This is an account of the lives of Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, Sr., his wife, Mary Jane Adline ANDREWS, and their twelve children. Where possible, something is said of the families of the spouses of the ROBERTS children. It also presents all the descendants of Amos and Mary contained in my database as of April 1996.

This volume only goes back to my great great grandparents. Someday, I hope to prepare a book about their ancestors. In this work my main interest is in preserving some memories, however faint now, of my ROBERTS ancestors, their lives and the events that surrounded them. I want to tell something about them as people--although there is so little written or oral tradition upon which to draw that a real account of their lives is now impossible. On two of the daughters I have virtually nothing, and on most of the rest little that preserves some sense of what their lives were like. More research could be done to fill out this family history, but it would take even more time and further delay. August 1996 will see the sixth annual reunion of descendants of Amos Pleasant and Mary (ANDREWS) ROBERTS. At the first, in 1991, I promised to produce an account of the ROBERTS family. The years are flowing rapidly. Many would like to see at least an outline of our family and the main facts as I, and many others, have discovered them.

Therefore, rather than wait to do the "definitive" history of my ROBERTS family, I have chosen to produce a record of the descendants of Amos Pleasant ROBERTS and his wife, Mary Adline ANDREWS (or ANDERS, as the name often appears, even within the same nuclear family), with at least the known key events of the lives of Amos, Mary and their twelve children. It includes every one of their descendants in my database as of 1 April 1996. Originally, I had intended to include a brief historical sketch and a picture of at least each of the grandchildren as well, and possibly even the great grandchildren. Unfortunately, not enough information and pictures were forthcoming to make this possible. To get the book done, I have opted not to include any sketches of the lives of any descendants beyond the twelve children of Amos and Mary, although I have included a number of pictures of later descendants as well.

Over the years I have done a lot of research on the line backwards from Amos Pleasant, and I believe the tree is fairly clear now. While in the present work I do not set forth his full ancestry as I believe it to be, I am convinced that his parents were Josiah ROBERTS and Mary LINSEY, of Rutherford County, North Carolina. This claim is based on what I believe is compelling circumstantial evidence not fully set forth in this book. Indeed, by the principle of preponderance of the evidence, I believe I would be justified in asserting this parentage. I have also done considerable "negative" research, trying to find any evidence that would prove that Josiah and Mary were **not** the parents of Amos. A number of men named Josiah ROBERTS have been tracked down, and nothing found thus far suggests the contrary. However, for the time being I refrain from proclaiming this lineage "officially" until I complete further research. When this is done, certainly some years yet, I then propose to publish a second work on the ROBERTS family, taking the line

back to 17th century colonial Virginia, adding many hundreds more ancestors to those in this book. Life is unpredictable, however, and just in case that never happens, I will note here that the father of Amos's probable father, Josiah ROBERTS, was Morris ROBERTS, of Chesterfield County, Virginia and Rutherford County, North Carolina. Unfortunately, the identity of Josiah's mother, Morris's second wife (his first was Unity MARTIN, of Chesterfield County) is unknown, although some researchers believe her given name may have been Elizabeth. This Morris, in turn, was the son of another Morris ROBERTS and his wife, Jane PRIDE, of Henrico and Chesterfield County, Virginia. Jane was the daughter of Halcott and Martha PRIDE, and Halcott the son of William PRIDE. The PRIDE family goes back to the earliest days of colonial Virginia. This second Morris was the son of yet a third Morris ROBERTS and his wife, Elizabeth STEP (or STAP), also of Henrico County. Elizabeth was the daughter of Joshua STEP and his unknown wife. Joshua STEP is thought to have been the brother of Abraham STEP, of Essex County, Virginia. This family arrived in colonial Virginia early in the 17th century, and probably stems from the STEP family of Buckinghamshire, England. Morris, husband of Elizabeth STEP, is the earliest known ancestor of my ROBERTS line, with the oldest record uncovered so far being 1697 (there is a reference to militia service by a Morris ROBERTS in Virginia in the 1680s--possibly my ancestor as a young man--but because of the nearly complete absence of records I have not been able to prove any linkage).

