



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

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THE ANCESTRY OF THE NICHOLAS PITMAN FAMILY OF VIRGINIA

THE SNAPP FAMILY

They, too, were "Palatines," in the sense that they entered at the port of Philadelphia as German immigrants. We do not know, however, whence they came. The record of their arrival reads:18

"List of Foreigners Imported in the Ship Samuel, of London, Hugh Percy, Master, from Rotterdam. Qualified (i. e., they took the oath of abjuration and allegiance) Aug. 17, 1733.

Happily, in this case, the names of women and children were also recorded; usually, men only were named.

Obviously, this family consisted of a father, Johannes, his wife, Barbara, and their three children plus a younger brother of Johannes.

Just when the Snapps made their way from Pennsylvania to Virginia, we do not know, but they probably came fairly early. Lawrence must have done exceptionally well financially, for in his will, he bequeaths more than 2,600 acres of land to his wife (but her name is not mentioned) and to his ten children, all of whom he names. He signed his will in German. It was proved on Thursday, June 27, 1782, and it is on file in the Shenandoah Co. records at Woodstock.²⁰

His older brother, John, who landed with him at Philadelphia in 1733, accompanied by his family, also came to Virginia. John died there a number of years before the Revolutionary War broke out. His will was proved in Frederick County on April 6, 1762,²¹ when John would have been 66 years old.

In his will, which is brief, and in which he does not specify the amount of his bequests, he directs that his body be "buried in a Christian like manner in the burying place by my wife Barbara, deceased." He then directs that all his "worldly estate" be equally divided among his children, whom he names as "John Snapp, Lawrence Snapp, Barbara Baker, Catherine Pitman, Christiana Beard, Margaret Mason Smith, Salomy Wisecarver." John Snapp did not sign his will, but made his mark before witnesses Joseph, John and Richard Fawcett.

This John Snapp family gave to the Pitman descendants one ancestress, Catherine. She was evidently one of four younger children born to John and Barbara Snapp after they entered the country at the port of Philadelphia in 1733. Catherine married Nicholas Pitman, presumably in Virginia, but when and where, we do not know.

THE NICHOLAS PITMAN (PITTMAN) FAMILY IN VIRGINIA

(Both Pittman and Pitman are in use by various branches of the family today. For the sake of uniformity, the Anglicized form Pitman will be used here.)

The immigrant ancestor of this line was Nicholas Pitman. Unfortunately, we know little about him. Documentary evidence is scarce and family tradition, handed down verbally or by letter, is often untrustworthy, as noted above and again later in this paper.

Nicholas Pitman was undoubtedly German. His name does not appear in the lists of German immigrants in the work "Pennsylvania German Pioneers," cited above², so he probably did not enter through the port of Philadelphia. We seem to have no accurate knowledge of where he landed, when he arrived or of his age at the time. The family tradition has it that he was born about the year 1700, that he came from Bingen in the Rhine Valley and that he arrived about the year 1740 on the same vessel as the Bakers and Conrads of Winchester.²² The present writers have been able to discover no evidence that could pass as proof of any of these statements, some of them appear doubtful, as we shall point out later, and we include them here as tradition only and not at all as facts.

There were other Pitmans in Virginia in the early day. Mr. Frank H. Pitman, of Roanoke, not of the line of Nicholas, has done much searching for information on the immigrant ancestors, and the following excerpts from a recent letter of his (now in possession of the writers through the kindness of Mr. Charles H. Keeler, of Winchester, a descendant of Nicholas), give us interesting side lights.

"My ancestors came from Shenandoah and Frederick Counties the same as did the ancestors of Lawrence Pitman. I have for years been interested in trying to complete my Pitman family line.

My study of the Shenandoah and Frederick County court records developed that during period 1750-1800 several Pitman families lived in the Strasburg neighborhood, now Shenandoah County, which was Frederick County prior to 1772; i. e., (1) Nicholas Pitman, dates of birth and death unknown, who married Catherine A. Snapp, who had three children—Lawtence, who married Catherine Will; John and a daughter (name unknown); the latter two going to Harrison County, Indiana, of which Corydon is the county seat; (2) Anthony Pitman, date of birth unknown but who died in 1803, married Catherine (surname unknown) and had five children—Andrew, Catherine, Elizabeth, John and Rosanna; (3) Philip Pitman, date of birth unknown but died May 11, 1820, who married Susannah Crabill and had the following children—Emanuel, David, Jonathan and Abraham.

