

Rushing Surname's Origins

The surname Rushing is of Irish (or possibly Manx) Gaelic origin with derivative spellings in English. The surname and it's variations existed in Irish, Manx, English, Scotch and Norman when the first "Rushing" set sail for the colonies. The most common variations were Rushen, Rushin, Rushon, and Rushing. Since we don't have a record of where our U.S. ancestors came from we cannot say which European family the name came from. Although our surname sounds German to many English speaking persons it is recorded in Gt. Britain centuries before it appears in Germany. There are many soft sounds in the way the name and variants are spoken that are not natural for an anglicized or natural German word or name. Below are letters from Tom Cross a descendant of Thomas M. Rushing that support our surname's evolution in Ireland's County Monaghan.

From the study of languages we find the origin of our surname.

According to my second cousin, the Rushings were of Irish origin. I had suspected such since the name looks like a Gaelic diminutive of Ros which was a common masculine personal name. In the genitive case, Ros becomes Ruis ("of Ros" or Ros's), thus the name Gaelic: O Ruis means "grandson or descendent of Ros" this name is anglicized O'Rush. The diminutive of Ros is Ruisin ("rusheen") which is anglicized as Rushin or Rushing. I worked this out as an amateur Celtic philologist (Historical Linguistics). Later, my theory was corroborated by William Durning (aka Liam O'Duirnin) and his wife Mary the authors of a book called "A Guide to Irish Roots." I met Mr. Durning in person at the North Texas Irish Festival. I bought a copy of his book and had him sign his autograph after we chatted about the Irish language (Gaelic) and my theories about the origins of obscure Gaelic surnames. According to Durning's research, the Rushings were of the same origins as the O'Rushes and came from County Monaghan. Durning's book is published by The Irish Family Names Society is La Mesa, California. I think this may help to clear up the controversy of the ethnic origin of the Rushings. I would speculate that they immigrated from Ireland with the Scots-Irish migrations to the American colonies. Their name is of native Irish origin, but the family had probably intermarried with the Ulster Scots and became Protestants or through close association with the Scots. This was not unusual according to many historians (q.v. Cracker Culture by Grady McWhithy).

In answer to Tom, I mentioned that records of a Mathew Rushing appears in Virginia records before the beginning of the Ulster-Scots emigration and before the beginning of the Palatine emigration of the German forefathers. Lists about 12,000 names of Palatines who embarked for America between 1717 and 1818.] (1)

Dear Dan:

Yes, you may quote me or use the entire body of my email. I have one correction to what I wrote. I forgot the name of the author of Cracker Culture -- it should be Grady McWheeny. His book is about Celtic cultural patterns in the American South. By the way, if the etymology is correct, then names

such as Ross and the Scottish clan Ross are related by way of men who bore the same name of Ros as a personal name. The word ros in Old Irish meant a wood and a homonym means promontory or peninsula. The Rush name of County Mayo is of a different origin to that in Co.Monaghan. The Mayo Rush clan of Co. Mayo were a sept of the Ui Fiachra (O'Feery) and had translated their name from O'Luachra (luachair is Irish for "rush" - the plant). If it was of German origin, then we would expect to find early records of the spelling of the name changing from Rusching to Rushing. If of English origin, then one would surmise that the name originated from a man nicknamed for being in a hurry. One source says that de Russhe was a Norman name of Old French origin, but that does not explain the - ing ending.