I also think--but have very little evidence to support this thesis--that Mary LINSEY's father may have been James LINSEY, of Rutherford County, North Carolina, a close neighbor of Josiah and his father, Morris ROBERTS. Amos and Mary named their second son James Joseph ROBERTS, possibly after his grandfathers, James LINSEY and Josiah (Joseph) ROBERTS. There were several associations between the ROBERTS and LINSEY families in Rutherford County, and it is quite likely that Mary LINSEY was of this family. There were also members of a LINSEY family from North Carolina in early Tuscaloosa and Fayette Counties, Alabama at the same time as the ROBERTSes, and possibly they were of the Rutherford County family.

I am very proud of my ROBERTS ancestors and their related lines. Thought to be primarily Welsh (from the name), they were a mixture of peoples largely from all parts of the British Isles. They were in this country from a very early date, before 1700; they helped settle and build it and they shared in all the great and tumultuous events of its history. From tidewater Virginia, they moved to the mountains of western North Carolina, then still the frontier, where several ROBERTS men fought in the Revolutionary War. From North Carolina, they went south to west central Alabama and eastern Mississippi; others went to Texas. ROBERTS men and their kin fought, and some died, in the grey clad armies of the South in the Civil War. After bitter defeat and terrible economic devastation at the hands of the North, most moved on again, this time westward to open lands in Arkansas and Texas. Before the turn of the 20th century, many went on to Indian Territory, and today probably the largest concentration of descendants still live in Oklahoma, in Pontotoc County, where my grandfather, William Horace ROBERTS, was born, in Hughes

County, where my mother, Margaret Louise ROBERTS--and I as well--were born, and in the Oklahoma City area.

Strong ROBERTS men and women held their families together in poverty and hardship. Like the bulk of the American population, from colonial times through the early years of this century they were virtually all small farmers. Most owned their farms; others sharecropped. Many bought cheap land under the magnificent federal homestead program. A handful did relatively well; most lived precariously on the edge of poverty and foreclosure if a crop failed, as did so many others at the close of family farming as the predominant way of life. A restless hunger for better land drove the ROBERTSes and their related families into a ceaseless search for that well watered, fertile 160 acres near a good market which would produce bountiful harvests and a decent life for themselves and their children. During the Depression, many were forced into itinerant farm labor, bringing in the crops of others. The search for the land of milk and honey drove them from the shores of the Atlantic to the Pacific. Sadly, most never found their bit of the Promised Land. Only a few are still farmers today.

Culturally rooted in the South, with a twang that goes back to Celtish forebears, Appalachia and the mid-West plains, the ROBERTSes today are melding into the television- and interstate highway-induced national culture that smooths out regional and ethnic differences and makes us all look and sound the same. Still, probably no identifiable cultural group is more resistant to modern homogenizing tendencies than these sons and daughters of the Old South, and they are not giving in to the loss of their roots easily. With their millions of Celtic and WASP cousins, the ROBERTS' sense of identity and place in our country's history seem secure even as it diversifies rapidly with the influx of new, non-European peoples. Firm in religious faith, fiercely independent, suspicious of authority, private, taciturn, and with a proverbial stubbornness, the ROBERTSes and their kindred have endured and survived revolution, rebellion, wars, the closing of the frontier and the availability of cheap land, depression, the transition from small towns and villages to cities and suburbia, the movement from the plow and tractor to store counter, assembly line and desk. The ROBERTSes have lived through the entire panorama of American history from the earliest times to the present day. Spread throughout this nation from their Southern origins, they continue to play their part in the American drama.

Lest it be thought I have forgotten the lineage of my great great grandmother, Mary Jane Adline ANDREWS, I refer the reader to Appendix A, the ANDREWS Family. English in their roots, my ANDREWS ancestors shared in the same historical experiences and life patterns as the ROBERTSes. Coincidentally, the ROBERTSes and ANDREWSes go back to the same Henrico and Chesterfield counties of Virginia and at the same early colonial period. If anything, the ANDREWS family may have preceded the ROBERTSes to America. The ANDREWSes left Virginia for South Carolina perhaps a few years later than the ROBERTSes departed for North Carolina. The families both arrived in Tuscaloosa and Fayette counties of Alabama about the same time in the 1830s, and Amos

Pleasant ROBERTS and Mary Jane Adline ANDREWS united the lines about 1842 or so. There were several other intermarriages. The ANDREWSes went to Arkansas at the same time as--probably in company with--the ROBERTSes after the Civil War. And, they went on to Oklahoma about the same time as well.