The earliest record I could find of Nicholas Pitman, the progenitor of Lawrence mentioned by you, was his land purchase May 6, 1760 (Frederick County Deed Book 5-440). The earliest record I could get of Anthony Pitman was his land purchase May 7, 1761 (Frederick County Deed Book

6-269). Philip Pitman, above mentioned, is my ancestor and the earliest record I have concerning him was land purchase June 18, 1773 (Shenandoah County Deed Book A-480-1).

I have, however been told by several of my family members, all now dead, that the Philip and Nicholas Pitman families were related. This information has also been given me by several of the descendants of Nicholas Pitman, but unfortunately none could say in what way such parties were related.

Several of the Nicholas Pitman descendants told me that the oral tradition handed down was, that Nicholas Pitman and two cousins—three youths—came over from Bingen on the Rhine about 1740, that they bought land near Strasburg in Frederick County, that they were religious, and on many old church records of the Valley their names are conspicuous—some of them were musicians. They, as well as the older members of the family have told me that the older members of both families during their childhood could and did speak in German.

I have all along suspected that the three Pitmans above mentioned were probably Nicholas and his two cousins, but have been unable thus far to confirm this.

Through the kindness of this same Mr. Frank H. Pitman, we are now in possession of photostatic copies of various pages of the register of St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Strasburg. From this source we have more information regarding Nicholas Pitman and his family than from any other. The entries, in chronological order are:

On April 9, 1775, "Nicolaus Bitmann' and "Catharina Bitmännin (German feminine form) partook of communion with about forty-five other persons named.

On September 27th, 1776, five adults were baptized into membership in the church and "Nicol Bietman und Frau Catharina" are listed as witnesses.

On December 5th, 1785, "Nicolaus Bittmann und seine Ehefrau" were again witnesses at the baptism of several children.

On July 14th, 1790, "Johannes Schneider un seine Frau Catharina "were witnesses at the baptism of Elisabeth, daughter of Samuel and Ida Baumann.

On the 29th of October, 1790, "Nicolaus Bittmann" and "seine Hausfrau Catharina" were sponsors at the baptism of Johann Schneider's infant son.

On the 19th of March, 1797, "Lorentz [Lawrence] und Catha Bitman" had their infant son baptized Philipp. The child had been born on the 22d of January of that year and the sponsors were Lawrence's brother "Johannes Bitman" and "Frau Elisabeth."

On the 20th of October, 1797, "Benja. Grabil" and wife Catharine were sponsors at the christening of Magdalena, infant daughter of "Johannes Bitman" and "Frau Elisa."

On March 25th, 1804, Peter Maack was godfather at the christening of "Philip Peter," infant son of "Johannes Bitman und Frau Elisa."

And again, on September 19th, 1807, "Johannes Bitman and Frau Elisa." had a son christened David. Johannes and Catharine Schneider were the sponsors.

The present writers have long believed that the name "Pitman" was not the original German name, but a translation or corruption of it. The above entries in the old church register make it perfectly clear, it would seem, that the original name was Bittmann. The name persists throughout in the register, although in several forms: Bittman, Bietmann (once only), Bitmann and, finally, Bitman, a gradual approach to American spelling, even among the Germans themselves.

That it had long before become Pitman in the English speaking community is obvious. All legal notices, transfers of land, deeds, wills, etc., show the form Pitman from the first notice of 1760 on, the one exception being, apparently, the Virginia census of 1783, where the German form Bitman appears.

Other names already familiar to us also appear in their original German form in the register; e. g., Alexander Hite, the census taker cited above, was Alexander Heidt; Adam Sherman, also mentioned above, was Adam Schiermann in 1790, Adam Scherman in 1796, etc.

