<p> *<u>Analysis:</u> Assuming Morris listed his children in order of age, and all were under 21 in 1724, and assuming he was married about 1703-04, at age about 22 or 23, then Morris, Jr. would have been born about 1706, Step about 1707, John about 1708 or 09, Joshua about 1710 and Sarah about 1711 or 12. Morris, senior, would have been born about 1680-85, or maybe a few years earlier, since he was old enough to appear as a witness in a suit in 1697. He might have married late.

<p>(If, however, this John Roberts is the one who married Susannah, he was born in 1719; this would probably move each of these birthdates ahead 5-10 years).

<p> Analysis: John Butler of King William County, Virginia had a daughter who married Morris Roberts, probably about 1720, and they had at least two daughters,

Rosamond and Judith, who were still of "tender age" by 1727. So, this Morris was

probably born about 1695-1700 (Could he have been the son of Morris Roberts who owned land in King William County in 1702?). In any event, this is clearly not our Morris I.

<p> Morris and _____ Butler had two daughters, Rosemond and Judith, both born between about 1720 and 1727. In 1727 John Butler left three negroes to his infant granddaughters, Rosemond and Judith, in the care of their father, Morris Roberts. The daughter Rosemond married James Edwards, probably about 1740.

They

had a daughter, Judith, in 1742. Rosemond then died in 1747.

<p> Rosemond Edwards's daughter Judith then married John Scudday. He died in 1779. Judith then married William Arnold. In 1787 William and Judith relinquished their rights to the negroes to James Edwards. James Edwards died in 1788, leaving the negroes to others. William and Judith lived for a time in Spotsylvania County, Va. In 1802, William died. In 1812 Judith moved to South Carolina.

<p> This suit raises a question whether the Morris Roberts found in King William County in 1702 owning land was either this same Morris Roberts, or more likely, the father of this Morris who married _____ Butler and had Rosemond and

Judith. The suit does not show whether Morris and his wife _____ Butler were actually living in King William County when John Butler made the deed of gift to his two granddaughters.

This fragmentary tax list is in the North Carolina Archives in a box of miscellaneous papers of Rutherford County. It is in many pieces of different sizes. In my transcription I have labeled them FOLIO (having four sides), PAGE (having front and back) and FRAGMENT (a piece containing only a few names). The only place where any designations for the columns are given is the fragment on PAGE 7--Lands, Wp, Bp, and two others which could not be deciphered. There are nine columns in most places, but with the exception of two sides of FOLIOS, the last six have nothing in them. Wp signifies white polls (white males 16-65); Bp signifies black polls (any blacks 12 and up). Obviously from the MS, the FOLIOS were once the top and bottom parts of pages of some sort which were cut apart. By comparison with the 1782 tax list and the 1790 census, I have been able to put FOLIOS I & II and III & IV together with reasonable certainty. Therefore by reading straight down the page for those first four pages, the reader will place the names in correct order. Of course, some names were lost between the top and bottom since they were separated, because of wearing. Approximate location of some persons on the remaining pages, folios, and fragments can be determined by comparison with the 1790 census.

This list is quite valuable as it is the first appearance in Rutherford County records for some persons, and a few persons listed here do not appear on the 1782 tax list or the 1790 census.