Interest in genealogy has brought me into contact with relatives with whom my branch of the family, which went to California during World War II and did not return permanently to Oklahoma, long ago lost contact. That has been the greatest benefit of this fascinating hobby. Renewal of long broken family links has been a wonderful reward of this endeavor. I hope my many ROBERTS kin enjoy this book, and will take the same pride in our ancestors and their roles in the building of this country as I do.

Without a doubt, this book has many errors. I am neither a professional writer nor a trained genealogist, and everything in this book, from title page to index was a learning experience. I typed the whole thing, using materials sent to me by others. Undoubtedly I made many mistakes while entering thousands of names, dates and places, and undoubtedly many of the documents sent to me had errors in them. For these errors, I apologize, and urge those who have the correct information to share it with me. If there is a later edition of this book or in a subsequent work on the ROBERTS family, I will try to correct any and all errors of which I am informed.

# CHAPTER 1

## The Descendants of Amos Pleasant Roberts and Mary Jane Adline Roberts

1. **Amos Pleasant<sup>1</sup> ROBERTS** {87} was born 1814/1815 in North Carolina. He was probably the son of Josiah ROBERTS {362} and Mary LINSEY {590}. Amos died about 1872 in Conway County, Arkansas, and was buried in Conway County, Arkansas. He married **Mary Jane Adline ANDREWS** {88} about 1840 in Alabama. She was born Sep 1825 in Monroe County, Mississippi. She was the daughter of Roland ANDREWS {2470} and Matilda MATTOX {2471}. Mary died 1907 in Ada, Pontotoc County, Oklahoma, and was buried in Box X Cemetery, Ada, Pontotoc County, Oklahoma.

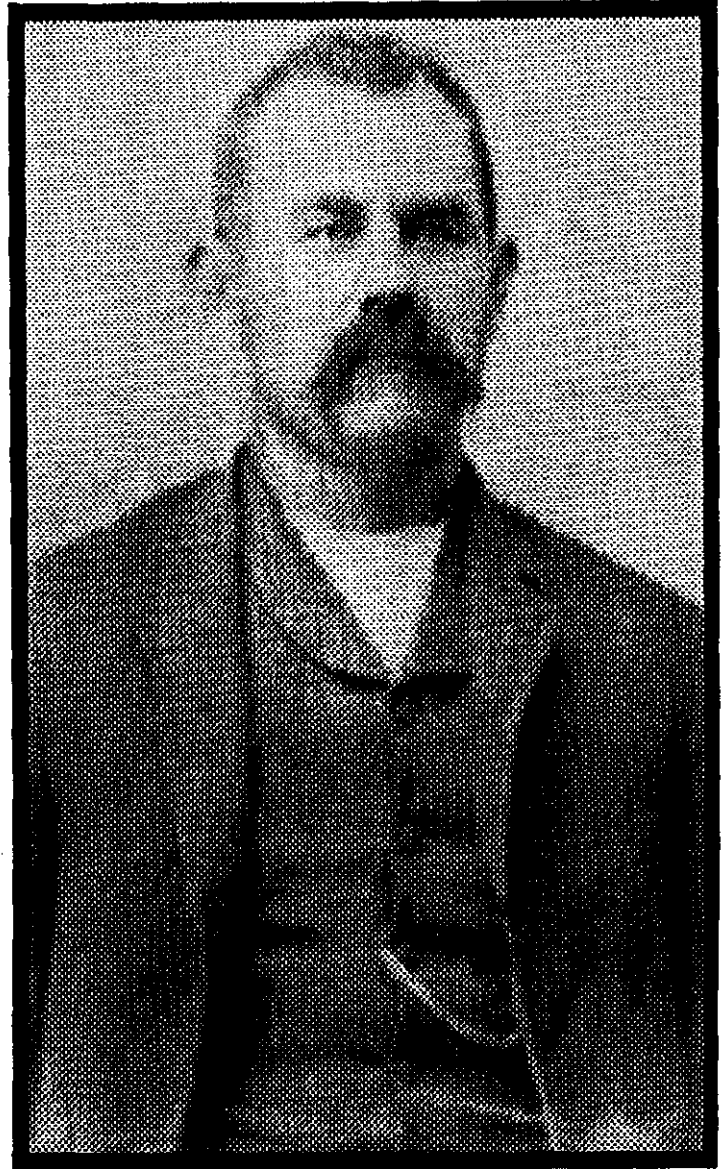
Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, presumed son of Josiah and Mary (LINSEY) ROBERTS,<sup>1</sup> was born about 1814/1815 in North Carolina, almost certainly in the eastern part of Rutherford County that was later formed into Cleveland County.<sup>2</sup> If this is correct, Amos grew up not far from Kings Mountain, site of the Revolutionary War battle, where his father farmed land on branches of First Broad River and Hickory Creek. His earliest years would have been spent working on his father's farm, with precious little, if any, schooling (although, from census and deed records, Amos clearly was literate). Most Rutherford County ROBERTSes settled in the First Broad River area and in adjacent Lincoln County in the 1770s to the 1790s. By the early 1800s there were a large number

