Book I. 1652 - 1672.

Page 3. 19 Oct. 1650.-1651. This document, the first part illegible, concerns an Indenture made of service between one Clarke and Richard Bland, merchant, for six years. Clarke stated, before signing, that he had promised Mr. John Bland, in London, he would serve six years and he would be as good as his word. This Indenture was afterward assigned to Mr. Edward Bland, by the said Mr. Richard Bland and it seems had since been lost, or removed from amongst the writings of the said Mr. Edward Bland. As this was lost Clarke was, to serve only that customed of the said county having no Indenture. Signed, John Holmewood, Robt. Stanton.

Page 4. Nov. 7, 1652. Mr. John Dibdall did at a Court held in this place volunteer and made in open court a petition signed by himself, Robert Lancashire and seventy others, and John Collier without timely redress to Petition etc.

Page 5. Nov. 7, 1652. In Virginia; The petition of John Dibdall, humbly sheweth that Richard Colt, chyrurgeon, having sayed besyde their fear of God hath att divers tymes, to divers persons, vowed ye death of ye petitioner and to have his blood yes his hart blood for ye plaint, hath bound ye sayd Colt to good behaviour... prevented Mr. Simpson, physician, repairing to ye sick wife though att the poynt of death... and disturbs ye peace of ye Commonwealth... Desires that Colt suffer penlty of the Law.

Page 6. July 15, 1652. Thos. Woodhouse and Richard Colt bind themselves on penlty of one hundred thousand pounds of tobacco to be payd unto ye Keepers of ye Liberties of England by Authority of Parliament...

Wit. Ben Sidway, Wm. Thomas. Geo. Jordan

By order of Mr. Ben Sidway.

Richard Colt enjoyned to be upon good behaviour and keep the peace of ye keepers of Liberty of England... John Dibdall, minister, this obligation to stand in full power and vesture. John Corker, Deponent.

Page 6 10 Sept., 1652. This bill bindes Mr. John Hix to pay unto Mr. Brasur, or his assignor in full seven hundred pounds of tobacco and c'skies on ye first day of November next, if not enough, made to seize for satisfction.

Page 7. Coll. Thomas Swann, by himself and his Deputies or Deputers, will execute and perform the Office of High

Sheriff for the County of Surry for the year 1652... to perform the Office of High Sheriff... in full force. Signed Tho: Swenn, Geo. Jordan, Ben. Sidway. Sealed and delivered in Presence of, Barth, Kinpe, Sam. Abbott, Robt. Stanton.

Page 8. 9 br 7, 1652. Foulke Jones, planter, receives greetings from William Vaughan, whereas the latter oweth unto Foulke Jones, planter, 600 lbs. of tobacco and casks, and said Foulke Jones stands indebted to Mr. Walter Chiles for 3000 lbs. of tobacco and casks... Wm. Vaughan binds over to sd Foulke Jones all of his tobacco crop for the year, made on ground belonging to Mr. Carter, Sr. Wit. Thos. Pittman, Sarah Brewster.

Page 9. 9 br. 7, 1652. Daniel Hutton bargained with Thomas Pittman to build him a house "by a certayne tyme", but conditions were altogether neglected, the petition states, and desires damages. Wants jury to inquire how much.

Depositions concerning the building of the house of Daniel Hutton, by Thomas Pittman were made by Chr. Mitchell, aged four and thirty years; by John Hux, aged forty years, and Thomas Woodhouse. Thos. Gray, Jr. also testified. The jury found for the Defendant, and damages set at 20 lbs. of tobacco.

Spiltimber, sells land lying on the south side of Besse, adjoining Thomas Verringe, his land John Briddie and Jno. Spiltimber... day of Aug. 1652. Wit. Robt. Spenser.

Page 13, 19 Apr. 1652. Deposition of Wm. Murrell, aged 40 years, of thereabouts, that coming from the river he asked Heiward whether he intended to stay at Mr. Ogbournes.

Page 14. 5 br, 1652. Deposition of Thomas Cutler, aged 25

Page 41. 22 Mar. 1653. Transaction abuts tobacco in which Martin Hammond, Jno. Billison and Jno. M^rkhamb have a part.

