He is to plant 100 apple trees in 5 years. Arrington to have use of the old dwelling house, 8 barrels Indian corn, 300 lbs neat pork. For this Arrington is also to help Reeve 30 days in tending his corn, making fencing rails, gachering corn, etc. 20 June 1693/4

(Pages 97 through 113 are badly torn, almost completely faded and mostly missing. The following bits of information have been gleaned from them-BBW)

Deed from John Woodson, Sr. to John Martin, followed by a power of attorney in above sale, witnessed by James Cocke and Charles Evans. This is followed by a deed on p.98, too obliterated to read, and another on p.99 from Giles Carter. Another deed p.102 is unreadable, is apparently to John Cocke of Charles City Co.. On p.104 is a deed from Giles Carter, witnessed by Francis Reeve 1 Aug. 1698. On p. 106 a deed largely missing, witnessed by Thomas Parker and Mary Parker. On p.107 another deed witnessed by Philip Pursel, Seth Rench and George Warner, apparently to Gillygroom Marrin and Susanna his wife from Francis Reeve 1 Aug. 1698. On p. 109 an apparent agreement or deed between Mary Ligon of Henrico Co. and Thomas Ligon regarding 60 acres, witnessed by James Cocke 1 Aug. 1698. On p. 111 is a release of dower from Elizabeth Ligon, wife of Thomas Ligon, to her mother in law Mary Ligon.

p.117 Edward Harris of New Kent Co., and Mary his wife, for 132, to George Alvis of same, 360 acres on south side of James River, called "The Ware", part of 516 acres bequeathed to said Edward by will of his father William Harris, late of Henrico Co., dec'd, and since then confirmed to him by Col. William Byrd who had formerly purchased land by escheat, Edward Harris having formerly sold 150 acres to Edward Skerme. 1 Sept. 1698

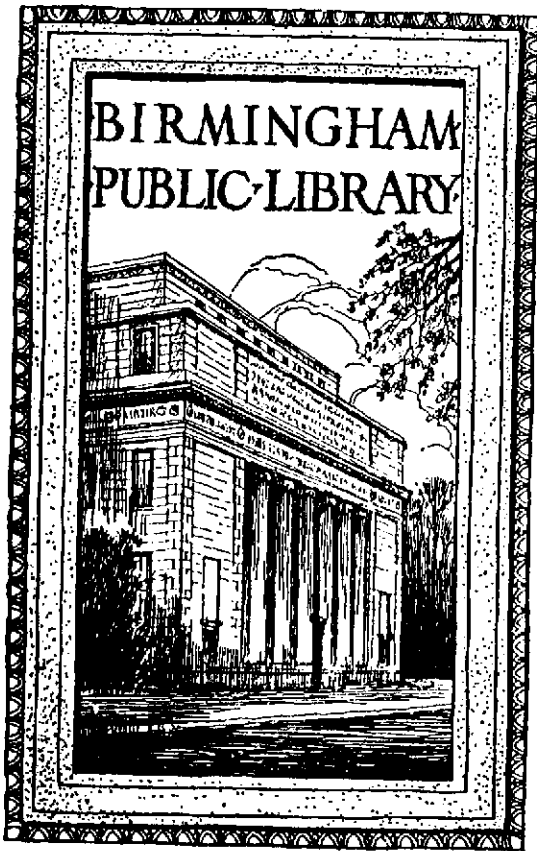

PETITION FOR SEPARATION OF CHURCH & STATE

November 14, 1785

To the Honorable the Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Delegates the Memorial & Remonstrance of the Inhabitants of the County of Chesterfield Humbly Sheweth --

Whereas it hath pleased Your Honorable House to publish a Bill[1] obliging the Inhabitants of this Commonwealth to pay the Teachers of the Christian Religion and have requested their opinion concerning it . . .

We therefore do most Dutifully Declare against it[---]being it contrary to the Gospel & sound Policy[---]for the Author of the Christian Religion declares His Kingdom is not of this world and if the men of the world do undertake to legislate for His subjects in matters of Religion it is Violating of His Kingly prerogative[.] [E]ven those of the Christian Church has no right to amend His laws by Ad[di]ng to the command of Holy Writ as a Legislator but only to Judge of as a Judicator according to reason[.] conviction and the Dictates of Conscience[.] [F]urther the Bill[1] of rights Declares all men to be by nature free & to have certain inherent rights which they cannot divest their posterity of[.] and to suppose that more was intended by Society in forming the Social Compact than to subject these persons and properties for the security of the same is an Idle [Claim?] arising from Blind Bigotry[.] [B]ut it's said to be necessary to unite the Church and State to keep men moral and for [us] to have confidence in an Oath[7] [W]e Humbly conceive the civil magistrate has a right to furnish immorality so far as Society is injured thereby that let Jews, Mohometans, and Christians of every Denomination to enjoy religious liberty, as the declaration of rights has invited them, in which [it] says no man or set of men are intitled to exclusive or separate emoluments or privileges from the Community but in consideration of having rendered singular services to the State[.] [I]t is mens labour in our manufactures[.] their services by sea and land[.] that aggrandize our Country and not their creeds. Chain our Citizens to the State by this interest[.] [L]et Jews, Mohometans, and Christians of every Denomination find their advantage in living under your Laws []rs of god to [] [T]he Civil law is of you to your people[.] then let it be Your great wisdom and goodness to study our strength and with which will forever be the glory and Boast of the nation (for liberty & freedom)[.] [A]nd let the church of Christ and Religion alone--is our mature Delibrations and Conclusions.