of ROBERTSes and related families settled in eastern Rutherford County. Amos would have had numerous aunts and uncles, many cousins and several brothers and sisters as immediate kin, not counting a multitude of in-laws and more distant relatives. Since Morris Roberts, Amos' probable grandfather, who was born about 1735, lived until October 1828, the young Amos would have known him as a very old man, not far from 100 when he died. Amos had at least nine brothers and sisters, perhaps more, born in North Carolina, probably all in Rutherford County, some of whom have been tentatively identified.<sup>3</sup>

It is thought that Amos remained in North Carolina until about 1832, when he presumably accompanied his parents and brothers and sisters (and probably other family and friends) to Tuscaloosa County, Alabama.<sup>4</sup> In Alabama at least one more sister to Amos, Melinda E. ROBERTS, was born about

1835. Melinda married Roland WATKINS, probably in Fayette County, and she and her husband accompanied Amos and Mary, and other families, on the trip to Conway County, Arkansas. Probably other brothers or sisters to Amos were born in Alabama in the 1830s, but as of yet they remain unidentified.

Nothing is known about Amos' youth. He would have been about 17 or so when the family arrived in Alabama in late 1832. He, and probably at least two younger brothers, Arch and Josiah, Jr., would have worked on his father's farm in northern Tuscaloosa County, right on the Fayette County line just south of the little town of Newtonville. Many families later associated with the ROBERTS clan lived in or around this town, the oldest in the county.<sup>5</sup> His uncle, John B. FONDREN and wife Keziah (ROBERTS) FONDREN, lived in Tuscaloosa County until the late 1830s, when they

migrated across the state line to Chickasaw County, Mississippi. Keziah (ROBERTS) FONDREN almost certainly died in Tuscaloosa County before the family left. Her son, William B. FONDREN, witnessed a deed for Josiah and Mary ROBERTS in 1833. Most of the FONDRENS went to Dallas County, Texas about 1850..

Among the earliest settlers of Fayette County was David ANDREWS, a distant relation of Mary Adline ANDREWS, and a well-known preacher in the area.<sup>6</sup> One of the earliest stores was operated by Simon POE, possibly a brother in law to Amos. A farmer in the area, Thomas BLAKENEY, from South Carolina, who settled there in 1832, may have married one of Amos' sisters. Roland ANDREWS, father of Mary Adline ANDREWS, owned land adjacent to Josiah ROBERTS' farm.