That Matthew Rushing settled in Virginia in 1647 could be problematic in terms of the political situation at the time. Jamestown settlement being 40 years earlier, but the Jacobite rebellion among the Scots and Irish another 40 years later. If Matthew was an Ulsterman, he would have been motivated by perhaps two factors: he needed land after the Cromwellian wars and the Ulster plantations had taken away his family's land and perhaps he saw the Jacobite problem coming. I would imagine that the Rushing family would have originally been Catholics that became assimilated with the Protestants in Ulster. The Jacobite cause was supported by both Catholics and Protestants for differing reasons, but it did unite the two. Ironically the Orangemen of Ulster celebrate the Williamite victory, although many Scots fought for the Jacobites. The Scots supported the Jacobite cause again in the 1745 uprising in Scotland to support Bonnie Prince Charlie (Charles Edward Stuart). The uprising that came in 1688 and 1689, just after the English throne was passed to William and Mary of Orange during the "Glorious Revolution" was the first Jacobite Rebellion. The rebellion sent many more to seek a better place to America to make a living during this period and immediately following. We need the opinion of a very good historian. At any rate, Mr. Rushing's immigration to Carolina would have not have been unusual to that time period given the political and economic situations. Many Scots and Scots Irish went to America because the price of cattle and land drove them here as evidence from letters during the American colonial period show (in McWhiney's book). The Manx-Gaelic origin makes good sense etymologically with regard to the Irish origin and Co. Monaghan is a part of ancient Ulster. The Manx Gaelic (Gaelick) language was closely related to Ulster dialect of Irish (Gaeilge) and Scots Gaelic (Gaidhlig). It is possible that the Mannin may be its ultimate origin since it is now a rare name in Ireland and U.K. I recall that Mr. Durning's name is O' Duirnin in Irish thus the diminutive ending -in (which needs a fada mark over the i) is also anglicized as -ing as is in O'Cuisin when it became Cushing or O'Duinin which became Downing. The Irish (or Manx) Gaelic origin though fits in with the American history from what I understand and also with the family oral tradition. Glad to be of help and I hope the soul of my grandfather Thomas S. Rushing can be proud of me.

The Other Theories

There is a Rushen Manor in Herfordshire & Rushen Slieve (hill), where the electric wind farm is located, so in Ireland. The Manx stories of our surname's origin comes from the Castle Rushen and Rushen Abbey to located on that Island. (The Isle of Man is located midway between England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland) The history of the Castle dates back to about the time of Christ 1,000 years before the first surnames were used. Any history about the origins and naming of the Castle

Rushen has seemingly been lost to time.

Rushen and Rushin are the most common English and Welsh variations of the spelling of our surname. Records of several variations exist in baptismal and marriage records in British Archdiocese during the 1700's. IGI records show the surname in the British Isles' Christenings since 1573, Peter Rushen also points out records of a the earliest Rushings being Phillip Rushing 1610 and Thomas Rushing 1615 from Clare in Suffolk. The Irish records were destroyed in two fires in the 1800's. Our surname and it's variants has since all but died out in England and Wales. Only a few Rusheens Rushins and Rushens still live in Ireland, Wales or England, but our surname has flourished in the United States. [statistics below]

The story of German ancestry for the surname Rushing comes from a record of a Mathys Reisin of the Palatine emigration, but these Reisin descendants [Palatines from the Rhineland] still use the original surname or spelling variation Riesin or Reisen, surnames were not translated. [In April 1709 when the Lower Palatine was invaded by France's King Louis XIV. Queen Anne hoped to spread the Protestant faith by sending the refugees first to Ireland then later to the Americas. (3) Mathys Reisin boarded for VA in May 1709 (4) This theory appeared in the "Rushing Past" newsletter. II (1), March 1980, the story gained favor because it provided documentation for our first U.S. Rushing's origin. The Palatine Settlements were in the part New York that is now Pennsylvania (Wm. Penn 1787).

You may well ask why is New York (originally New Amsterdam) in Virginia? The Crown thought because of the raids for supplies on the Quebec Colony by John Smith's Virginia boys that the two were adjacent. In addition the original Virginia Company Charters set the latitudes of Virginia to support this mistaken idea on period maps. Setting sail for Virginia under King James and Queen Ann, could land you in New York. Our Rushing ancestors are first found in Virginia proper among the English settlers. (Now the Carolinas.) The German Lt. General Rushing that was in charge of the reconstruction after the War insisted he and the surname was of Norman ancestry and this is probably where the Norman lore about our surname comes from.

Statistic Totals

Thanks to John Rushing who notes that Rushing or it's variants do not occur in three books on surnames of the British Isles. The name is present from at least 1573 in England up to the current phone book search of the Isles (Rushen is most common but rare in the population).