Page 42. 2 May, 1654. Deposition of Wm. Carter, Sr. aged 54 years, or thereabouts. This deposition said that when Marye Powell died, the sd Powell was near fifteen years old, that Richard Powell, her father, gave her about fower head of cattle a little before the death of him.

Alice Carter, aged 55 years, or thereabouts, deposed and said that the week before Mr. Pitt, his ship was burned, Mary Powell was born, and that to the best of the Denonent's knowledge Mary Powell was neere upon fifteen years old when she died. ✓

Page 42. 5 July 1654. John Dibdall, Capt. John Frame and Richard Dibdall, gent. are bound to the Court of Surry County for 20,000 lbs. of tobacco.

Page 42. 1 Xber. 1653. And: Robbinson and Dorothy Kew are bound to Alex. Mabrick in the sum of 40,000 lbs. of tobacco for keeping Dorothy and the child of said Dorothy and other charges. Wit. Thos. Culmer, Charles Barham, Sack Brewster, Dorothy Kew discharges Alex. Mabrick from all debts. 9br 1653.

Page 44. Mar. 1654. Robert Morslay, of Upper Chippoakes in Surry County, Southwarke Par., gent. sells to Thos. Holton 100 acres of land at the heed of Chiproaks Creek. ad. Wm. Lea, ad. to land a patent of said Holton, Wit. John Harvie, M^sum? Curry.

Page 46. 1 July 1650. Indenture between Nicholas Reynolds, gent of the one part and Edward Hurlston, carpenter, of the second part, a neck of land on Lawnes Creek in James Citty County for "Tenn yeares". Page 47. 1 May 1654. James Mason, of Mathews Mount, planter, sellsto Richard Merydale certain possessions including stock, right and claims in and to his servants and their services viz. William Savage for seven years; William Pegler for his term, and Wm. Foreman for his term, and all to

to be paid at some convenient place or upon his own plantation called and known as Mathews Mount, within one quarter of a mile of James River where a ship, or Shallop or sloope may safely come and ride. Wit. Sack Brewster, Edw. Petway.

Page 50. 4 July 1654. Wm. Gopeinge, he moving, sells to Jno. King all his right and title etc. in 100 acres of land inheritance in his new plantation the Birchen Swamp, part of 250 acres lately given and granted by patent fro, Sir Wm. Berkeley, Gov. of Va. 6 9 br 1651. The 100 acres is on the south side of Upper Chipcoks Creek in Surry County, from Wm. Simmons land... sd. the plantation of John King. Wit. Nich. Perry, Peter Adams.

Page 51. Jan. 1653. An article of agreement between John Saines(Zaines) and Jno. Berrye regarding some work. John Berrye's wife to work in the ground. Wit. John Gorange.

Page 52. 6 7br 1654. Jno. Dibdall, Clerk; Richard Dibdall, planter; and Lieut. Coll. Thos. Swann, Esq. are bound to the Court for 30,000 lbs. tob. to be paid to the Commissioners of Surry County.

Page 52. 11 Aug. 1654. Obligations of John Fisher, deceased, and his children of wht belongs and appertains to the rights and claims of Marye and Joseph Fisher, children of the said John Fisher according to the merning of the Court. Wit. Wm. Cockerham, Ro: Stanton, Sack: Brewster.

Page 52. 6 7bris 1654. John Dibdall, Clerk; Richard Dibdall, planter are bound to the Court for 30,000 lbs. of tob. for William Fisher, son of John Fisher. The above two men with Coll. Thos. Swann are bound for the same amount for Joseph and Marye Fisher, Children of John Fisher.

Gray Sr. told the Deponent that he had 50 acres of land, given to his sons and daughters by Mr. Gates, which land was part of a dividend where he lived at Gray's Creek and that sd Gray Sr. gave the Deponent satisfaction for his wife's part thereof and was 25 acres. Luke Mizell, aged 45 years testified that when Deponent was servant to Thos. Gray Sr. Deceased, he did often hear sd Gray and his wife say that Gates had given 50 acres to their son Thomas and daughter, Jane. 11 May, 1659.

John Flood aged 44 years, he living some ten years with Thos. Gray Sr. when he lived at Gray's Creek, and he rd the same.