The earliest documentary record of Nicholas Pitman that we find bears the date of May 3d, 1760. On that day, he bought of Lewis and Mary Stephens for £10 three lots in the town of Stephensburg, "part of a larger tract of 674 acres granted to Peter Stephens Oct. 3, 1734."²³ Although his wife is not mentioned in this transaction, Nicholas Pitman was probably married at that time, 1760, for the will of his father-in-law, John Snapp, discussed above, dated Nov. 30, 1761, names Catharine Pitman as his daughter.

The family tradition has always maintained that the wife of Nicholas Pitman was a daughter of Lawrence Snapp, a vestryman in the church of Peter Muhlenberg of Revolutionary fame and himself a prominent Revolutionary patriot. One of the present writers has heard this statement from his mother from early childhood. Wayland repeats it in his history on the authority of his informants.²² But it is just another example of how wrong family tradition can go in matters of detail as shown in the will of John Snapp, discussed above. Nicholas Pitman's wife was a daughter of John Snapp, not of Lawrence. There was no daughter Catharine in Lawrence Snapp's family.

On June 7, 1763, Nicholas Pitman bought three more lots in the town

of Stephensburg of Lewis Stephens.24

Again, "At a court held on Tuesday, May 28, 1776, . . . Among those transferring land were the following: . . . Ch. Witmore and wife to Nicholas Pitman,"25

Wayland records.²⁶ "1777, Feb. 24, 25, Nicholas and Catherine Pitman sell to John Heckman for £150, 5., 100 acres on North River of Shenandoah; land conveyed to Pitman by Christian Whitmore. S. C. D. B. B., p. 436."

Nicholas Pitman's Revolutionary War record is indicated to us solely by the inclusion of his name in:

"A List of Captain Alexander Machir's Company in the Strasbg. District (15th).

PITMAN, NICHOLAS."

Also named in the list are Philip Pitman, Lawrence Snapp, Peter Snapp, and Philip Snapp; and an appended note indicates "Law. Snapp Jun'r. Ensign."²⁷

In the census of Shenandoah of 1785, Nicholas Pitman is named in the list returned by Samuel Porter as being the head of a family of eight whites and possessing one dwelling and one other building.²⁸ From this it would seem that Nicholas and Catherine had others than their three children living with them.

On September 30, 1797, Nicholas Pitman, farmer, conveys to his son, Lawrence Pitman, farmer, 202 acres "in the said County of Shenandoah," originally belonging to Martin Roller, for £200.29 On this same date, Lawrence Pitman and his wife, conveyed 100 acres, a part of this same tract, to John Pitman for £200.30 Although not so stated, these two transactions may have been connected with the settlement of Nicholas Pitman's estate.

An examination of the tax records in Richmond shows Nicholas a tax-

payer each year up to and including 1797, but not thereafter. He probably died that year.

Evidently, then, Nicholas Pitman was still living in 1797. This fact raises in the minds of the present writers considerable skepticism as to the correctness of the family tradition, cited above, that he "was born about 1700." In that event, he would have been 73 years old at the time of the birth of his son Lawrence and at least 97 at the time of his death. Both are within the range of possibility, but quite improbable. As we have seen, his wife, Catherine Snapp, was born after 1733. It would seem probable, then, that he was somewhere near her age.

We have no record of the date of death of either Nicholas or Catherine. Under date of August 28, 1936, Professor Frank C. Crawford, of Winchester, wrote us:

"On the property located two miles south of Strasburg, on the Shenandoah River, are located the graves of Nicholas Pitman and his wife. I have seen them (at a distance). Two large blocks of limestone, I understand. The present owner of the property told us these stones had no inscriptions on them, so we did not visit them. This place was the farm purchased by Nicholas, where he made his home. There seems to be no doubt that Nicholas and his wife sleep there."

Wayland quotes Miss Mary C. Pitmana1 as writing;

"All the children of Nicholas Pitman emigrated to Corydon, Indiana, except Lawrence, who married Catherine Will," etc. Professor Crawford writes: 32 "His son, John Pitman settled in the west."

In a letter from Lawrence Pitman, junior, to Mrs. Martha Pitman (now in the possession of the latter's daughter, Marilla, Denmark, Iowa), dated Charlottesville, Va., Aug. 26, 1895, he writes: "My father had one brother and a sister who moved to the southern part of Indiana. I think Uncle John had six or seven children, but as they were from home when I was there, I did not see them or learn their names."

