church and was buried in a cemetery nearby on the Lamar County line that is no longer used. Listed in the 1840 census was R. V. Alexander in section nine of Beards Beat. Also listed were 2 males, 20 to 30, 1 female, 15 to 20, and 1 female living by the side of James Madison Alexander, 20 to 30, and his wife, 20 to 30, who had come to Pickens County in 1826 for his help.

with his father Samuel D. Alexander was a brother to George Baldwin Alexander. Their parents were the Rev. Joseph Alexander, a Presbyterian minister in North and South Carolina before the Revolutionary War, and Esther Davits Alexander, (1745-1803). The 1850 census shows J. M. Alexander 37, Derenda A. (Gilkey) 32, William H. 10, Mary C. 8, Minerva, 6, and Sarah C. 1. James M. died in 1855 while living in Carrollton. The 1860 census shows Derenda A. 42, William H. 19, Mary C. 17, Frances C. 13f., Sarah C. 10. All children were both in Alabama. Derenda Alexander and her son William H. died in 1861 and are buried in Antioch Cemetery. ~~was marked~~
