Having received reports of some tumultuous  
New England & other of our Officers of the counties of

I am no longer so far as your militia. These  
from the Majesty I do see singly with the advice of the  
Council. And I am now on receipt  
hereof to summon the militia in your county to  
appear immediately at a certain time & place appointed by  
You with their Arms & Ammunition, in order to  
draught out a part of the most able men to protect  
send them to the county of Augusta. And  
are to keep them in great readiness to march for  
the better of our Affairs should require them, of which  
You shall have due notice.

I expect your immediate compliance with this  
my Commands to protect our Province from the  
Invasion of a barbarous & many other of these  
shall be your Obedience.

The militia not employ'd in the  
Service must be ordered to  
patrol during the absence of the  
others. And send me an Account  
of the Number You have on their  
Duty.