While we know, then, the names of the three children of Nicholas Pitman-John, Lawrence and Catherine—the birth and death dates of Lawrence alone are known to us.

Post Script. Since the foregoing was written and sent to the printer, the present writers have received through the kindness of Mrs. Martha W. Hiden, of Newport News, Va., two important bits of information:

1. An excerpt from the will of Adam Sherman (Schierman), of Strasburg, Shenandoah County, dated May 3d, 1797, in which he names Sussamua

Will as his daughter. Clearly, then, John Will did marry a Sherman—confirming our surmise for which we did not have positive proof before, see the discussion on page 142 of the October Tyler's—and, no less obviously, this Adam Sherman was the relative whom Mary Catherine came from Pennsylvania to visit, but he was her grandfather, not her "Uncle Sherman."

2. A certified copy of a letter, now in possession of Mrs. J. Early (Katharine Pitman) McMurran, of Hilton Village, Va., that states: "He (Nicholas Pitman) had two sons and one daughter, Lawrence, John and Mrs. Snyder. John and Mrs. Snyder emigrated to Indiana."

This checks with the statement from the letter of Lawrence Pitman, Jr., cited above, that his father "had one brother and a sister who moved to the southern part of Indiana."

And now that we have the daughter named as Mrs. Snyder (common Anglization of the German Schneider), it appears little less than certain to the present writers that she was the wife of Johann Schneider, at the baptism of whose infant son Nicholas Pitman and wife served as sponsors in 1790; and that she was the Catherine Schneider, who, with her husband, Johannes, was witness at the baptism of Elizabeth Baumann in 1790 and at that of David Pitman in 1807. See the excerpts from the records of St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Strasburg cited above.

LAWRENCE PITMAN, SENIOR

It may seem strange to begin the biographical sketch of an individual by quoting his epitaph. It is done in the present instance for the reason that his birth date is thereby clearly established. On the tombstone of Lawrence Pitman in the cemetery at Mt. Jackson, Va., is the inscription:

"Lawrence Pitman was born August 17, 1773 and departed this life October 19th, 1850, aged 77 years, 2 mos and 2 da."

Beside him sleeps his wife and her epitaph reads:

"Mrs. Mary C(atherine) Pitman, consort of Lawrence Pitman and daughter of John and Susanna Will. She was born on the 25th of December, 1774, and departed this life on the 11th of November, 1832, aged 58 years, 11 mos. and 14 days."

The junction of the Pitman and Will lines is thus clearly established. Both families were entirely German from the immigrant ancestors down. The children of Lawrence and Catherine Pitman had German blood only in their veins.

In the foregoing chapter on the Wills, the meeting and marriage of Lawrence and Catherine are recorded as based on the statement of a grand-daughter. They took up residence in Shenandoah County, Virginia, and soon thereafter John Will and his family removed from York County, Pa., and also took up residence in Shenandoah. Not only their daughter, but also Susanna's father, Adam Sherman, lived there. (See the post script above.)

We have little knowledge of Lawrence Pitman's early youth or of the first ten years of his married life. In a deed of 1797, he is named as "Lawrence Pitman, farmer," but he appears to have entered into business operations, as well. In 1803, he and his wife sold to John Pitman two tracts of land in Shenandoah County for \$2,500,88 and on August 8, 1803, he bought 387 acres of land "on the northwest side of the North River of Shenandoah" from Abraham Bird and his wife Rachel for \$5,555.50.84 Here Lawrence Pitman built, presumably in 1803 or 4, the red brick mansion well known throughout the region as Redbanks. Rebuilt and remodelled after a fire about a century later, it still stands near the highway, formerly the Valley Turnpike, and is one of the historic landmarks of the Valley.

Here Lawrence Pitman, senior, lived for nearly half a century, and it was here that he reared his family. He doubtless farmed his land, but Redbanks was also well known throughout its early history as a tavern and stage coach stop. It appears to have been a favorite stopping place for travelling gentry between Baltimore and White Sulphur Springs. Miss Mary Pitman names³⁵ Madame Jerome Bonaparte, General Andrew Jackson and (in Civil War days) General Stonewall Jackson as among those who were entertained there.

