

Note after beginning this work, I was informed that many [illeg.] that the court were of opinion [?] be placed to State accounts the assembly would arrange in Continental account for [?] reason I left the column shiefly open, the date of each certificate being annexed to the entry will perhaps be a better guide than could be otherwise adopted. The dates will pint out what was taken in consequence of the different invasions of the enemy in this state and after the General Assembly has determined how for the Continent shall be subject to be debited it is then be ecxceeding easy to distinguish the different charges with property.