It is possible Amos served in the Creek War of 1836. An "A. ROBERTS" enlisted as a private in S.M.Hill's Mounted Volunteers, which mustered at the town of Moscow, now in Lamar County, but then in Marion County, on May 15, 1836. The unit was recruited from Marion, Fayette and Tuscaloosa Counties. Men signed up for three months service against the Creeks, who were resisting loss of their lands granted by treaty and their forcible removal to the west. The unit was disbanded after only one month, 25 days service, and the soldiers were discharged on July 25, 1836 in Montgomery, Alabama.<sup>7</sup> Of course, we cannot be sure that A. ROBERTS was Amos ROBERTS, but no other ROBERTS with a first name beginning with A has been identified in this area at this time. There was a Jackson ROBERTS, from North Carolina (conceivably a brother of Amos), whose first name was perhaps Andrew. But this man, who lived in Fayette County for fifty years, invariably went by the name Jackson. There is a reasonable probability that A. ROBERTS was our Amos. It was in fact the tragic uprooting of the Creeks, Choctaws, Chickasaws and other tribes from their lands in the southeastern United States, and their removal to Indian Territory (the Trail of Tears), that opened up these portions of Alabama to heavy white settlement, largely from the Carolinas and Georgia. Whites flooded into former Indian lands in Mississippi and Alabama in the late 1820s and early 1830s. Cheap land was undoubtedly the lure which brought the ROBERTS family, together with many others, from North Carolina to Tuscaloosa and nearby counties.

About 1840-43, Amos ROBERTS

married, probably in Fayette County, Mary Jane Adline ANDREWS (or ANDIERS as the name often appears).<sup>8</sup> We can be confident Mary lived with her parents just across the line in Fayette County, neighbors to the ROBERTSes. At this time it was customary for the marriage to take place in the county of residence of the bride, and in all probability Amos and Mary were married in a church near Newtonville. Unfortunately, Fayette County marriage records prior to 1866 were destroyed in a courthouse fire. Thus, to date no marriage record has been found.

Mary was the daughter of Roland and Matilda (MATTOX) ANDREWS, of South Carolina and Tennessee respectively.<sup>9</sup> According to census records Mary Jane Adline was born in September 1825 in Mississippi,<sup>10</sup> undoubtedly in Monroe County where her parents were married in 1824. The ANDREWSes had come to Monroe County sometime before 1820, almost certainly from Tennessee. Mary was reputedly half Indian, possibly Cherokee, though no proof of this connection has yet been found (for more information about the ANDREWS family, see Appendix A).

Details about Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, Sr.'s life in Alabama are scanty. Although the 1850 and 1860 censuses of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, as well as many other sources, give his birth state as North Carolina, the earliest specific record of him found to date (other than the militia record cited above) is the 1837 Tax List of Tuscaloosa County, where he was listed as one white poll.<sup>11</sup> About 22 years of age at that time, Amos was not married yet. He would have spent these years working on his father's farm near Newtonville, on the Tuscaloosa side of the county line. His father's lands adjoined those of Roland ANDREWS, and Amos and Mary would have had ample opportunity for contact, working in the fields, at family get togethers or attending church socials. Other close neighbors in Amos' tax beat in 1837 included Mitchell WINTERS, for whom Amos' father Josiah ROBERTS acted as bondsman in his marriage in Rutherford County,<sup>12</sup> Dotson MORRIS, who was a plaintiff in a lawsuit against Josiah in Rutherford County,<sup>13</sup> and Simon POE, husband of Dicey ROBERTS, possibly a sister to Amos.

Strangely, no reference to either Josiah or Amos ROBERTS has been found in the 1840 federal census of Alabama or any Tuscaloosa County land, marriage, tax, militia or other records in the 1840s. A Josiah and an Amos ROBERTS appear in the 1840 census of Limestone County, Alabama, and a great deal of effort was expended to determine if this were the right Josiah and Amos Roberts. However, research makes clear the ages of these two are wrong, and records of Limestone and Madison counties reveal that this Josiah was a son of a Richard and Keziah ROBERTS.<sup>14</sup> The Limestone County Amos ROBERTS married a woman named Polly HARE or HAIR, and died in 1852, when, from land records we know our Amos was living in Tuscaloosa County.<sup>15</sup> Given several coincidences of names, such as Josiah, Amos and Keziah, perhaps these families were related (there was a Richard ROBERTS in Rutherford County at the same time as Josiah ROBERTS),<sup>16</sup> but at present insufficient evidence exists to prove such a connection. Several of Amos and Mary's children were born in Tuscaloosa County in the 1840s, so it is clear the family was



there throughout that decade, even through they are not mentioned in available records.