There was also the Redbanks mill near by that Lawrence Pitman owned (see fourth item in note 36 below). In the 1840's there was also a post office at Redbanks. Just how many of these varied activities Lawrence Pitman, himself carried on or directed, we do not know, but, as owner and proprietor, he probably participated actively.

Other land purchases and sales by Lawrence Pitman are recorded, but, as they appear to have little bearing upon our narrative, we content ourselves by listing them in a footnote³⁸ for the benefit of anyone who may have use for the information.

On July 11, 1849, Lawrence Pitman, senior, wrote to his son, Joseph (the letter is now in the possession of Joseph's granddaughter, Miss Marilla Pitman, of Denmark, Ia.), that he had sold the Redbanks farm and was boarding with his son, Philip. The letter is postmarked "Palmyra," and that was the name of Philip Pitman's home. This sale of the Redbanks farm

of 375 acres and of another tract of 180 acres to William Ripley for \$18,500 appears in the county records under date of September 1, 1849.**

In the following year, Lawrence Pitman died, presumably at Palmyra or, at any rate, not far from Mt. Jackson, where he and his wife lie buried, she having preceded him in death by eighteen years. His will was proved "in a court held for the County of Shenandoah on Monday, the 11th of November, 1850.

In his will, Lawrence Pitman observed to the penny "perfect equality" in the distribution of his possessions among his ten children. Nine of them are named in the instrument and a tenth portion is bequeathed to his "Grandson, John Carter Dickinson and his mother." The child not named was a daughter, Rebecca, who married a Mr. Dickinson, of Lee County. She died when her son, John Carter Dickinson, was very young. John Carter's "mother," referred to in the will, may have been a guardian aunt, for the father had remarried and removed to the west, while young John Carter remained at Redbanks and was reared by his mother's sisters. After the Civil War, in which he served the Confederate cause, John Carter removed to Kansas, whither his father had gone.

As we have seen, Lawrence Pitman's brother, John, and sister, Catherine Schneider, had gone westward at an early date. So far as we know, then, Lawrence and Mary Catherine Pitman were the progenitors of all the descendants of the Nicholas Pitman line who remained in Virginia. A listing here of all of Lawrence and Mary's children and grandchildren should, then, it would seem, enable any living descendant of the family to trace his line back to the immigrant ancestors without difficulty. We append such a list, therefore; we have had it checked to the best of our ability by several members of the family and believe it to be fairly accurate. We hope it will be of service to many.

THE CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN OF LAWRENCE AND MARY CATHERINE (WILL) PITMAN

(In the order in which they are named in Lawrence Pitman's will.)

1. Philip, the eldest son, b. Jan. 22, 1797. He married Mary, the daughter of Capt. George Houston, of Rockingham Co. At a very early age, Philip was

a soldier in the War of 1812. In later life, he owned a large farm, Palmyra, near Edinburgh, Shenandoah Co., to which his father, Lawrence Pitman retired, after selling Redbanks, and where he died. Philip was a state senator when the Civil War broke out. At the age of 64, he enlisted and served as a private in the Confederate army with three of his sons, John, Archie and Nathan. He was subsequently reelected to the state senate.

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married (1) Mary J. Ripley, (2) Mary Elizabeth, widow of Valentine Ripmarreid (1) Mary J. Ripley, (2) Mary Elizabeth, widow of Valentine Ripley; Archibald, who married Elizabeth Hiett; Laura, who married (1) Robert Snapp, (2) Mr. Huffman; Viola, who married William Gold; Emma, who married Elisha Payne; and Nathan, who remained unmarried and died soon after his return from the army.

2. Andrew, who married (1) Catherine Allen (Oct. 7, 1809-Mch. 8, 1830). They had one child, Erasmus. After Catherine's death by accidental drowning, Andrew married (2) Louisa Overall. (Her mother was a Carson, a sister of Martha Carson, who married Jared Williams. Jared Williams' daughter, Amanda, married Joseph Pitman, a brother of Andrew. Thus the children of Andrew and Louisa Overall Pitman were doubly related to the children of Joseph and Amanda Williams Pitman—their fathers were brothers and their grandmothers were sisters.)

Andrew and Louisa's children were: Mary Catherine, who remained unmarried; Julia, who died young; and Susan, the youngest, who married Mr. Heiskell.

3. Lawrence, junior, b. 1810, who married Jane Almond, of Page County. Their children:

Anna, who married the Rev. Richard Mallory; William, who served in the Confederate army, losing a leg, later studied medicine, married Miss Martha Virginia Bell and practiced in Lynchburg; Sibelia, who married Mr. Richard Flannagan, of Charlottesville; Susan, who remained unmarried and lived with the Flannagans; Frank, a Presbyterian minister who married Mary Weston Clymer and made his home in Williamsburg; Rebecca, who married Mr. Powell; and Florence, who married the Rev. Mr. Gardner and lived in Japan.

4. Joseph, b. Feb. 11, 1800; d. Apr. 3, 1872; m. Eleanor Amanda Williams, Nov. 4, 1828. She was born Mch. 15, 1806; d. in July of 1871. Their children:

Martha Catherine, b. Mch. 17, 1830; m. Greenberry Pitman (not related); Lawrence Williams, b. Oct. 1, 1831; remained unmarried; Louisiana, b. Mch. 17, 1833; died carly. Mary Evelina, b. Jan. 19, 1835; died early; Decatur, b. May 6, 1836; m.; Matilda Virginia, b. Dec. 8, 1837; m. Oliver Orme; Gustavus Adolphus, b. Oct. 15, 1839; m.; Susan Mary, b. May 28, 1841; m. Thos. Henry Goodnight; she died Aug. 6, 1934; Simon Carson, b. July 9, 1843; died early; Joseph Jefferson, b. Feb. 17, 1845; d. 1871, unmarried; Wright Gatewood, b. Jan. 27, 1847;

died early; Eleanor Amanda, b. Apr. 29, 1849; m. (1) John Orme; (2) Marsh Norris.

- 5. John, married Miss Watkins; a physician who lived and practiced in Memphis, Tenn.
- 6. Susan, b. 1795, who married John Carter. Their farm home was on the Martinsburg pike, four miles north of Winchester. John died in 1842. They had no children, but the widowed Susan adopted Susan Mary Pitman, a daughter of her brother, Joseph, and mother of one of the present writers.
- 7. Catherine, who married William A. Carter, no relative of John Carter. William built Carter Hall, near Stephens City. Children:

John Lawrence, who married Jennie Rawlins; Robert, a surgeon in the Confederate army, who married a Miss Young in New York, where he subsequently lived and practiced; Joseph, who married Betty Chapman, of Page County, and located in North Carolina; Pitman, who was killed in the second battle of Manassas; Anna, the only daughter, who died soon after the war; Charles, who married Edmonia Carter, a cousin; Berryhill, b. 1848, d. 1932, who married Mary Gray Caldwell, b. 1847; d. 1930, and later bought Carter Hall, residing there until his death; and George, who married Miss Castleman, of Clark County, and subsequently settled in Warren County.

- 8. Mary, Nov. 20, 1815-June 19, 1857, who married William Ripley, a widower with two children. He bought Redbanks and resided there. Mr. Ripley's daughter, Mary J., married John Pitman, a son of Philip; and the Ripley son, Valentine, married Miss Mary Allen, returned to Redbanks after the war and resided there until his death.
- 9. Elizabeth, who married John Carter, a nephew of both John Carter and William Carter, mentioned above. Their children:

Pitman, who served in the Confederate army and died soon after the war; Ida, who likewise died early; Mary Lou, who married Benj. Roberts; Susan, who married Edwin Curtiss; Joseph, who married Miss Roberts; Charles, who settled in Page County; Porterfield, who married Eva Allen; Arthur, who married (1) Rosa Belle Gruber and (2) Ella Virginia Carter, a cousin; and Edgar, who married Julia Roberts.

10. As noted above, the child not named in the will was Rebecca, who married Mr. Dickinson, of Lee County. Their only child was John Carter Dickinson.