Notwithstanding their absence on the 1840 Alabama census, in the 1850 census of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, Josiah ROBERTS, age 60, from North Carolina, is listed in Amos Pleasant ROBERTS' household, and this is one of the primary indications that he was Amos' father.<sup>17</sup> Josiah's age as given in the census is about seven or eight years too young, but with the wide variation of ages on census records, this is of little concern. Evidently, Mary (LINSEY) ROBERTS had died before 1850, leaving Josiah an aged widower dependent on his son for support. Much research has been done in an effort to document the parentage of Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, and in a later publication the author plans to address this question in greater detail.

The land records at Appendix C show that Josiah bought 160 acres of federal land in the mid-1850s. An Act of Congress at that time made federal lands extraordinarily cheap, and there were large scale purchases by small farmers to expand their holdings. Josiah's federal purchases were adjacent to lands near the Fayette County line where he had farmed since the 1830s. Amos later mortgaged or sold portions of this land. Though there are no deed or probate records to show he acquired the land from Josiah, there can be no other reasonable explanation than that it was given to him by Josiah or he inherited it.

In the 1860 census of Tuscaloosa County, Amos' occupation is given as "carpenter".<sup>18</sup> In other records he is referred to as a mechanic and a farmer. He performed all these occupations, though perhaps carpentry, specifically, housebuilding, was his main profession, a skill passed down through several of his descendants.<sup>19</sup> Josiah is not listed, and he would have been nearly 80 at that time; in all probability he died sometime between 1855-1860, from the evidence of federal land transactions, most likely in 1858. From deed records it is indisputable that Amos owned farm lands in Tuscaloosa and Fayette counties. What is curious is that there are no indications of land purchases by Amos in the deed records of either Tuscaloosa or Fayette counties, only of sales. Some of these lands were once owned by Josiah and presumably were acquired through gift or inheritance, but the other parcels must have come through purchase. Yet repeated searches of Tuscaloosa land records have yielded no purchase deeds by Amos. There probably is no mystery here; just a lack of record keeping at this early day of minimal government.

Amos Pleasant and Mary Adline ROBERTS had twelve children, all of whom except the last two were born in Alabama:

Nancy Jane, the oldest known child of Amos and Mary, was born in 1844. This would mean her parents were probably married in 1842 or 1843, though as noted, no marriage record has been found. Amos would have been about 28 and Mary around 17 or 18. Amos was old enough to have been married before Mary ANDREWS, though there is no evidence that he was. In all likelihood, theirs was the first marriage for both. In Fayette County, Amos and Mary lived closely with the families into which several members of the ROBERTS family had married or were to marry,<sup>20</sup> including the POEs, BLAKENEYs, ANDREWSEs, PAPISANs, HOPSONs, ABBOTTs and others.

Alabama joined with other southern states in seceding from the Union at the beginning of 1861, after the election of Abraham Lincoln as President. As in many places in the South, there was strong sentiment in Tuscaloosa County against secession. However, leaders committed to taking Alabama out of the Union prevailed. Most whites in Tuscaloosa and surrounding counties were small farmers and owned few, if any, slaves, although with the dominance of the cotton economy the number of slaves in Tuscaloosa had grown enormously, more than doubling between 1840 and 1860. There were a few large slaveholders, Thomas BLAKENEY among them. Nevertheless, once Alabama withdrew from the Union and sought its independence, public feeling swung strongly behind the Confederacy. For most whites in these intensely localistic societies in the South, the issue was not slavery, but the right to be left alone to run their own affairs.<sup>21</sup>

The ROBERTSEs seem to have been strongly pro-Confederate. There are family stories, all now impossible to prove or document, that Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, Sr., as well as his teenage son, Amos Pleasant, Jr., were involved in resistance against Union forces during the Civil War, and came close to being hanged or shot by Yankee soldiers. As far as is known, only Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, Jr. actually wore the gray of the Confederacy. Although no service records have been found, by his own account, statements by his wife, and according to the 1910 census, Amos Pleasant ROBERTS, Jr., served in the Confederate Army. Amos, Jr. was born in 1846, and he would have been only 18 in 1864. Many youths younger than this fought for the South. Record keeping by the Confederate authorities was poor. Perhaps Amos served in a local or home defense unit raised in Fayette County, the records of which have been lost. There were many such units in the South, made up of young boys and old men, as the encroaching Union forces were desperately resisted, and few records of them were kept or survived.

One fascinating story of this time was passed down from Rebecca ROBERTS, the
